SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors and of refreshments in certain districts*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district, and from time to time to vary, alter, and revoke such boundaries: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and proclaim that the part or portion of Victoria hereinafter mentioned shall be and constitute a Special Licensing District, subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

So much of the country (the city of Melbourne excepted) as extends ten miles on each side of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway, not at present included in a Special Licensing District.

THE HAMPDEN AND HEYTESBURY ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the thirteenth day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the boundaries of "The Hampden and Heytesbury Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Hampden and Heytesbury Road District shall be, the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the Emu Creek due north of the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the centre line of said creek, bearing westerly and southerly to the north-east angle of the parish of Glenormiston; thence west by the north boundary of said parish to its north-west angle; thence south by the west boundary of said parish to the south-west angle of the said parish; thence east by the

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southern boundary of the said parish to the centre of a one-chain road forming the eastern boundary of allotments 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, section IV., and of allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, section IX., in the parish of Terang; thence south-easterly by the centre of said road (being the south boundary of allotment 1, section XVII., and of allotments 1, 2, section XVIII., of said parish), to a point in the western boundary of said parish; thence southerly by the western boundary of said parish to a point in the centre of Mount Emu Creek; thence easterly by the centre of said creek to the south-east angle of the parish of Terang; thence by a line due south to the centre of Curdie's Creek; thence by the centre line of said creek to the sea-coast; thence by the coast line south-easterly to a point in the centre of the Gellibrand River; thence by the centre line of said river, and by the east boundary of the county of Heytesbury, to the south-west angle of section XV., in the parish of Heytesbury, to the south-east of Polwarth; thence northerly by the east coast of the Tirrangower Morass, and by the centre line of the Pirron Yaloak, county of Polwarth, to the Lake Corangamite; thence by the western and northern shores of the Lake Corangamite to the inlet of the Salt Lagoon which forms part of the source of the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence easterly by the said inlet and the western and eastern shores of the said lagoon to the source of the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence north-westerly by the said creek to a point opposite the south boundary of the parish of South Naringhill; thence west to and by the said south boundary to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the said boundary to the commencing point.—(63,985.)

STEIGLITZ GOLD FIELD COMMON ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

STEIGLITZ GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Gold Field Common described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, under the designation of Steiglitz, and enlarged by another Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of August, 1861, is hereby altered; and the land hereafter described shall be and constitute the said Steiglitz Gold Field Common, viz.:—Nine thousand three hundred and ninety acres, more or less, being the unappropriated land within the following described boundaries—County of Grant:

Commencing at a point bearing N. 63° 3' W. two hundred and fourteen chains two links from the north-west angle of Griffin's pre-emptive right; thence north about one mile; thence east about one mile and a half; thence north about two miles; thence west about one mile and a half; thence north about one mile; thence west about three miles; thence south about four miles; thence east about three miles to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.H.5987.)

THE WARRNAMBOOL ROAD-DISTRICT TOLLS.*

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as thereafter mentioned, and such rates and tolls from time to time to vary and alter, and any such Proclamation to revoke; and it is also enacted, that in case any district road board shall deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls, it shall be lawful for such board, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to cause from time to time such and so many toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be erected and built in and upon the roads within their respective road districts at such places as to each board shall seem fit, and in like manner to cause such toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be removed, or built, or placed on other parts of the said roads, and to direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through such toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses, at a rate not exceeding the rates to be declared as aforesaid, and such rates from time to time to reduce or raise to any amount not exceeding the rates to be so declared: And whereas the Warrnambool District Road Board deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls within their district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the rates of tolls hereinafter specified, to be the rates of tolls which may be collected by the said Warrnambool District Road Board, that is to say:—

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be oaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
