NOTICE TO BONDED WAREHOUSE PROPRIETORS OR OCCUPIERS.

THE attention of bonded warehouse proprietors or occupiers is directed to the 20th clause of the Customs Laws Amendment Act (27 Victoria No. 169), a copy of which is given below:—

"XX. The owner or occupier of every bonded warehouse shall, previously to the issue of any certificate in respect to goods stored in such warehouse, cause the rate of rent payable for the goods specified therein, and also the customs quantities of such goods as furnished by the proper officer of customs, to be marked on the certificate thereof; and any person other than the proper officer of customs who shall erase or alter any such customs quantities so marked shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds."

NOTICE TO LIGHTERMEN, BOATMEN, AND LICENSED CARRIERS.

THE attention of lightermen, boatmen, and licensed carriers is directed to the 7th section of the Customs Laws Amendment Act (27 Victoria No. 169), by which the following annual fees are payable in advance by every person licensed or to be licensed under the 17th, 137th, and 138th sections of the Customs Act, 1857, viz:—

For every dray or vehicle to be licensed to carry goods under bond, the fee of £1.

For every vessel or boat used as a lighter, the fee of £1.

For every other vessel or boat, the fee of 5s.

Instructions have been given to the proper officers for the immediate enforcement of the law.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WANGARATTA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, shall apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Wangaratta.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 34.—A BYE-LAW FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF TWO SHILLINGS IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE 16TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1864.

WHEREAS by the said Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to assess all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to its fair annual average value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Ballarat, that all the several properties within the said municipal district that have been assessed for the year ending the sixteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment book for the said year, confirmed by the said council on the eighth day of June, 1863, and amounting in the whole, after all appeals have been heard and decided upon by the justices of the peace in petty sessions and at the general sessions held at Ballarat, to a total sum of £102,434 11s., which said assessment has been assented to by the Lieutenant Governor, and is in legal force for the municipal year ending 16th January, 1864, and until all rates thereon have been fully paid: Be it further enacted that a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said properties for the year ending the sixteenth day of January, 1864, and shall become due and payable in equal proportions, that is to say, the first moiety thereof shall become due and payable on the 16th day of July, the second moiety to become due and payable on the 16th day of November, both in the year 1863; provided nevertheless where the total rate for the year does not exceed the sum of Ten shillings, then such rate shall be due and payable in full on the 16th day of July, 1863.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 31, made by the municipal council of Ballarat, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 6th day of July, 1863.

MUNICIPALITY OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BYE-LAW No. 32.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND NINEPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE MUNICIPAL YEAR OF 1863 AND 1864.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings (2s.) in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell, that a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and lands within the municipal district, the assessment of which, after the hearing of appeals against the said assessment, amounts to the sum of Twenty-eight thousand one hundred and fifty-six pounds ten shillings (£28,156 10s.), one moiety to be collected on and after the first day of July, 1863, and the other moiety on and after the first day of October, 1863.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 32, made by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 6th day of July, 1863.

MUNICIPALITY OF BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN POUNDS AND FOURPENCE (£177 0s. 4d.), BALANCE OF GRANT-IN-AID FOR 1862 TO BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE (NEW) MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered and required to make a bye-law for the appropriation of all money in aid received from Government: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Brown's and Scarsdale, that the sum of £177 0s. 4d. (One hundred and seventy-seven pounds and fourpence), received from Government, be appropriated as follows, namely:—

For the construction of culverts and forming and metalling, &c., roadway between the junction of Linton road with Brooke street, Smythesdale, and Scarsdale Hotel, comprised in contracts Nos. 1, 2, and 3; and construction of culvert and approaches thereto at Watson's Gully, between Smythesdale and Brown's, contract No. 4. £177 0s. 4d.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 6, made by the municipal council of Brown's and Scarsdale, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 6th day of July, 1863.

