THE FRYERS ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Fryers Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Fryers Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Fryers; thence north and east by the western and northern boundaries of the said parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Chewton; thence north by the west boundary of the said parish to the south boundary of the Chewton municipality; thence east and north by the south and east boundary of the said municipality to its north-east angle; thence east to the west boundary of the Metcalfe Road District; thence southerly by the said boundary of the said district to the south-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone; thence south and west by the east and south boundary of the parish of Fryers to the commencing point.—(63.686.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Metcalfe Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Metcalfe Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 23 in the parish of Langley, in the county of Dalhousie; thence due west by the south boundaries of allotments 22 and 17 to the north-west angle of the parish of Edgercombe; thence due west by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Edgercombe and Drummond to the south-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone, in the county of Talbot; thence northwards by the western boundary of the parish of Elphinstone to the north-west angle of the said parish; thence north-westerly by the western boundary of a road which runs through the parish of Faraday, and forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 11, 12, 13, 14, 16, of section 3 of the said parish; thence north-easterly by the southern boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, of section 5, of the parish of Faraday; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 23, 22, 21, 18, section 3, of the parish of Sutton Graze to the centre of the Myrtle Creek; thence north-easterly by the centre of the said creek to its junction with the Coliban River; thence northwards by the centre line of the Coliban River to its junction with the River Campaspe; thence southwards by the centre line of the Campaspe River to its junction with Piper's Creek; thence southward by Piper's

Creek to the commencing point; excepting such portion of the municipality of Taradale as may be within the above-described boundaries.—(63.908.)

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the eighth day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The Rutherglen Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Rutherglen Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the point of junction of the Ovens River with the River Murray; thence easterly by the River Murray to a point due north of the eastern boundary of the parish of Gooramadda; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence west to the eastern boundary of the Wahgunyah Gold Field Common; thence by a direct line south to a point seventeen miles north of the junction of the western boundary of the Stanley Road District with the Ovens River; thence by a line bearing west to the Ovens River; thence northerly by the Ovens River to the commencing point, excluding the municipality of Rutherglen.—(62.1429.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

CARNHAM GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Gold Field Common described, amongst others, under the name of Carnham, in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, is hereby abolished; and the area hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Gold Field Common for Carnham, viz.:—Five thousand four hundred acres, more or less, county of Grenville, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following described limits: Commencing at the south-east angle of the town reserve of Chepstowe; thence S. 64° E. three hundred and fifty-five chains, more or less, to a point due south of the south-west angle of allotment 25, parish of Carnham; thence east ninety chains, more or less; thence N. 60° E. one hundred and eighty-eight chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of the Smythesdale Town Common; thence west about two hundred and forty chains to a point bearing due south from the south-east angle of allotment 16, parish of Carnham; thence N. 64° W. two hundred and thirty-six chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of Russell's pre-emptive right; by the west

boundary of that pre-emptive right north to Baillie's Creek; by that creek south-westerly to its intersection with the east boundary of the township of Chepstowe; and by the last-named boundary south to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.G.4645.)

NORTH AND SOUTH WOORRAGEE FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November, 1861, under the name of the Farmers' Common at South Wooragee, and declared by another Proclamation bearing date the sixteenth day of December, 1862, to be for the use of agriculturists at North Wooragee and South Wooragee, is hereby abolished; and the area hereinafter described shall be and constitute a Farmers' Common for North and South Wooragee aforesaid, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 4, section H, parish of South Wooragee; bounded on the north-west by a line bearing N. 65° 30' E. one hundred and thirty-four chains to the south corner of allotment 1, section L; thence by the western boundary of that allotment, bearing N. 13° 15' W. forty-eight chains sixty-two links; thence by a line bearing N. 25° W. two hundred and eleven chains fifty links to the south-east corner of allotment 1, section H, parish of North Wooragee; thence by the north-eastern boundary of allotments 1 and 2, section H, 4, 5, and 3, section J, 5 and part of 6, section L, to the south-west corner of allotment 2, section L; thence by the southern boundary of said allotment, bearing N. 56° 23' E. forty-six chains to the electric telegraph line of road from Beechworth to Chiltern; on the north-east by the said road to the north-east corner of allotment 4, section E; thence by the north-west boundary of the said allotment bearing S. 56° 23' W. forty-seven chains seventy-six links; thence by the south-western boundaries of allotments 4, 5, 6, and 7, same section, and 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, section D, to the main road from Beechworth to Albany; thence by the said main road and the southern boundaries of allotments 3, 2, and 1, section K, and 6, 5, 3, 2, and 1, section I, parish of South Wooragee; thence by Reedy Creek to the south-west corner of allotment 12, section F; thence by the eastern boundary of allotment 11, same section, bearing north thirty-three chains ninety links to a road one chain wide; thence across the said road one chain to the southern boundary of allotment 4, section H first above-mentioned; thence by the said southern boundary bearing east nine chains fifty links; thence by the eastern boundary of said allotment bearing north twenty-one chains to the commencing point. Containing about 4400 acres.—(63.H.5088.)

