## NOTICE.

On and after the 1st of June, 1863, a Floating Lightship will be moored inside the Little Basses Reef; the centre of rocks bearing S. b. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant about one-third of a mile.

It will exhibit a flashing light between the hours of sunset and sunrise, at intervals of one minute and a half.

It is 33 feet above the sea, and from the horizon dips at 7 miles; to a ship within that distance, in fine weather, it does not entirely disappear, and is visible 11 miles from a ship's deck of 18 feet elevation.

SALE OF SPIRITS BY WHOLESALE IN THE SOUTH-  
WESTERN, SOUTH-EASTERN, SOUTHERN, NORTH-  
WESTERN, AND NORTH-EASTERN DISTRICTS.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous Liquors*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all former proclamations of towns and districts situate within the districts hereinafter described under the provisions of the said Act: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do, by this my Proclamation, declare that the whole of the said districts shall be districts wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the abovesaid Act, and that the boundaries of the said districts shall be as follow, viz.—

**SOUTH-WESTERN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the point where the South Australian boundary line intersects the Mosquito Creek; thence easterly by that creek to its head; thence by a line eastward to the source of Power's Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Glenelg; by that river to its source between the Victorian Ranges and the Grampians, near Mount William; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Avoca, near Mount Cole; thence southerly to the source of the Trewalla Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Emu Creek; thence southerly by Mount Emu to the north-eastern corner of the county of Hampden; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to the confluence of Back Creek and Reedy Creek; thence southerly along the western boundary of the county of Hampden to the coast line; thence westerly along the sea coast to the South Australian boundary; thence northerly along that line to the commencing point.

**SOUTH-EASTERN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at Point Nepean; thence along the shores of Port Phillip Bay, Corio Bay, and Hobson's Bay to the mouth of the River Yarra; thence along the western bank of the Yarra to the mouth of the Saltwater River; thence along the western bank of that river to Boyd's Creek; thence along the western bank of that creek to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence easterly along the Great Dividing Range to Forest Hill, on the border of New South Wales; thence by the New South Wales boundary line to Cape Howe; thence along the coast line of Victoria to the commencing point at Point Nepean.

**SOUTHERN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at Point Lonsdale; thence westerly and by the shores of Port Phillip Bay and Hobson's Bay to the mouth of the River Yarra; thence along the western bank of the Yarra to the mouth of the Saltwater River; thence along the western bank of that river to Boyd's Creek; thence along the western bank of that creek to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence westerly along the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Avoca, near Mount Cole; thence southerly to the source of the Trewalla Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Emu Creek; thence southerly by Mount Emu to the north-eastern corner of the county of Hampden; thence along the northern boundary of that county to the confluence of Back Creek and Reedy Creek; thence southerly along the western

boundary of the county of Hampden to the coast line; thence easterly and along the coast line to the commencing point at Point Lonsdale.

**NORTH-WESTERN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the point where the South Australian boundary line intersects the Mosquito Creek; thence easterly by that creek to its head; thence by a line eastward to the source of Power's Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Glenelg; by that river to its source between the Victorian Ranges and the Grampians, near Mount William; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the River Coliban; thence by that river to its confluence with the Campaspe; thence by the River Campaspe to its confluence with the Murray; thence by the River Murray to the northern point of the South Australian boundary line; thence by that line to the commencing point.

**NORTH-EASTERN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the source of the River Coliban; thence easterly along the Great Dividing Range to Forest Hill, on the border of New South Wales; thence along the River Murray to the mouth of the Campaspe; thence by the Campaspe to the mouth of the River Coliban; thence by the Coliban to its source in the Great Dividing Range.

**THE BELFAST ROAD-DISTRICT TOLLS.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as thereinafter mentioned, and such rates and tolls from time to time to vary and alter, and any such Proclamation to revoke; and it is also enacted, that in case any district road board shall deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls, it shall be lawful for such board, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to cause from time to time such and so many toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be erected and built in and upon the roads within their respective road districts, at such places as to each board shall seem fit, and in like manner to cause such toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be removed, or built, or placed on other parts of the said roads, and to direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through such toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses, at a rate not exceeding the rates to be declared as aforesaid, and such rates from time to time to reduce or raise to any amount not exceeding the rates to be so declared: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, were declared the rates of tolls to be collected by the Belfast District Road Board: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said rates: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby declare the rates of tolls hereinafter specified, to be the rates of tolls which may be collected by the said Belfast District Road Board, that is to say:—

## BYE-LAWS.—[4th August, 1863.]

A meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the fourth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that it to say:—

41. It shall be imperative on all race and water-right holders who obtain their supply of water from a creek or river, to place a gauge in their respective races as prescribed in bye-law 24, clause 14, within forty-eight hours after receiving a written notice from any person entitled to receive a supply of water from the same creek or river, in the form of schedule J, and shall continue to run the water through such gauge if required.

42. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in bye-law 19, clause 1, no person shall occupy any area for the purpose therein mentioned on the supposed course of or within seventy-five yards of any known quartz reef or on any known auriferous land; it shall be necessary for any person intending to occupy an area for such purpose to post on a conspicuous place on such area a written notice giving intimation of such intention, and any person objecting shall give notice to the warden within twenty-one days from the date of posting such notice, and if the objections be deemed valid, the occupation of such area shall be disallowed.

Any person having occupied such area, and shall fail to erect machinery thereon within six months from the date of such occupation, shall forfeit all title to such area; and in the event of such machinery being erected on auriferous land, the owner of such machinery shall be compelled to remove the same: Provided always that no such owner shall be compelled to remove the same until compensation for such removal shall have been paid or tendered to him by the miner or miners seeking to enforce such removal.

43. Notwithstanding anything hitherto enacted in these bye-laws, it shall be imperative on any claim or race holder wishing to enjoy the advantages of bye-law 15, to furnish, if required by the warden, evidence on oath as to the necessity for granting permission to suspend working operations, and the warden may refuse to entertain all such applications in the absence of such evidence.

44. Notwithstanding anything previously enacted in these bye-laws, the holders of dry bank, wet bank, and creek claims in the Yackandandah division, shall have their respective claims surveyed by the mining surveyor, who shall be entitled to demand, after furnishing a plan of such survey, the following fee:—

For each claim of four men, 10s.  
For every additional man's ground, 2s. 6d.

A copy of such survey shall be filed by the surveyor at the office of the Mining Registrar, which shall be open for inspection to the public.

45. No person shall be held as in legal possession of any dam or reservoir situated on a frontage lead in the Indigo division, unless the occupation of such dam or reservoir shall have been duly registered with the Mining Registrar, in connection with a particular claim situated in the said division. All right and title to any such dam or reservoir to cease with the right and title to the particular claim registered in connection therewith.

## SCHEDULE J.

I, the undersigned, being entitled to a supply of water from Creek, hereby require you to place a gauge in your race as directed by and in accordance with the provisions of the Beechworth Mining Bye-laws.

BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS OF THE GOLD FIELDS COMMONS, UNDER THE ACT NO. 145 VICTORIA.—[4th August, 1863.]

A meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the fourth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

Repeal of existing bye-law.—That the bye-law for the management of the Gold Fields Common, under the new Land Act, passed at a meeting of this board held on the 26th August, 1862, and gazetted on the 9th September, 1862, be and is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

1. Three managers of each Gold Fields Common situated within this mining district shall be elected by the mining board, in the month of November each year.

2. A person recommended for nomination, in writing, by at least ten holders of miners' rights or business licenses, shall be eligible for election as manager for one or more of such commons, but such candidate must, at the election, be proposed and seconded by members of the board.

3. When such election takes place, if more than three candidates are proposed as managers for any common, a ballot shall be taken of the members of the board present, and those three who obtain the greatest number of votes shall be declared by the chairman duly elected as managers of the common for the ensuing year. The chairman shall not vote unless two or more candidates have an equality of votes, in which case he shall have a casting vote.

4. Notice shall be given by advertisement, at least fourteen days prior to the date of each annual election, in some newspaper circulated in the district, of the intention of the board to elect managers, which notice shall also state the day of election; and all applications and recommendations of candidates must be sent in to the chairman of the mining board previous to such day.

5. In case a sufficient number of written recommendations of candidates are not sent in, or in case some of such candidates are deemed objectionable, the members of the board may then elect such managers as they think desirable.

6. It shall be competent for the board at any time to fill up vacancies that may occur during the course of the year, in the same manner as at annual elections.

7. If any manager of any of the abovementioned commons should wish to resign his office before the expiry of the term for which he has been elected, he shall forward to the chairman of the board his resignation in writing, at least fourteen clear days prior to a meeting of the board, and shall advertise the same twice in some newspaper circulated in the district at least seven clear days prior to such meeting.

8. The board shall in no case accept the resignation of any such manager unless the above conditions shall have been complied with.

The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.
3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.
4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.
9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
