The petitioners state their conviction that necessity exists for the erection of Sale into a municipal district as tending to its improvement and good government, and that a public meeting was held at Sale on the 6th of April last, at which meeting it was unanimously resolved as follows:—That the important and growing interests of Sale imperatively call for local self-government; that the meeting views with apprehension the probability of Sale being included in a district council, and desires respectfully to represent to your Excellency that its formation into a municipality is the course best adapted to its interests and circumstances."

The petitioners further state that Sale is the most populous town in Gipps Land, that its buildings are increasing, while its streets remain in their primitive state, and are during the winter months almost impassable, and that business is then conducted under circumstances adverse to the prosperity of the town and suburbs.

They add that the sites of the new Government Offices, Court House, and Gaol, are in streets not under the control of the district engineer; that the area comprised in the district prayed for does not exceed nine square miles, in which no point is distant six miles from any other; and that it contains a population of not less than 300 householders.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:-

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the area contained within the following boundaries may be proclaimed as the 'Sale Municipal District,' viz.:- Bounded on the north by a one-chain road commencing at the north-west corner of suburban allotment No. 74, parish of Sale, and bearing east one hundred and eighty chains; on the east by a one-chain road, bearing south one hundred and eighty-seven chains to Flooding Creek; on the south by Flooding Creek; and on the west by Flooding Creek to the south-west corner of allotment 74; and by the western boundary of lot 74, bearing north eight chains to the point of commencement."

MUNICIPALITY OF CRESWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—FOR REGULATING COMMON LODGING-HOUSES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CRESWICK.

ANY person or persons who may desire to keep, or shall be keeping common lodging-houses within this municipality, shall be required to have such houses registered in accordance with the Common Lodging-houses Act of 1854.

2. In all registered houses accommodation shall be provided as follows:—

In sleeping apartments not lathed and plastered, where there is a fire-place and door and windows in proportion to the size of the room, a space of three hundred (300) cubic feet shall be allowed for each person.

In wooden buildings lathed and plastered, and in brick and stone buildings with a fire-place and doors and windows in proportion to the size of the room, four hundred (400) cubic feet shall be allowed for each person.

In all rooms where there is no chimney, five hundred (500) cubic feet shall be allowed for each person, and proper means shall be provided for admitting a plentiful supply of fresh air near the bottom of the room, and also for permitting the foul air to escape at the upper part of the room; and no room or building shall be occupied as a sleeping-place without being ventilated.

3. Any duly appointed officer shall have free access to all lodging-houses, for the purpose of examining into the cleanliness and ventilation of the same, and to see that the provisions of the abovesaid Act have been properly carried out.

4. No house shall be registered as a common lodging-house until it shall have been inspected by the local officer of health or other duly appointed officer, upon whose report the registration may be granted or refused.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 24, made by the municipal council of Creswick, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 20th day of July, 1863.

BYE-LAW No. 20.—FOR THE PREVENTION OF FIRES.

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Fifty pounds.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the twenty-third day of April, 1855, the district of Sandhurst was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Sandhurst, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act—

1st. That the regular meetings of the finance committee, consisting of all the members of the council, shall be held every Friday.

2nd. That all accounts presented for payment be investigated by the said committee, and if recommended for payment, the same shall be reported to the next meeting of the council.

3rd. That such accounts, after having been ordered to be paid by the council, shall be settled for by the finance committee drawing a cheque on the municipal bankers, schedule A, to which the seal of the council shall be attached and attested by the signature of the chairman of such finance committee meeting, and at least one member, and the town clerk.

4th. That no cheque shall be drawn as aforesaid on any other occasion than the finance committee meetings, unless at a special meeting called expressly for that purpose, and of which due notice shall have been given to all the members.

5th. Any person committing a neglect or breach of this bye-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace having jurisdiction within such municipal district, be liable to and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 43.—A BYE-LAW TO AMEND REGULATIONS OF THE SANDHURST MARKET.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of markets, market-dues, fairs and sales, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act—

That clause one of bye-law No. 11, entitled, "A bye-law for regulating the Sandhurst General Market," enacting that the market shall be open for the sale of marketable commodities from sunrise to sunset, shall be repealed, so far as the same applies to the sale of hay, corn, green fodder, and esculent roots.

That the market shall be open for the sale of hay, corn, green fodder, and esculent roots, every day except Sundays, Christmas-day, and Good Friday, or such other public holidays as may from time to time be proclaimed by the chairman of the municipal council for the time being, during the year from sunrise to two of the clock in the afternoon, after which hour no sales of such commodities shall be transacted therein.

That any person committing a breach of this bye-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing bye-laws Nos. 42 and 43, made by the municipal council of Sandhurst, have been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 20th day of July, 1863.

Two bye-laws have been made by the council and gazetted,—one for "Altering the time of Election of Managers, Town Commons," and one "Imposing a Rate of One shilling in the pound."

Messrs. John Hogan, Edward Barsby, and David Kay, were elected managers of the town commons on 4th March; and on the 22nd April Thomas Martyn was elected in the room of David Kay, resigned.

During the half-year £654 1s. 8d. has been expended on public works in kerbing, channelling, metalling, and repairs to the principal streets and thoroughfares; and the following contracts are now in progress:—
