WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The Strathfieldsaye Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Strathfieldsaye Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the Said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district, and from time to time revoke any such Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifteenth day of June, in the present year, the portion of the colony therein described was declared to be a road district under the designation of "The Donnybrook, Wallan-wallan, and Bylands Road District." And whereas it is expedient to alter such district and to change the designation thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned; and, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned; and, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and do define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

WHEREAB by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the first day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The Marong Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Marong Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commening at a point on the southern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst where it is intersected by the western boundary of the railway from Melbourne to Sandhurst; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundary of the said municipality to the western boundary of the Long Gully annexation to the said municipality; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundary

of the said annexation to the northern boundary of the said municipality; thence by the said northern boundary to the Bendigo Creek; thence northerly by the Bendigo Creek and the western boundary of the Campaspe Road District to the northewest angle of the said road district; thence by a line due west to the centre of the Loddon River; thence southerly by the centre of the Loddon River to a point opposite the south boundary of the parish of Laanacoorie; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Laanacoorie and Shelbourne to the western boundary of the parish of Ravenswood; thence south to the south-west angle of block 2, parish of Ravenswood; thence east by a direct line to the western boundary of the railway from Melbourne to Sandhurst; thence northerly by the said western boundary to the commencing point. Excluding the municipality of Eaglehawk.—(62.2377.)

WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act. Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BULLA TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands

Bulla Town Common.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundary of the town of Bulla shall be and are hereby proclaimed the Town Common for all householders of the town of Bulla.-(63.H.7026.)

CARLERUHE TOWN COMMON.—The Common for the house-holders of the town of Carlsruhe (described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861) is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundary of the town of Carlsruhe.— (63.G.6982.)
