NOTICE TO BONDED WAREHOUSE PROPRIETORS OR OCCUPIERS.

THE attention of bonded warehouse proprietors or occupiers is directed to the 20th clause of the Customs Laws Amendment Act (27 Victoria No. 169), a copy of which is given

"XX. The owner or occupier of every bonded warehouse shall, previously to the issue of any certificate in respect to goods stored in such warehouse, cause the rate of rent payable for the goods specified therein, and also the customs quantities of such goods as furnished by the proper officer of customs, to be marked on the certificate thereof; and any person other than the proper officer of customs who shall erase or alter any such customs quantities so marked shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds."

NOTICE TO LIGHTERMEN, BOATMEN, AND LICENSED CARRIERS.

THE attention of lightermen, boatmen, and licensed carriers is directed to the 7th section of the Customs Laws Amendment Act (27 Victoria No. 169), by which the following annual fees are payable in advance by every person licensed or to be licensed under the 17th, 137th, and 138th sections of the Customs Act, 1857, viz.:—

For every dray or vehicle to be licensed to carry goods under bond, the fee of £1.

For every vessel or boat used as a lighter, the fee of £1.

For every other vessel or boat, the fee of 5s.

Instructions have been given to the proper officers for the immediate enforcement of the law.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARRLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the aboverecited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

ALLANSFORD TOWN COMMON.—The area hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Town Common for Allansford, viz.:—Containing 1440 acres: Commencing at the southwest corner of allotment 6 of section A, in the parish of Talangatta, and bounded on the north by a line bearing east ninety-eight chains fifty links; and on the east by a line bearing south one hundred and ten chains; and on the south by a line bearing west one hundred and thirty-three chains ninety links; and on the west by a line bearing north ninety chains; thence by the south side of a one chain road bearing north-easterly to commencing point.—(63.H.2073.)

COCHRANE'S GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The gold field common, described amongst others under the designation of "Cochrane's," in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, is hereby abolished; and the area hereinafter described shall be and constitute Cochrane's Gold Field Common, viz.—County and parish unnamed: Commencing at a point bearing about fifty-five chains sixty-five links due east from the north-east angle of the township of Bealiba; thence by a line bearing south one hundred and thirty-five chains sixty-five links; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and ninety-one chains thirty links; thence by a line bearing north to a point due west of the angle formed by the junction of the southern boundary line of the main line of road from Bealiba to Dunolly with the eastern boundary line of main road from Bealiba to Moliagul; thence by a line bearing due east to said angle; thence by the southern boundary of main road to, Dunolly to a point due north of the commencing point; and thence by a line bearing due south to the point of commencement; excluding from the abovedescribed area the township reserve of Bealiba and all sold and appropriated lands. MUNICIPALITY OF ST. ARNAUD.

BYE-LAW NO. 13.—FOR PROHIBITING DAMAGE TO THE FOOT-PATHS AND WATER-COURSES, AND FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS OVER FOOTPATHS AND WATER-

PATIS AND WATER-COURSES, AND FOR ERGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS OVER FOOTPATIES AND WATER-COURSES.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of 'Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is enacted that every municipal council 'shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, and public thoroughfares, and shall and may make bye-laws for carrying out these objects: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of St. Arnaud, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of Victoria—

1. No person or persons shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or beast, nor shall drive or wheel any carriage, cart, barrow or other vehicle upon or across any of the public footpaths within the district, nor in any way damage or cause to be damaged the said footpaths or any of them, nor in any way damage or cause to be damaged the public water-courses or any of them.

2. Every owner or occupier of any gateway, yard, lane, or private road or way, to which access by horses, beasts, carriages, or other vehicles, can be obtained only by riding, driving, leading, or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or water-courses, who shall make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths and water-courses or any of them, as may be necessary for approach and access to any such gateway, yard, lane, or private road or way, in the manner hereinafter described, at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of the municipal surveyor or such other officer as the municipal council may appoint in this behalf, shall be allowed to use such crossing without being liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

3. In streets where a stone or wood kerb is now or hereafter may be laid, every such crossing as aforesaid, when required, shall be paved with wood or stone pavement, or metalled with broken stone or metal, the whole width of the footpath from the building line to the pavement of the water-channel

the footpath. The water-channel must not in any way be altered for obstructed, but it shall be competent for the municipal council to grant permission for the construction of a stone culvert across any such channel. In cases where the water-channel is not paved, the street kerbing need not be removed, but a wooden bridge may be placed across the channel in the manner hereinafter provided.

