NOTIFICATION IN REGARD TO SMALL-POX.

THE Central Board of Health having received information of the prevalence of Small-pox in London and several other places in England in constant communication with this colony, deem it expedient to call public attention to the possibility of the introduction of this disease, and to the importance of taking the precaution against its spread, which is to be obtained by the general practice of vaccination.

The Board have before them the most conclusive evidence that one vaccination in childhood does not afford protection to the individual from small-pox in after life, and they are therefore of opinion, that in order to obtain ordinary security, every person in the colony, young and old, should be re-vaccinated.

The Board earnestly trust that they will obtain the co-operation of the general public, the medical profession, and the authorities charged with the conservancy of the public health, in this important matter, not only in recommending the re-vaccination of adults and children, but also in inducing the more general practice of infantile vaccination, which the Board fear has, notwithstanding the provisions of the Compulsory Vaccination Act, been much neglected.

THE IMPORTATION OF CATTLE INTO OTAGO ALLOWED FROM QUEENSLAND, TASMANIA, AND TWOFOLD BAY.

THE accompanying Proclamation by His Honor the Superintendent of Otago, permitting the importation into that province of Cattle from Queensland, Tasmania, and Twofold Bay, is published for general information.

PROCLAMATION.

Admitting Cattle into the province of Otago from Queensland, Tasmania, and Twofold Bay in New South Wales. By the Honorable JOHN HYDE HARRIS, Esquire, Superintendent of the said province.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 5th day of June, 1862, the Superintendent of the province of Otago, by virtue of the powers delegated to him under the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861, did proclaim and declare that after the date of the said Proclamation all districts, places, and ports wheresoever, out of the main land of the North and Middle Islands of New Zealand, should be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas the Governor in Council hath by warrant under his hand delegated to me, John Hyde Harris, so long as I shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Otago, the several powers vested in the Governor by the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 10th sections of the said Act, subject to be rescinded as in the said Act is provided, and subject to the Regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of October, 1861: And whereas by the 4th of the said Regulations it is provided that in the exercise of the powers delegated under the 9th section of the said Act, the Superintendent of any province may from time to time, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the province, rescind any proclamation of an infected district, wholly or as to any part thereof:

Now therefore I, the said John Hyde Harris, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that I do hereby rescind the aforesaid Proclamation of the 5th day of June, 1862, so far as the same relates to the colony of Queensland, the colony of Tasmania, and the port and district of Twofold Bay in the colony of New South Wales, and I do hereby declare that the said districts shall not, from the date hereof until further notice, be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the above-mentioned Act.

And I do hereby further declare that it shall be lawful for me, the said Superintendent, to allow cattle to be landed from vessels from the Chatham Islands, subject to such conditions and restrictions as I may deem expedient and the circumstances of any case may require.

THE COLAC ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Colac Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Colac Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the east shore of the Tirrangower Morass due west from the south-west angle of section 15, in the parish of Pirron Yaloak, in the county of Polworth, and being bounded on the south by the south boundaries of sections 15, 16, and 20 of the aforesaid parish, and of sections 23 to 28 of the parish of Elliminyt, and a line bearing east to the centre of the River Barwon; thence on the east by the centre of the River Barwon northwards to a point due east of the south boundary line of allotment N of section 28, in the parish of Birregurra; thence westwards to the south-west angle of the lastnamed allotment; thence northwards to the south boundary of allotment A of section 22 in the lastnamed parish; thence south-east along the south boundary of the lastnamed allotment to its south-east angle; thence due north along the eastern boundaries of allotments A, B, C, D, and E of said section 22 to the north-east angle of said allotment E; thence westwards to the south-east side line of a Government road (bounding the lastnamed section on the north-west); thence north-east along the side line of the said road, and of allotment E of section 19, in the lastnamed parish, to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of the lastnamed section; and thence northerly by the said dividing line (crossing the Birregurra Creek into the county of Grenville) and the dividing line of allotments B and C of section 12, in the lastnamed parish, to the Colac road; thence north-east along the said Colac road to a point due south of the east side line of allotments 50 and 57 of the lastnamed parish, and onwards to the south side of section 104, in the parish of Gellibrand; thence further north by the western boundary of the said parish, and along the dividing line between the parishes of Hesse and Warracaranah to the north-east angle of the lastnamed parish; thence westward to the west boundary of the parish of Hesse; and thence north again by the west boundaries of the parishes of Hesse and Wingee to the Geelong and Cressy road; thence westerly by the said road to the centre of the Woody Yaloak River; thence southerly and westerly by the Woody Yaloak and the borders of the Shallow Salt Lake and the inlet thereto from the Lake Corangamite to the eastern shores of the said lake; thence southerly by the eastern shores of Lake Corangamite, the Pirron Yaloak Creek, and Tirrangower Morass home to the commencing point.—(63,980.)

