On and after the 1st of June, 1863, a Floating Lightship will be moored inside the Little Basses Reef; the centre of rocks bearing S. b. W. ½ W., distant about one-third of a mile.

It will exhibit a flashing light between the hours of sunset and sunrise, at intervals of one minute and a balf.

It is 33 feet above the sea, and from the horizon dips at 7 miles; to a ship within that distance, in fine weather, it does not entirely disappear, and is visible 11 miles from a ship's deck of 18 feet elevation.

SALE OF SPIRITS BY WHOLESALE IN THE SOUTH-WESTERN, SOUTH-EASTERN, SOUTHERN, NORTH-WESTERN, AND NORTH-EASTERN DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sig Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to amend the laws relative to the rending of fernmented and spirituous Liquors, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all former proclamations of towns and districts situate within the districts hereinafter described under the provisions of the said Act: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do, by this my Proclamation, declare that the whole of the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the aboverecited Act, and that the boundaries of the said districts shall be as follow, viz.:—

SOUTH-WESTERN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the South Australian boundary line intersects the Mosquito Creek; thence easterly by that creek to its head; thence by a line eastward to the source of Power's Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Glenelg; by that river to its source between the Victorian Ranges and the Grampians, near Mount William; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Avoca, near Mount Cole; thence southerly to the source of the Trevalla Creek; thence by that creek to its confluence with the Emu Creek; thence southerly by Mount Emu to the northeastern corner of the county of Hampden; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to the confluence of Back Creek and Reedy Creek; thence southerly along the western boundary of the county of Hampden to the coast line; thence westerly along the sea coast to the South Australian boundary; thence northerly along that line to the commencing point.

It shall be imperative on all race and water-right holders who obtain their supply of water from a creek or river, to place a gauge in their respective races as prescribed in bye-law 24, clause 14, within forty-eight hours after receiving a written notice from any person entitled to receive a supply of water from the same creek or river, in the form of schedule J, and shall continue to run the water through such gauge if required.

42. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in bye-law 19, clause 1, no person shall occupy any area for the purpose therein mentioned on the supposed course of or within seventy-five yards of any known quartz reef or on any known auriferous land; it shall be necessary for any person intending to occupy an area for such purpose to post on a conspicuous place on such area a written notice giving intimation of such intention, and any person objecting shall give notice to the warden within twenty-one days from the date of posting such notice, and if the objections be deemed valid, the occupation of such area shall be disallowed.

Any person having occupied such area, and shall fail to erect machinery thereon within six months from the date of such occupation, shall forfeit all title to such area; and in the event of such machinery being erected on auriferous land, the owner of such machinery shall be compelled to remove the same until compensation for such removal shall have been paid or tendered to him by the miner or miners seeking to enforce such removal.

43. Notwithstanding anything hitherto enacted in these bye-laws, it shall be imperative on any claim or race holder wishing to enjoy the advantages of bye-law 15, to furnish, if required by the warden, evidence on oath as to the necessity for granting permission to suspend working operations, and the warden may refuse to entertain all such applications in these bye-laws, the holders of dry bank, wet hank, and cr

warden may refuse to entertain all such applications in the absence of such evidence.

44. Notwithstanding anything previously enacted in these bye-laws, the holders of dry bank, wet bank, and creek claims in the Yackandandah division, shall have their respective claims surveyed by the mining surveyor, who shall be entitled to demand, after furnishing a plan of such survey, the following fee:—

For each claim of four men, 10s. For every additional man's ground, 2s. 6d.

Repeal of existing bye-law.—That the bye-law for the management of the Gold Fields Common, under the new Land Act, passed at a meeting of this board held on the 20th August, 1862, and gazetted on the 9th September, 1862, be and is hereby annulled and repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

1. Three managers of each Gold Fields Common situated within this mining district shall be elected by the mining board, in the month of November each year.

2. A person recommended for nomination, in writing, by at least ten holders of miners' rights or business licenses, shall be eligible for election as manager for one or more of such commons, but such candidate must, at the election, be proposed and seconded by members of the board.

3. When such election takes place, if more than three candidates are proposed as managers for any common, a ballot shall be taken of the members of the board present, and those three who obtain the greatest number of votes shall be declared by the chairman duly elected as managers of the common for the casuing year. The chairman shall not vote unless two or more caudidates have an equality of votes, in which case he shall have a casting vote.

4. Notice shall be given by advertisement, at least fourteen days prior to the date of each annual election, in some newspaper circulated in the district, of the intention of the board to elect managers, which notice shall also state the day of election; and all applications and recommendations of candidates must be sent in to the chairman of the mining board previous to such day.

5. In case a sufficient number of written recommendations of candidates are not sent in, or in case some of such candidates are deemed objectionable, the members of the board may then elect such managers as they think desirable.

6. It shall be competent for the board at any time to fill up vacancies that may occur during the course of the year, in the same manner as at annual elections.

7. If any manager of any of the abovementioned commons should wish to resign his office before the expiry of the term for which he has been elected, he shall forward to the chairman of the board his resignation in writing, at least fourteen clear days prior to a meeting of the board, and shall advertise the same twice in some newspaper circulated in the district at least seven clear days prior to a meeting of the board, and shall advertise the same twice in some newspaper circulated in the district at least seven clear days prior to such meeting.
