DISTILLERIES AND RECTIFYING PREMISES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the distillation, rectifying, and compounding of Spirits, to the granting a duty upon Spirits distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the brewing of Beer and the sale of fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any person, except as thereafter excepted, who shall carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who shall have in his possession, or who shall make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, except in such place as the Governor in Council shall by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds, nor more than Five hundred pounds: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned places as places wherein the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:—

DISTILLERIES.

Premises in course of erection on allotment 2 of section 5, Wareneep, county of Grant, consisting of 119 acres and 21 poles; bounded on the north by a road one chain wide, bearing east 25 minutes south 27 chains 10 links; on the east by allotment 3 of section 5, bearing south 359 degrees 13 minutes 53 chains 30 links; on the south by a road one chain wide, bearing west 123 degrees 53 minutes 33 chains 94 links; and on the west by allotment 1 of section 5, bearing north 360 degrees 25 minutes 34 chains 62 links.

THE BUNGAREE ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the colony of Victoria hereinafter defined shall be a

road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at the sources of the Bullarook Creek; thence by a line westerly to the north-east angle of portion 63, parish of Ballaarat; thence south by the east side of the Creswick Creek road to the north boundary of the municipality of Ballaarat; thence east and south by the northern and eastern boundaries of said municipality to a point in the centre of the Melbourne and Ballaarat road; thence easterly by the centre line of said road to the western branch of the River Moorabool; thence northerly by the centre line of said river to its source; thence by a line to the commencing point.—(02.23.9.)

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Bungaree Road District."

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 23.—FOR REGULATING THE MARKET; FOR THE SALE OF GARDEN AND FARM PRODUCE, MEAT, FISH, ETC.; AND FOR FIXING AND LEVYING RATES, TOLLS, AND DUES IN RESPECT OF SUCH MARKET.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18th of Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the regulation of markets and market dues: And whereas it is expedient and necessary to erect suitable buildings and conveniences in the said market place for the sale of produce or other articles sanctioned to be there sold, or which may be from time to time permitted by the municipal council to be there sold; and that rates, tolls, rents, and dues should be fixed, levied, and collected for the use of the said buildings and other conveniences, and in respect of articles and things brought or taken into the said market for sale; and that such rules and regulations should be made by the said municipal council as are proper and necessary for the due regulation and government of the said market, and of the persons using and frequenting the same; and that an officer or officers be appointed to collect the said rates, tolls, rents, and dues, and for the general purposes of carrying out the provisions of this bye-law: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Ararat, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, the following regulations shall be in force respecting the aforesaid market, and the tolls, rates, and dues hereinafter set forth and specified shall be levied and paid in respect of the goods taken thereto for sale:—

1. *Name of market, and under whose management it is to be conducted.*—The market shall be called the "Ararat market," and shall be under the control of the Ararat municipal council, and the inspector or other officers that may from time to time be appointed, for the purposes of more direct supervision.

2. *Time when market shall be open.*—The said market shall be open for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say, butchers' meat, pork, fish, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seeds, and all other garden produce, every Saturday from sunrise to Ten o'clock p.m., and every Wednesday from sunrise to sunset (Christmas Day and Good Friday excepted); and shall be open for the sale of hay, straw, grain, green fodder, potatoes, and all other farm produce, on every day throughout the year (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Nine o'clock in the morning till Five o'clock in the afternoon.

Any person selling or offering for sale any fruit, vegetable, hay, corn, straw, fodder, or other marketable commodity, within the precincts of the said market, before the hour for opening or after the hour for closing the same, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this bye-law.

3. *Council may lease the whole or a portion of the market site.*—The said municipal council may let for any period not exceeding three years the said market site, as a whole or in different portions as they may deem best, for the purpose of having erected thereon any shops, sheds, stalls, or other conveniences in accordance with designs to be submitted to and approved by the said municipal council; and each and every lease and agreement for the letting of the whole or any portion of the said market site shall contain a clause setting forth the articles, or class of articles, for the sale of which such site shall have been let, and no other article, or class of articles, shall be sold or offered for sale during the continuation or term of said lease.