THE MEREDITH ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving roads in the colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district, and from time to time revoke any such Proclamation and vary and alter the boundary of any such district as may be necessary and advisable: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and do define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:

Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Waddallah; thence west by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Burtwarrah and Carrah to the River Leigh; thence north-

westerly by the River Leigh to the southern boundary of the Buninyong Road District; thence east and north by the south and west boundary of the said road district to the south-west angle of the Ballan Road District; thence east by the south boundary of the Ballan Road District to the west boundary of the parish of Balliang; thence south and east by the west and south boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of the Corio Road District; thence south by the west boundary of the Corio Road District to the north boundary of the parish of Yowang; thence west by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Yowang and Darriwil to the Moorabool River; thence southerly by the said river to the north-east angle of the parish of Waddallah; thence west by the north boundary of the said parish to the commencing point.

And I do hereby give to such road district the specific name or designation of "The Meredith Road District."

THE MELTON ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the first day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The Melton Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Melton Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the point of junction of Toolern Toolern Creek and Werribee River; thence by a portion of the western and by the northern boundaries of the Braybrook Road District to the western boundary of the parish of Maribyrnong; thence north to the north-west angle of the said parish; thence east by the northern boundary of the said parish to its point of intersection with the centre of the Mount Alexander road at Keilor; thence north-westerly by the centre of Mount Alexander road to a point where it is intersected by the western boundary of the Mount Alexander and Murray River Railway; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said railway.—(62,146.)

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED UNDER THE WATER RESERVE, SEBASTOPOL.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf by the Act 21 Victoria No. 32, has, by an Order made on the 22nd day of June, 1863, authorized holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations under the water reserve at Sebastopol, the same being allotments 12, section 2, in the parish of Cardigan, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter prescribed, viz:—

1. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to interfere with the purpose for which the reserve was made.
2. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for the purpose of residence, and no tents or huts shall be erected thereon.
3. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other authorized officer.
4. On ceasing to mine, the miners shall fill up all shafts and excavations made by them, remove all debris, clay, and gravel, as well as all buildings erected by them, and leave the surface of the ground in as good a condition as before the commencement of mining operations.
5. All instructions given by the mining surveyor or other authorized officer relative to the mode of timbering or otherwise protecting the ground shall be complied with by the miners.
6. In case any person so mining shall in any way violate the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine upon any claim upon or within such lands.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

SALE (No. II.).

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-one landholders and householders resident at Sale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state their conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Sale into a municipal district as tending to its improvement and good government, and that a public meeting was held at Sale on the 6th of April last, at which meeting it was unanimously resolved as follows:—"That the important and growing interests of Sale imperatively call for local self-government; that the meeting views with apprehension the probability of Sale being included in a district council, and desires respectfully to represent to your Excellency that its formation into a municipality is the course best adapted to its interests and circumstances."

The petitioners further state that Sale is the most populous town in Gipps Land, that its buildings are increasing, while its streets remain in their primitive state, and are during the winter months almost impassable, and that business is then conducted under circumstances adverse to the prosperity of the town and suburbs.