The petitioners state their conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Sale into a municipal district as tending to its improvement and good government, and that a public meeting was held at Sale on the 6th of April last, at which meeting it was unanimously resolved as follows:—"That the important and growing interests of Sale imperatively call for local self-government; that the meeting views with apprehension the probability of Sale being included in a district council, and desires respectfully to represent to your Excellency that its formation into a municipality is the course best adapted to its interests and circumstances."

The danger arising from a low and irregular pressure and a want of extension of the Yan Yean water supply in the district, a subject which had frequently been urged on the attention of

ELECTION.

APPOINTMENTS.

18th December, managers of the municipal common, Messrs. D. Fernie, G. Gillam, and C. Quin; and on 1st April, Councillors Davy and Tyson, in the room of Messrs. Fernie and Gillam, resigned; 5th January, assessor, surveyor, and rate collector, Mr. J. G. Farquhar, at a salary of £50 per annum; auditors, Messrs. John French and George Gillam; 15th January, inspector of nuisances, senior constable Holmes, at a salary of £15 per annum; 19th February, keeper of lodge, Mrs. Isaac, at a weekly salary of 4s. The town clerk was re-appointed at his former salary of £60 per annum.

FINANCE.

The total value of the property within the municipality, after the hearing of appeals, amounted to £7063, on which a rate of One shilling in the pound has been struck.

PUBLIC WORKS.

A permanent improvement has been effected upon the spring in Ross street, which is now protected by a fence, and otherwise made more available to the public. Improvements have also been made upon a well on the reserve, for the convenience of parties residing there. The other public works carried out during the half-year have consisted in pitching, metalling, re-metalling, and draining various roads and streets.

DEPUTATION.

The Chairman, accompanied by the Chairman of the Daylesford municipality and the Chairman of the Glenlyon Road Board, waited upon the Honorable Commissioner of Railways and Roads, relative to building bridges over the Loddon and Wallaby Creeks. Want of funds prevented the Honorable Commissioner from complying with the objects of the deputation.

FORMATION OF A SHIRE.

This subject has been under the consideration of the council during the latter part of the half-year, and the Chairman and Councillors Tyson, McGrane, and Davy, appointed a Shire Committee. Nothing definite has at present been arrived at in the matter.

BYE-LAWS.

The following have been assented to:—No. 6. For the preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances caused by the overflow or soakage of waterclosets or cesspools. No. 7. For levying a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year.

The annual election to fill the vacancies caused by the retirement of Councillors Brennan, Falconer, and Daiziel, took place on 3rd October, 1862, and resulted in the return of Hon. George Harker, J.P., Hon. Charles Vaughan, J.P., and Councillor Falconer.

Councillor Groom retired on 19th November, and Councillor J. Michael was elected to fill that vacancy on 24th December following.

Councillor Hon. Charles Vaughan was unanimously elected chairman of the council for current municipal year.

The following public works have been constructed during the past half-year. Five rights-of-way at a cost of £270 5s.—Reilly-street channel extended to Nicholson street. Twelve hundred yards of metal spread. Pathways gravelled in streets kerbed under £5000 loan.

A contract has been accepted for lighting the street lamps with kerosene oil at £9 2s. 6d. per lamp, whereby a saving of about £500 has been effected.

The average cost of kerbing and channelling laid down under the £5000 loan is about £7 per chain, and it is estimated that loan will enable the council to construct about eight and a half miles of those descriptions of permanent improvements.

The value of rateable property in Fitz Roy is estimated at £96,550, after reductions by appeal, &c., on which a rate of One shilling and threepence has been levied, amounting to £6034 7s. 6d.

A bye-law has been adopted for suppression of nuisances by overflow or soakage of cesspools.

An inspector of weights and measures has been appointed for the municipality.

The council have held several special meetings to consider the Municipal Bill submitted to the Legislative Assembly, November, 1862. The opinions of the council were placed in Councillor Bryant's hands to submit at the meeting of the Municipal Conference. Though objectionable in some of its principles, the council consider the Bill contains many judicious and much required provisions, which will materially facilitate municipal government.