4. *Council may erect and lease buildings.*—The said municipal council may, and are hereby empowered to erect, or cause to be erected, on the said market site, any shops, stalls, sheds, fences, or other conveniences they may deem requisite for the purposes of the said market, and to let the same, or any of them, for any term not exceeding one year, and to re-let the same as often as the periods of such lettings shall expire or be otherwise determined; and in every such lease or agreement shall be specified the articles, or class of articles, for the sale of which such shop, stall, shed, or other convenience shall have been let, and no other article, or class of articles, shall be sold or offered for sale in such shops, stalls, or other conveniences, during the continuation or term of said lease, without the permission in writing of the said municipal council.

5. *Alterations in stalls, &c., how to be effected.*—Any person or persons desirous of having his or their name or business painted on or affixed to any shop, shed, or stall, or of having any shop, shed, or stall altered in any particular way, may have such name or business so painted, and such alterations so effected, at his or their own cost, provided it is done under the direction of the authorised officer of the said municipal council.

6. *Stalls, shops, &c., to be cleansed.*—The holder of any shop, stall, shed, or other convenience aforesaid, shall within one hour after the opening of said market thoroughly cleanse his or her shop, stall, shed, or other convenience; and shall also clean the gutter and footway in front thereof.

7. *Where refuse is to be deposited.*—A space within the said market site, to be called the "refuse depot," shall be set apart and enclosed for the receipt of all rubbish and refuse matter produced within the said market; and no person or persons occupying any shops, sheds, or stalls in the said market shall deposit any rubbish or refuse matter in any other place than said refuse depot.

8. *Obstructions.*—No person or persons shall place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the said market, nor shall sweep, or cause to be swept, any dirt or rubbish into any of the gutters, streets, or footways, nor drive any hook, nail, or peg into any wood, stone or brickwork of any stalls, nor remove from such stalls any hooks, pegs, or nails that may be

inserted at the time of commencement of lease, without the sanction of the properly appointed officer of said municipal council.

9. *Rates, tolls, &c., to be imposed.*—The Ararat municipal council shall and are hereby empowered and authorised to impose and collect all such rates, tolls, and dues, in respect of and on all such articles as are enumerated in table A, in the schedule appended to this bye-law, which may be brought into the said market to be sold therein.

10. *Inspector to be appointed—Duties of inspector.*—The Ararat municipal council shall and are hereby empowered to appoint, for the more direct supervision of said market, an officer to be called the market inspector, whose duties will be—

1. To see that each and every of the clauses of this bye-law is observed, and to proceed legally against any person or persons who may be guilty of any breach or neglect thereof.
2. To receive and collect all moneys accruing from tolls, rents, and dues paid by parties selling produce in said market; to hand over to the town clerk all moneys so collected at least once a week, or as often as the municipal council may hereafter direct.
3. To keep in good order, and check as often as necessary, the standard scales and weights which will be supplied him by the council.
4. And to obey generally the instructions which may from time to time be issued by the said council for his guidance.

13. *Breach or neglect of bye-law.*—Any person committing any breach or neglect of the provisions of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

MUNICIPALITY OF EAGLEHAWK.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—TO PREVENT THE NUISANCES ARISING FROM SUFFERING CATTLE AND OTHER ANIMALS TO BE AT LARGE OR TO WANDER IN THE STREETS OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Eaglehawk, that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to suffer any cow, bull, or other horned animal, or any cattle whatsoever, or any horses, ass, mule, sheep, goat, or swine belonging to him, her, or them, or under his, her, or their care, to be at large, or to wander in any street or public place within the municipal district. Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 5, made by the municipal council of Eaglehawk, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

