ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

HER Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 15th day of June, 1863, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 26th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz. :—

No. 163. An Act for the better enabling the Assignees of the Insolvent Estate of the Provident Institute of Victoria to collect and administer the same for the benefit of the Creditors of such Company and to vest the said estate in the said Assignees with power to sell and give discharges for monies received by them and for other purposes the short title of which is "*The Provident Institute Estate Act.*" [Assented to 19th February, 1863.]

No. 164. An Act to suspend the operation of certain Enactments relating to Registration of Parliamentary Electors. [Assented to 19th February, 1863.]

THE GENERAL SESSIONS FOR AVOCA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof shall appoint; and that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter or vary as the said Lieutenant Governor shall think fit. Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that a Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden at the place and in and for the district hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :—

A Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden at Avoca, and shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Avoca, the boundaries whereof shall be as follows, viz. :— Commencing on the River Avoca, at a point south-easterly about one mile and a half from Deboobetie Hill; thence west to the north shore of Buloke Swamp; thence by the eastern margin of that swamp to the mouth of the Avon River; thence by that river to its junction with the Richardson River; thence by that river to its junction with the Richardson Creek; thence by that creek to the south-western angle of the township of Navarre; thence by the southern boundary of that township and a line east to the dividing range, separating the waters flowing to the Avoca and Wimmera Rivers; thence southwards by that dividing range and the Pyrenee Range to the Main Dividing Range, and by the lastnamed dividing range easterly to the source of Branch Creek; thence by that creek to its

junction with McNeill's Creek; thence by McNeill's Creek to the south-eastern angle of Joyce's pre-emptive right; thence by the eastern boundary to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a line west to the Avoca River at Natte Yaloak; and thence by that river northerly to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SALE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, shall apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Sale.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO MORTLAKE ROAD DISTRICT AND TOWNSHIP.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Mortlake Road District, including the township of Mortlake, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

from the local inspector of nuisances to such owner or occupier to abate the same.

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is provided that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws, *inter alia*, for the prevention and extinguishing of fires: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Sandridge—

1. That no person or persons shall light or have any fire burning in any street, lane, road, or public place, or within or upon any yard or premises, whether fenced or enclosed or not, for any purpose, except such fire be made in a properly constructed fire-place or chimney.

2. That no person or persons shall allow any chimney connected with any dwelling-house, shop, office, or other building whatsoever, of which such person or persons shall be the owner, tenant, or occupant, to become foul, so that the soot therein take fire and flames issue from the top of such chimney.

3. Any person or persons guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

BYE-LAW No. 22.—FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, AND THE SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES CAUSED BY THE OVERFLOW OR SOAKAGE OF WATER-CLOSETS AND CESSPOOLS.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Sandridge—

1. That the owner or occupier of any house or premises shall not allow the contents of any water-closet, privy, or cesspool, to overflow or soak therefrom, so as to be a nuisance or injurious to the health of the inhabitants, after written notice from the local inspector of nuisances to such owner or occupier to abate the same.

2. Any person or persons guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 21 and 22, made by the municipal council of Sandridge, have been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 31st day of August, 1863.

The mean number of deaths in the month during four years was 254, the mean temperature 48.6°, and the mean atmospheric pressure 29.921 inches. The mortality of the month under review was thus considerably below the average. The mean temperature, however, was not only higher than the average, but higher than it was in the same month during either of the four years named.

The proportions of males and females dying during the month were respectively 63 and 37 per cent. Those of persons above and under five years of age were 55 and 45 per cent. respectively. It will be perceived that the deaths of persons at the older period exceeded those at the younger, an event which also occurred in the month of June, but which until then had not taken place in any month since that of October in the previous year.

The largest number of deaths occurring on any one day, according to the returns, was 14 on the 21st; after that 12 on the 2nd. Only one death was recorded as taking place on the 27th, and no more than three deaths on the 5th.

A male aged 82 died during the month of old age. This was the only case which occurred of a death of a person at a more advanced age than 75 years.

Twelve deaths from external causes occurred during the month, in the following manner:—A man about 35 years of age was drowned in the Yarra, and a painter aged 63 in Hobson's Bay; a plasterer aged 42 died of a fall from a scaffold, a male aged 33 of compound fracture of the leg, and a male child aged 4 of a fractured skull. A female aged 45, another aged 44, a boy aged 6, and a girl aged 3, died of burus. A male aged 28 died in the Yarra Bend Asylum of suffocation, and an infant aged 14 weeks was suffocated accidentally by its mother. A hairdresser aged 40 died at Emerald Hill of external injuries (no particulars given).

Fifty-one deaths, or about 23 per cent. of the whole number, occurred in public institutions, as follows:—Melbourne Hospital, 35; Benevolent Asylum, 8; Immigrants' Home, 1; Lying-in Hospital, 1; Melbourne Gaol, 1; Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. 8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
