ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.,

HER Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 15th day of June, 1863, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 26th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:—

No. 163. An Act for the better enabling the Assignees of the Insolvent Estate of the Provident Institute of Victoria to collect and administer the same for the benefit of the Creditors of such Company and to vest the said estate in the said Assignees with power to sell and give discharges for monies received by them and for other purposes the short title of which is "The Provident Institute Estate Act." [Assented to 19th February, 1863.]

No. 164. An Act to suspend the operation of certain Enactments relating to Registration of Parliamentary Electors.

PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sire Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof shall appoint; and that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, of the said colony, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden, and such limit's, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter or vary as the said Lieutenant Governor shall think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that a Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden at the place and in and for the district hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (number 13), intituled, An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, shall apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Sale.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO MORTLAKE ROAD DISTRICT AND TOWNSHIP.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIB HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered Y, VI, VII, VIII, IX, and X, in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX). Shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Mortlake Road District, including the township of Mortlake, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, and X.

BYE-LAW NO. 35.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, AND THE SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES CAUSED BY THE OVERFLOW OF SOAKAGE OF WATER-CLOSETS AND CESSPOOLS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the eighteeuth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make by-laws for the preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances: Bo it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Balharat, that the owner or occupier of any house or premises shall not allow the contents of any water-closet, privy, or cesspool to overflow or soak thereform, so as to be a nuisance or injurious to the health of the inhabitants, after written notice from the local inspector of nuisances to such owner or occupier to abate the same

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health, the suppression of nuisances, and the restraining of noisone or offensive trades: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Ballaarat, that if at any time the trade or business of any person or persons, being the owner or occupier of any candle-house, melting-place, or soap-house, or any slaughter-house, or any building or place for boiling offal or blood, or for boiling, burning, or crushing bones, or any manufactory, building, or place used for any trade, business, process, or manufacture causing effluvia, shall be carried on so as to be a nuisance, or place used for any trade, business, process, or manufacture cause any effluvia injurious to the health of the inhabitants of the neighborhood, such person or persons shall forthwith, after receiving written notice from the local inspector of nuisances, use the best practicable means for abating such nuisance, or preventing or counteracting such effluvia.

Any person guilty of any breach or neglect of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, a penalty or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BYE-LAW NO. 41.—A BYE-LAW FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR 1863.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, initially A. Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to assess all property in houses or lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to and in the occupation of Her Majesty) according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, that all the several properties within the limits of the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year 1963, according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll, confirmed by the said municipal council, and amounting after all appeals have been heard to a total sum of One hundred and nine thousand eight hundred and sixteen

pounds; and also that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said properties for the year 1863, to be due and payable on the thirtieth day of August in the present year.

BYE-LAW No. 21.—For the prevention of Accidents by Fie.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is provided that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws, inter alia, for the prevention and extinguishing of fires: Be' it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Sandridge—

1. That no person or persons shall light or have any fire burning in any street, lane, road, or public place, or within or upon any yard or premises, whether fenced or enclosed or not, for any purpose, except such fire be made in a properly constructed fire-place or chimney.

2. That no person or persons shall allow any chimney connected with any dwelling-house, shop, office, or other building whatsoever, of which such person or persons shall be the owner, tenant, or occupant, to become foul, so that the soot therein take fire and flames issue from the top of such chimney.

3. Any person or persons guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

BYE-LAW NO. 22.—FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, AND THE SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES CAUSED BY THE OVERFLOW OR SOAKAGE OF WATER-CLOSETS AND CESSFOOLS.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Sandridge—

1. That the owner or occupier of any house or premises shall not allow the contents of any water-closet, privy, or cesspool, to overflow or soak therefrom, so as to be a nuisance or injurious to the health of the inhabitants, after written notice from the local inspector of nuisances to such owner or occupier to abate the same.

2. Any person or persons guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 21 and 22, made by the municipal council of Sandridge, have been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 31st day of August, 1863.

Twelve deaths from external causes occurred during the month, in the following manner:—A man about 35 years of age was drowned in the Yarra, and a painter aged 63 in Hobson's Bay; a plasterer aged 42 died of a fall from a scaffold, a male aged 33 of compound fracture of the leg, and a male child aged 4 of a fractured skull. A female aged 45, another aged 44, a boy aged 6, and a girl aged 3, died of burns. A male aged 28 died in the Yarra Bend Asylum of suffocation, and an infant aged 14 weeks was suffocated accidentally by its mother. A hairdresser aged 40 died at Emerald Hill of external injuries (no particulars given).

Fifty-one deaths, or about 23 per cent, of the whole number, occurred in public institutions, as follows:—Melbourne Hospital, 15; Melbourne Gaol, 1; Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5.
