**STORE AND TRANSPORT REGULATIONS.**

**FUEL AND WATER IN COUNTRY DISTRICTS.**

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the subjoined regulations relative to the supply of Fuel and Water in country districts (in lieu of sub-regulations No. 5 to regulation No. 52 of the 15th of February, 1853, and in lieu of the regulations of 20th April, 1863, page 916 *ante*), viz. —

1. In every country town where three or more officers are stationed the usual supplies of fuel and water shall be obtained by a contract to be entered into on the part of the Government by a board, such board to consist of the senior or chief officer of each of the several departments in the town or district for which the supplies are required.
2. The senior officer of the board shall act as chairman, and, when necessary, convene meetings of the board for the consideration of tenders, and, in dealing with them, the course prescribed by the general store and transport regulations shall, as far as practicable, be observed.
3. In towns or places where less than three officers are stationed, and in country places removed from any town, supplies must be procured by each officer in the manner most economical, and the accounts, certified by the head of the department, are to be rendered to the Government Storekeeper.
4. Accounts for supplies of fuel and water made under contracts entered into by a board, as above laid down, must be certified to by the officer requiring the supplies, and the head of the department.
5. All accounts for fuel and water must be forwarded to the Government Storekeeper for liquidation.
6. Information as to the forms to be observed in calling for tenders, &c. and forms for the preparation of contracts, &c., can be obtained from the Government Storekeeper.
7. This regulation applies to all towns, except Melbourne and its suburbs, Geelong and Williamstown.

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, if he should think fit, on the receipt of a petition signed by the householders purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to any proclaimed municipal district containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof, praying that such locality by a general description might be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, to declare by proclamation, with the consent of the council of such proclaimed district, such locality to be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, and also by the same or any other Proclama-

tion, to define the limits and boundaries of such locality, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be and be deemed to be united with and should form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district; provided that no such Proclamation be issued as above until the substance and prayer of such petition should have been published for at least one month previously in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the householders purporting to be a majority resident within an area adjoining the municipal district of Ballarat have presented a petition to the Governor, praying for the annexation of the locality therein mentioned to the said municipal district: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been duly published, and the council of the said municipal district have consented to such annexation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, and with the consent of the municipal council of Ballarat, do by this my Proclamation declare that the locality hereinafter described shall be united with and form part of the said municipal district of Ballarat, that is to say:—

Parish of Cardigan, county of Grenville: Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the municipal district of Ballarat, where it is intersected by the south side of the main line of road from Ballarat to the township of Raglan; thence by the south boundary line of said road, bearing N, 70° 30' W. to the north-east angle of allotment 6 of section 11; thence by the eastern boundary of said allotment, a line crossing a one chain road, the eastern boundaries of allotments 6 and 12 of section 12, and a line crossing a one chain road, all bearing due south to the north-east angle of allotment 12 of section 1; thence by a line crossing a one chain road, the northern boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 3, bearing east to north-east angle of said allotment 4; thence by the eastern boundary of that allotment and part of the eastern boundary of allotment 8, bearing due south forty-six chains sixty links; thence by a line bearing east to the Yarrowee River; thence northerly by the western bank of said river to the south boundary of the municipal district; thence by the southern and part of the western boundaries of the same, bearing due west and north to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (number 13), intitled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, shall apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by Proclamation see fit to direct: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the said Act was extended to the township of Queenscliff, therein described: And whereas it is expedient to limit the application of the said Act to the municipal district of Queenscliff: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Queenscliff.

## MUNICIPALITY OF SMYTHESDALE.

## BYE-LAW No. 13 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF SMYTHESDALE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and for the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Smythesdale, that hereafter it shall not be lawful for any roof or other exterior covering of canvas, duck, drill, calico, or any such material, to be placed upon or on the outside of any building to be erected within the boundaries of the said municipality, nor shall it be lawful for any such now in use to be repaired or renewed with like materials, unless such building or erection shall stand and be twenty clear feet apart from any dwelling, house, store, or other building whatsoever.

That no person shall keep any stack or stacks of hay, corn, or straw, of any description, on premises within the said boundaries, unless the same be under cover of shed or building, of which no exterior part or covering shall be of canvas, calico, or other like textile fabric whatever, or unless such stack or stacks shall stand and be twenty clear feet apart from any dwelling, house, store, or other building whatsoever.

That it shall be lawful for the said council, their inspector or other officer, upon complaint in writing of any ratepayer, that any chimney, flue, or vent, is constructed of improper materials, or that the top of such chimney or flue is not sufficiently elevated or removed from any inflammable materials of which the roof or other portion of the building or any adjoining building is constructed; or that any such chimney or flue is not so constructed as properly to carry up the smoke, so that it becomes a nuisance or dangerous to the neighbors, the council or their inspector shall forthwith serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of such premises, calling upon him to alter such chimney, vent, or flue, so as to remedy and abate any such danger or nuisance.

That in order the better and more effectually to guard against accidents, any person or persons who shall incautiously, carelessly, or improperly use, or cause, permit, or suffer to be used, or make, place, or deposit any fire or combustible substance whatsoever, in or upon any road, street, footway, lane, court, alley, thoroughfare, or open or public place, in or near any building, dwelling, house, or place of business, or within or upon any yard whether fenced or enclosed or not, shall be

deemed to have committed a breach of this bye-law; and any person guilty of any neglect or breach thereof shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
