**TOWN COMMON.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned to be a Town Common in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**STRATFORD TOWN COMMON.**—Total area, about one thousand two hundred and eighty-one acres, embracing the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundary of the township of Stratford, and an area of about six hundred and twenty-four acres, parish of Stratford, Gipps Land district: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 10, in the parish of Stratford; thence by part of northern boundary of same allotment, bearing N. 83° 11' E. to its intersection by a creek, being a western branch of the Deep Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to its junction with the Deep Creek; thence by last-mentioned creek south-easterly and southerly through allotments 7, 6, and 15 of section 10, to a point where it enters a morass on the north bank of the Avon River; thence by a line south to said river; thence westerly and northerly by the same to the south boundary fence of the Police Paddock; thence by southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of same to its north-western angle; thence by a line and the western boundaries of allotments 5, 4, and 3, and a line and western boundaries of allotments 2 and 1, section 10, due north to the point of commencement.—(63.G.2192.)

The petitioners state their conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Sale into a municipal district as tending to its improvement and good government, and that a public meeting was held at Sale on the 6th of April last, at which meeting it was unanimously resolved as follows:—"That the important and growing interests of Sale imperatively call for local self-government; that the meeting views with apprehension the probability of Sale being included in a district council, and desires respectfully to represent to your Excellency that its formation into a municipality is the course best adapted to its interests and circumstances."

The petitioners further state that Sale is the most populous town in Gipps Land, that its buildings are increasing, while its streets remain in their primitive state, and are during the winter months almost impassable, and that business is then conducted under circumstances adverse to the prosperity of the town and suburbs.
