NOTICE TO MERCHANTS, AGENTS, AND MASTERS OF VESSELS TRADING TO WELSHPOOL, CORNER INLET.

REFERRING to the intimation of this date respecting Welshpool Jetty, it is hereby directed:

1. Merchants, agents, and others will be required to give at the Custom House, Port Albert, twenty-four hours' clear notice prior to their landing at or shipping goods from the jetty in question.

2. An officer will then be despatched thither, free of expense to the applicant, to attend to such landing or shipping, as the case may be; and such officer will be empowered to receive the inward report of masters of vessels trading to Welshpool, and to clear vessels outwards, without the necessity of any master proceeding to Port Albert.

3. Any goods landed or shipped, except under the provisions of the laws relating to the Customs, and in presence of an officer of Customs, will be forfeited, and the parties concerned in the illegal landing or shipment thereof will be liable to the penalties imposed by the said laws.

The notice issued on the 8th January, 1859, is hereby cancelled.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from No. 63.—JUNE 16, 1863.—1.

time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the times at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter or vary as the said Governor shall think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of January, in the present year, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding the Court of General Sessions for the district of Grant, at Geelong: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the times appointed for holding the Court of General Sessions in and for the district of Grant, at Geelong aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Friday, the twenty-eighth day of August next, in lieu of the first of September next.

Tuesday, the eighth day of December next, in lieu of the second of December aforesaid.

ELECTIONS.

On the 30th September, Messrs. Hugh Sloley, George Haynes, and David Smith, were duly elected to supply the vacancies caused by the retirement by rotation of Councillors Haynes and Spink, and the decease of Councillor Brown.

At the first meeting of the new council, on 8th October, Councillor Mason was elected chairman for the ensuing year, W. Young, Esq., treasurer, and Mr. J. M. Knight to the united offices of town clerk, surveyor, and rate collector.

BYE-LAWS.

A bye-law, No. 27, fixing the rate of assessment for the current year at 1s. 3d. in the pound sterling, was passed on 5th November, and duly assented to; a bye-law, No. 28, empowering the council to borrow money on security of the rates, was adopted by the council, but, pending the production of certain information, the assent of the Governor in Council has been withheld.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

Applications to the Government have been made for the recognition of a main line of road to Hamilton.—Under consideration.

For repairs to the Moyne Bridge, now in a very dangerous state.—Refused; reply stating, "Should your council fail to maintain the structure, the Commissioner sees no alternative but its falling to ruin."

PUBLIC WORKS.

A contract has been completed for the formation of 12½ chains of Gipps street, and the pitching and metalling of the same with bluestone and insertion of two 12-inch barrel culverts.

Various repairs have been effected on the Rosebrook and Yambuk roads, and 2480 cubic yards of earth removed from water-channels and hips of street have been disposed of to the contractor for the jetty bridge at a price which relieves the council altogether of the expense.

FINANCE.

The debt of £300 to Bank of Victoria has been paid off, as also that of £107 17s. 3d. to the district road board for half share contract, repairs to Rosebrook Bridge, and the council is now free from debt except a small amount due for rent of chambers, but which will be met by rates, &c., still to be collected.

MISCELLANEOUS.

A detailed statement of revenue and expenditure since the formation of the municipality was furnished to the commissioners appointed to enquire into the municipal and charitable institutions of Victoria, as also the council's opinion on several subjects for the amendment of the Municipal Act; these views were further supported by deputing the chairman (P. A. Jennings, Esq.) to represent the council at the conference held in Melbourne in January last.

Applications have been renewed for the extension of the telegraph and the holding of a county court and court of mines at St. Arnaud. Although at present unsuccessful in obtaining these concessions, the council confidently expect that their establishment will not be long delayed.