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MUNICIPALITY OF EAGLEHAWK.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—PROHIBITING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATER-COURSES, AND REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*; it is stated, amongst other things, that the council of any municipal district shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, and public thoroughfares, and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out those objects as shall to such council seem fit: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Eaglehawk, that no person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or beast, or shall drive or wheel any cart, barrow, carriage, or other vehicle, upon or across any of the public footpaths or water-courses of the municipal district of Eaglehawk, or shall in any way cause damage to the said public footpaths or water-courses, or any of them: provided that every owner or occupier of any gateway, yard, or lane, to which access by horses, beasts, carriages, or other vehicles can be obtained only by riding, leading, or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or water-courses, who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or water-courses, or any of them, as may be necessary for approach and access to any such private gateway, yard, or lane, at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said municipal council may appoint for that purpose, shall be allowed to use such crossing without being liable to the penalty hereinafter imposed. That the owner or occupier of any building or premises shall not cause or suffer any water to be discharged into or over any public footpath within the said district; provided that if the owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building or premises into the public water-tables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said council may appoint for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty hereinafter imposed. And any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the municipal council of Eaglehawk, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only, and if all be included in one tender, it will be accepted for one article only if advisable.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be drawn at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel for oats and bran, including delivery at the stations and all charges: bags to be returned when empty.

The net weight only after deducting the tare is to be charged.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked, "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street, or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be oaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity showing the gross weight the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expence over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor, by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1863.

DISQUALIFICATION.

Councillor Hickey became disqualified from non-attendance, and an election to fill the vacancy was duly advertised to take place on 21st December, 1862.

ELECTIONS.

At the annual election, Councillors Baldry and Tyson were re-elected, and Mr. Michael McKenna was returned in the place of Councillor Milvain who retired by rotation.

APPOINTMENTS.

Dr. Edward Davy, J.P., and George Gillam, Esq., as auditors; Dr. Edward Davy, J.P., as honorary health officer; and Senior Constable Holmes, as inspector of nuisances.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been gazetted during the half-year:—

- No. 4. For regulating proceedings at public meetings of rate-payers, and election of chairman.
- No. 5. For the election of managers of the municipal common.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Besides a log bridge near Ross street, the works executed during the half-year have been principally confined to pitching, metalling, forming, and draining upon various roads and streets, and the formation of footpaths. Of the former about 31 chains have been completed, and tenders for 4 miles of the latter have been accepted, all of which have been carried out.

WATER SUPPLY.

A scheme for more readily supplying the inhabitants with water from the Spring in Ross street has been left over for further consideration, but which is expected will be partially carried out during the ensuing half-year.

DEPUTATION.

On 19th June, a deputation, consisting of Councillors Milvain and Tyson, waited upon the Hon. Commissioner of Railways and Roads with reference to the action taken by Government in excepting a portion of the parish boundary road from the jurisdiction of the council, for the purpose of erecting a check toll-gate thereon.

At the request of the hon. commissioner, the deputation caused a written report to be forwarded to his office, which ultimately resulted in a favorable reply thereto, stating, "As the collection of tolls had been discontinued upon the road in question, there was nothing to prevent the council from expending money thereon, and consequently the revocation of the proclamation excepting the same from the council's jurisdiction was unnecessary."

MUNICIPAL COMMISSION.

A lengthened reply to a circular from the Municipal and Charitable Institutions Commission, was returned by the council, which answered almost every query contained therein, and offered likewise various suggestions for adoption or otherwise in an amended Municipal Act.

MECHANICS' INSTITUTE.

The council has granted a portion of the municipal buildings to a committee for a mechanics' institute and reading room, such committee to pay an annual peppercorn rent of 2s. 6d. for the same.

FINANCE.

In compliance with a request made by the Hon. the Minister of Finance, the council has resolved to close its financial year with the 31st of December in each year, consequently the account of receipts and disbursements given with this report will embrace a period of nearly seven months, commencing with the 5th of June and ending 31st December, 1862.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The following applications made to Government have been complied with:—

- The extension of Ross street, and a grant of 5 others.
- The extension to the district of sections 5 to 10 of the Town and Country Police Act.
- The removal of metal and road scrapings from Mollison street and the Mount Alexander road.
- For a municipal common.—About 1307 acres granted.
- For a complete set of Adamson's Acts, and other Acts recently passed.

6. For free passes on the occasion of opening the line to Sandhurst.—25 granted.

Further applications have been made with various results:—
1. To reduce the width of Mollison street to one and a half chains.—Not able under the existing law to be complied with.
2. For daily mails to Woodend, Taradale, and Sandhurst.—Under consideration.

3. For an approach to be made to the Railway Station in as direct a line as possible from the Coliban Bridge; and also for an approach from the Daylesford side.—No reply yet received.
