The petitioners state their conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Sale into a municipal district as tending to its improvement and good government, and that a public meeting was held at Sale on the 6th of April last, at which meeting it was unanimously resolved as follows:—"That the important and growing interests of Sale imperatively call for local self-government; that the meeting views with apprehension the probability of Sale being included in a district council, and desires respectfully to represent to your Excellency that its formation into a municipality is the course best adapted to its interests and circumstances."

The petitioners further state that Sale is the most populous town in Gipps Land, that its buildings are increasing, while its streets remain in their primitive state, and are during the winter months almost impassable, and that business is then conducted under circumstances adverse to the prosperity of the town and suburbs.

They add that the sites of the new Government Offices, Court House, and Gaol, are in streets not under the control of the district engineer; that the area comprised in the district prayed for does not exceed nine square miles, in which no point is distant six miles from any other; and that it contains a population of not less than 300 householders.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the area contained within the following boundaries may be proclaimed as the 'Sale Municipal District,' viz.:—Bounded on the north by a one-chain road commencing at the north-west corner of suburban allotment No. 74, parish of Sale, and bearing east one hundred and eighty chains; on the east by a one-chain road, bearing south one hundred and eighty-seven chains to Flooding Creek; on the south by Flooding Creek; and on the west by Flooding Creek to the south-west corner of allotment 74; and by the western boundary of lot 74, bearing north eight chains to the point of commencement."

MUNICIPALITY OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR REGULATING THE DRIVING OF UNBROKEN HORSES AND CATTLE THROUGH THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act is empowered to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas great danger to life and property arises from the practice of driving unbroken horses and cattle at all hours into and through the municipal district of Essendon and Flemington, and it is expedient to devise means for the prevention of the same: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Essendon and Flemington, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Chief of the Colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act—

1. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to drive into or through the said municipal district any unbroken horses or cattle, on any Sunday between the hours of Eight of

the clock in the morning and Nine of the clock in the evening, nor on the other days of the week between the hours of Eight of the clock in the morning and Five of the clock in the evening from the 1st day of April to the 30th day of September, and between the hours of Seven of the clock in the morning and Seven of the clock in the evening from the 1st day of October to the 31st day of March.

2. That no bull shall be driven into or through the said municipal district during the hours aforesaid, and no bull shall be allowed to run at large through any portion of the said district, excepting on private property.

Any person or persons guilty of the neglect or breach of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to horses secured by a bridle or halter, or in harness, milch cows, oxen in yoke, nor to bulls in herd or led by halter.

The foregoing bye-law, No. 7, made by the municipal council of Essendon and Flemington, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 13th day of July, 1863.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT STANLEY.

- 1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
- 2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees in Stanley, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. the previous day.
- 3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- 4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- 5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. during the whole year.
- 6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the cost or charges.
- 7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery, to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.

8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair must be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.

12. A plan of the cemetery and register will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in schedule A.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to, any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.

15. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
