THE ARARAT ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the boundaries of "The Ararat Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Ararat Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of the township reserve of Crowlands; thence in a direct line west to the eastern boundary of the road district of Stawell; thence south and west by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said district to the western boundary of the county of Ripon; thence south and east by the western and southern boundaries of the said county to a point where the electric telegraph line cuts the southern boundary of the said county; thence northerly by the electric telegraph line to a point due west of the southern boundary of

the parish of Mahrwallok; thence by a line north to the Fiery Creek; thence by the said creek to its junction with the Middle Creek; thence by the Middle Creek until it intersects the Main road leading from Ballarat to Ararat; thence by a direct line north-west to the commencing point.—(63,933.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes of the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district, and from time to time revoke any such Proclamation and vary and alter the boundary of any such district as may be necessary and advisable: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and do define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the Springfield Road District as proclaimed fifth August, 1862; thence north by the eastern boundary of the said district to a point due west of the south boundary line of the Kilmore township reserve; thence east to the south-east angle of the said reserve; thence south to the north-east angle of block CVII. in the parish of Bylands; thence east to the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence east by the county boundary to the western boundary of the Whittelea Road District; thence south by the western boundary of the said road district to the north-east angle of the Woodstock Road District; thence west by the northern and south by the western boundary of the Woodstock Road District to the northern boundary of the parish of Wollert; thence west by the northern boundary of the said parish and of section XXIV. in the parish of Yuroke to the east boundary of section XXIII. in the said parish of Yuroke; thence north to the north-east angle of said section XXIII.; thence west to the eastern boundary of the parish of Mickleham; thence north by the eastern boundary of the said parish of Mickleham to the north-east angle of section XXV. in the said parish; thence west by the northern boundaries of sections XXV., XXVI., XXVII. of the parish of Mickleham, and the northern boundary of section XV. in the parish of Bolinda, to the commencing point: excepting any portion of the municipality of Kilmore which may be within the above-described boundaries.

And I do hereby give to such road district the specific name or designation of "The Donnybrook, Wallan-Wallan, and Bylands Road District."

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district

thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district, and from time to time revoke any such Proclamation and vary and alter the boundary of any such district as may be necessary and advisable: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the 7th day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a road district under the designation of the Heathcote and Waranga Road District was proclaimed: And whereas it is expedient to substitute another district in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and do define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the River Campaspe due west of Mount Camel; thence due east to the River Goulburn; thence southerly by the said river to the Stony Creek; thence southerly by the Stony Creek to the northern boundary of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive right; thence west by the northern boundary of the said pre-emptive right and a direct line to a point two miles west of the northern boundary of the said pre-emptive right; thence by a line due south to the Sugar Loaf Creek; thence by the centre of Sugar Loaf Creek southerly to its junction with Mollison's Creek; thence by the centre of Mollison's Creek and the Granite ranges westerly to the south-east corner of allotment 2, in the parish of Baynton; thence by Pohlman's Creek north-westerly to the north boundary of the said parish of Baynton; thence by the north boundary of the said parish westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 16, in the said parish; thence by a direct line bearing easterly to the centre of Piper's Creek, at south-west corner of allotment 3, in the parish of Glenhope; thence northerly by the centre of Piper's Creek to its junction with the Campaspe River; thence by said River Campaspe northerly to the commencing point.

And I do hereby give to such road district the specific name or designation of "The Heathcote Road District."

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Lexton Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Lexton Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of portion 111, in the parish of Beckworth; thence by a line south to the north-west angle of the parish of Addington; thence to and by the western boundary of the Ballaarat road district, bearing south until it intersects the line of electric telegraph on road leading from Ballaarat to Ararat; thence westerly by the electric telegraph line to the Emu Creek; thence north-westerly by the Emu Creek to the south-west boundary of the Lange Kal-kal run; thence north-westerly by the said boundary of the said run to the northern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence westerly by the county boundary to the eastern boundary of the road district of Ararat; thence north-westerly by the said district boundary to the south-west angle of the town reserve of Crowlands; thence by the south boundary of the said town reserve and a direct line easterly to the north-west angle of Hodgkinson's pre-emptive right; thence by the north boundary of the said right to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a straight line from the lastnamed point, bearing south-easterly to the commencing point.—(63,935.)