They add that the sites of the new Government Offices, Court House, and Gaol, are in streets not under the control of the district engineer; that the area comprised in the district prayed for does not exceed nine square miles, in which no point is distant six miles from any other; and that it contains a population of not less than 300 householders.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:-

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the area contained within the following boundaries may be proclaimed as the 'Sale Municipal District,' viz.:-Bounded on the north by a one-chain road commencing at the north-west corner of suburban allotment No. 74, parish of Sale, and bearing east one hundred and eighty chains; on the east by a one-chain road, bearing south one hundred and eighty-seven chains to Flooding Creek; on the south by Flooding Creek; and on the west by Flooding Creek to the south-west corner of allotment 74; and by the western boundary of lot 74, bearing north eight chains to the point of commencement."

SUNBURY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF SUNBURY CEMETERY.

BEFORE any interment shall take place application for permission shall be made to the secretary a reasonable time previously, when an order, in the form or to the effect set out in the annexed schedule B, will be given to the applicant upon payment of the charges in schedule marked A annexed.

3. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug.

4. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton before sunset of the day previous to the burial.

5. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m., with exception of Sunday, when the hours will be from Two p.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.

6. The trustees will permit vaults or graves to be dug, maintained, and kept as private burial places: and monuments or tombstones may be erected or placed thereon in accordance with the rules and regulations.

7. Permission to have a private burial place will be given by the trustees in the form and to the effect set forth in the schedule C annexed, and upon payment of the fees in schedule A annexed.

8. Brick graves or vaults must be cemented under the directions of the trustees.

9. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, or tablet, and a plan of every monument, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the trustees for approval before permission for the erection or placing thereof shall be given.

13. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

14. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.

15. No servant employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity from others.

16. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

17. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept by the secretary, which may be examined upon payment of the charges according to schedule A.

18. The sexton shall have orders to turn out or take into custody any person who shall commit any trespass or injury within the cemetery.

19. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in their charges and regulations, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

20. The charges will be reduced for the burial of any person on a certificate of a minister of religion or sufficient evidence that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

MUNICIPALITY OF KYNETON.

ELEVENTH Report of the Council, for the Half-year ending 10th June, 1863.

Sixteen ordinary and eleven special meetings have been held during the half-year, and four lapsed for want of a quorum. The attendance was as follows:—The Chairman (Councillor Jarrett) attended 21; Councillor Hardie, 22; Councillor McCarthy, 11; Councillor Hargreave, 20; Councillor McKenna, 18; Councillor Barrow, 24; and Councillor McDonald, 15.

Councillor Kelly resigned on the 19th December, and Councillor McDonald was elected in his stead.

The council applied to the Government for a supply of pipes to lay on water for use in case of fires, &c., also for enlarged goods-shed accommodation at the railway station, but in each case without success.

A fresh contract with the gas company has been entered into for lighting the town lamps at a reduction of £2 per lamp on the price of last year.

Bye-laws have been passed "For preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances caused by the overflow or soakage of waterclosets and cesspools," and "For levying a rate at 1s. 6d. in the pound for 1863" (which have been gazetted); and one for preventing fires arising from hay, straw, &c., being stacked in the town, is under consideration.

Initiatory steps are being taken for the formation of the municipality and the neighboring road board districts into a shire, under the provisions of the bill now before Parliament.

The Cattle Market dues were advertised to be let for a year, and Mr. D. Wallace's tender was accepted, but that gentleman has hitherto neglected to take up the contract.

The following public works have been completed or are in progress, viz.:—Ebdon street, from Baynton to Piper street, pitched and metalled; new bridge over Post Office Creek, in Ebdon street, and road from thence to Cemetery road, pitched and metalled; Wedge street, from Mitchell street to Post Office Creek, and thence to Racecourse road, pitched and metalled; Baynton street, from Wedge street to St. Agnes place, and thence to Rogers and Harper's crossing, formed, and a large portion thereof pitched and metalled; Hutton street, from Mollison street to Ebdon street, pitched and metalled; one chain of road made in Jeffreys street; about ten chains of the eastern end of Bodkin street pitched and metalled; pitched crossing near the Junction Hotel; and extra pitching, &c., to Cattle Market. The eastern boundary road has also been repaired, and several other minor works carried out.

Appended is the statement of receipts and expenditure for the period embraced by this report.