WOODSTOCK AND TARNAGULLA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, as situate at Woodstock and Tarnagulla, is hereby increased by adding thereto the area hereafter described, viz.:—Four hundred and sixty-seven acres twenty-two perches, addition to Farmers' Common in lieu of land sold from the common originally proclaimed in the *Gazette* of 8th March, 1861, county unnamed, parish of Woodstock, being allotments 4, 5, and 6, of section 21, in the parish aforesaid.—(63.H.5083.)

 BYE-LAW No. 5.—TO COMPEL OBSERVANCE TO BE PAID TO THE SURVEYED LINE OF STREET IN THE FUTURE ERECTION OF BUILDINGS, ALSO TO PROVIDE FOR THE REMOVAL OF HOUSES AND BUILDINGS NOW STANDING IN ANY WAY ON THE STREETS.

BALLAN ROAD DISTRICT.

RULES TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BALLAN DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

GENERAL Meetings of the board shall be held every alternate Monday at Two o'clock p.m.

2. During the sittings of the board the office shall be open to the public.

3. Special meetings may be summoned by the clerk, upon his receiving a written requisition signed by three members of the board, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meeting. The clerk to give at least three days' notice by letter to each member of the board.

4. The first business at each meeting of the board shall be to read the minutes of the preceding meeting; and when confirmed and signed by the chairman, no further discussion shall be permitted thereon.

5. At all meetings of the board the reading of correspondence, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of all motions.

6. On the presentation of petitions, the only question that may be entertained shall be, that the petitions be received, and, if necessary, be referred to a committee.

7. All petitions addressed to the board must be presented by a member of the board, who shall be responsible for its being in form and respectfully worded.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business the chairman or any two members of the board may think fit, a notice of motion having been given at a former general meeting.

9. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member giving notice, or some member authorized by him, be present. Notices not proceeded with shall be struck off the paper.

10. No bye-law shall be finally passed at the meeting at which it is first proposed, nor until the next general meeting of the board, and such bye-law shall in the meantime remain open for the inspection of the ratepayers during office hours free of charge.

11. Any member shall have power to move for a call of the whole board to rescind any motion previously passed during the official year, and on such motion being carried, the clerk shall give notice thereof to each member not then present.

12. In all matters of order or practice the chairman's ruling shall be final, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

13. Every motion and amendment, whether carried or lost, shall be entered on the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, if any; and, on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded, and likewise the attendance of members at each general or special meeting.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but all amendments shall be put and discussed before the original motion.

15. All questions shall be decided by open voting, except the board shall otherwise determine.

16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under discussion, and the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, before the question of adjournment be again entertained; but if the motion of adjournment be carried, the business then under discussion shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

17. Any member may move that the clerk take down the particular words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

18. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution; and in case the resolution be adopted, the protest, with the name of the member or members protesting, shall be entered on the minutes.

19. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee, shall be a member of such committee.

20. Any member of the board proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman; and no member when speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, and the member calling to order shall be heard thereon, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.

21. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply as the mover of any motion or amendment, and after such explanation or reply the question shall be put to the vote.

22. If more than one member rise at one time to address the board the chairman shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

23. No member addressing the board on any question under discussion shall digress from such question or impute improper motives to any other member.

24. The chairman shall rise when addressing the board in discussion of any question, or to decide a point of order.

25. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some newspaper circulating in the locality, inviting applications for candidates.

26. No member or officer of the board shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the board, or for any contract or work to be performed or done for the board; and in all cases in which surety for the due and faithful performance of any duty, contract, or work is required, the expense of preparing

such security shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

27. All works to be done by the board shall be let by tenders, fourteen days' notice of which shall be given by written or printed notices placed in the most conspicuous position in each division of the district, and by advertisements if thought necessary. All tenders must be enclosed "Tender for ——" as the case may be, and addressed to the chairman of the board, and be opened only at the time of their consideration. The name of the tenderers, with the amount of tender, shall be entered on the minutes of the board.

28. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, directly or indirectly, in any contract let by the board.

29. Payments will be made by cheque, signed by two members of the board and countersigned by the treasurer.

30. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for any assessment, and in the event of its not being paid, either when called for or at the office of the board before the expiration of one month, legal proceedings may be taken for its recovery.

31. The collector shall, at intervals of not more than two days, pay into the hands of the treasurer all moneys received by him on account of the board.

32. The treasurer and collector shall present their accounts at each general meeting of the board.

33. When any tender is accepted the tenderer shall, with two sufficient sureties, enter into a bond, or pay the sum of Ten per cent. on the amount of the contract, at the option of the board, as security for the due and faithful performance of the work contracted for by him; and in either case Seventy per cent. only will be paid on the work done while in progress; the balance, with deposit, if any, will be paid when the work is completed as above.