4. In streets where a footpath and water-channel are or may hereafter be formed, and where no kerbing is laid, the channels must be formed with stone or wood paving, or broken stone or metal, or suitable wooden bridges must be provided and fixed over the water-channel so as to leave a free passage for the water underneath such bridges, which may project into the public roadway not more than four feet from the outer edge of the 5. The owners or occupiers of any buildings or property shall

footpath.

5. The owners or occupiers of any buildings or property shall not cause or suffer any water to be discharged on, to, or over any public footpaths; but such owners or occupiers, or any of them, may make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such buildings or property into the public water-channels, at the expense of such owners or occupiers, under the superintendence aforesaid, and with the consent of the municipal council first had and obtained, without being liable to the penalty hereinafter mentioned.

6. Any person or persons guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 13, made by the municipal council of St. Arnaud, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 6th day of July, 1863. J. McCULLOCH.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

SALE (No. II.).

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinatter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-one landholders and householders resident at Sale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district. JOHN O'SHANASSY.

The petitioners state their conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Sale into a municipal district as tending to its improvement and good government, and that a public meeting was held at Sale on the 6th of April last at which meeting it was unanimously resolved as follows:— That the important and growing interests of Sale imperatively call for local self-government; that the meeting views with apprehension the probability of Sale being included in a district council, and desires respectfully to represent to your Excellency that its formation into a municipality is the course best adapted to its interests and circumstances."

The petitioners further state that Sale is the most populous town in Gipps Land, that its buildings are increasing, while its streets remain in their primitive state, and are during the winter months almost impassable, and that business is then conducted under circumstances adverse to the prosperity of the town and suburbs.

They add that the sites of the new Government Offices, Court House, and Gaol, are in streets not under the control of the district engineer; that the area comprised in the district prayed for does not exceed nine square miles, in which no point is distant six miles from any other; and that it contains a population of not less than 300 householders.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:--

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the area contained within the following boundaries may be proclaimed as the 'Sale Municipal District,' viz.:—Bounded on the north by a one-chain road commencing at the north-west corner of suburban allotment No. 74, parish of Sale, and bearing east one hundred and eighty chains; on the east by a one-chain road, bearing south one hundred and eighty-seven chains to Flooding Creek; on the south by Flooding Creek; and on the west by Flooding Creek to the south-west corner of allotment 74; and by the western boundary of lot 74, bearing north eight chains to the point of commencement."

The annual election to fill the vacancies caused by the retirement of Councillors Brennan, Falconer, and Dalziel, took place on 3rd October, 1862, and resulted in the return of Hon. George Harker, J.P., Hon. Charles Vaughan, J.P., and Councillor Falconer.

Councillor Groom retired on 19th November, and Councillor J. Michael was elected to fill that vacancy on 24th December following.

Councillor Hon. Charles Vaughan was unanimously elected chairman of the council for current municipal year.

The following public works have been constructed during the past half-year. Five rights-of-way at a cost of £270 5s. Roilly-street channel extended to Nicholson street. Twelve hundred yards of metal spread. Pathways gravelled in streets kerbed under £5000 loan.

A contract has been accepted for lighting the street lamps with kerosene oil at £9 2s. 6d. per lamp, whereby a saving of about £500 has been effected.

The average cost of kerbing and channelling laid down under the £5000 loan is about £7 per chain, and it is estimated that loan will enable the council to construct about eight and a half, miles of those descriptions of permanent improvements.

The value of rateable property in Fitz Roy is estimated at £90,550, after reductions by appeal, &c., on which a rate of One shilling and threepence has been levied, amounting to £60347s. 6d.

A bye-law has been adopted for suppression of nuisances, by overflow or soakage of cesspools.

An inspector of weights and measures has been appointed or the municipality.

The council have held several special meetings to consider the Municipal Bill submitted to the Legislative Assembly, Norwember, 1862. The opinions of the council were placed in Councillor Bryant's hands to submit at the meeting of the Muzinicipal Cenference. Though objectionable in some of its prin-
