WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act to amend the Law relating to the Post Office,"* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make, or cause to be made, arrangements with the Postmaster General in England, or with the authorities of any British possession or foreign country, for the following objects, that is to say—

(3.) For the appointment, determining, and collection of postage and rates of postage upon letters, packets, and newspapers—conveyed between the colony aforesaid and such kingdom, possession, or country, and for the exemption of such letters, packets, and newspapers from all or any rates:

(4.) For the division or appropriation and mutual accounting for and payment of money so collected:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that on and after the date hereof the following rates of postage shall be chargeable on letters posted in Victoria for transmission to the United Kingdom *via* Marseilles:—

CERTAIN DIVISIONS OF THE MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT ALTERED.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas it is expedient to alter certain divisions of the mining district of Maryborough: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the divisions of the mining district of Maryborough hereinafter mentioned, and doth define the future limits and boundaries of the said divisions respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

THE AMHERST DIVISION—Commencing at a point on the western bank of the Deep Creek, bearing south-easterly seventy-two chains from the south-eastern angle of Bucknall's pre-emptive section; thence by a line due west to the Bet-bet Creek; thence by the Bet-bet Creek to the Burnbank Creek; thence by the Burnbank Creek to its source; thence by the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount Greenock Creek and a line east to the junction of the Bullarook and Tullaroop Creeks; thence northwards by the Deep Creek to the point of commencement aforesaid.

THE MARYBOROUGH DIVISION—Commencing at a point on the western bank of the Deep Creek, bearing south-easterly seventy-two chains from the south-eastern angle of Bucknall's pre-emptive section; thence by a line due west to the Bet-bet Creek; thence by the Bet-bet Creek to the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon to the Deep Creek; thence southwards by the Deep Creek to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Hanna, and John Watson; these gentlemen accepted the office, and are now actively engaged in carrying out the necessary arrangements with the resident owners of cattle, in conformity with the provisions of *The Land Act*.

The Bill for the amendment of the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway Company's Act of Incorporation, originally introduced by the council, but afterwards taken up by a number of public-spirited ratepayers, on the company obtaining an injunction against the council to prevent the expenditure of municipal funds in its promotion, passed through the Legislative Assembly, but, on the 3rd June last, was thrown out in the Legislative Council on the second reading. And it is worthy of note that the shareholding members of the Upper House (five in number), Mr. Campbell excepted, recorded their votes against the motion for the second reading of the Bill. The object sought to be attained by the passage of the Bill, viz., to compel the company to open up crossings over their line, to facilitate traffic communication with the city, is of such vast importance to this district, that the council are as firmly resolved as ever not to give up or relax their efforts, but by all legal means to endeavor to compel the company to fulfil the just obligations imposed upon them by the 35th clause of their Act, on the good faith of their fulfilment of which they obtained from the Government the grant of the valuable lands they hold.

The annual municipal election took place on the 26th and 27th June, and resulted in the return of Messrs. John Whiteman and Andrew Lyell, in place of Councillors Stead and Balston, and re-election of Councillor Greig.
