WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a county court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, at the place and within the interval following, that is to say :-

At St. Arnaud, once at least in every three calendar months.
And the Honorable Archibald Michie, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c. :-

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say :-

CARLSRUHE TOWN COMMON.—The Common for the town of Carlsruhe (described, amongst others, in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of February, 1861, and the tenth day of August, 1863) is hereby increased by adding thereto the land hereafter described, viz. :- Two hundred and seventy-one acres, being the portion of land known as the Police Paddock at Carlsruhe: Commencing at the south-west angle of portion 1, Carlsruhe; thence east sixty chains; thence by the main road to Melbourne bearing S. 40° E. fifty-one chains twenty-links; thence west ninety-two chains twenty links to the Campaspe River; and by that river northerly to the point of commencement.—(63.3242.)

CASTLEMAINE GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Gold Field Common described, amongst others, under the designation of Castlemaine, in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, is hereby abolished; and the area hereafter described shall be and constitute Castlemaine Gold Field Common, viz. :- Twenty-three thousand three hundred acres, more or less, county of Talbot and county unnamed, being the map-proclaimed Crown lands within the following area (in lieu of the area proclaimed in the *Government Gazette* dated 6th February, 1861): Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Chewton; thence north to the north-east angle thereof; thence west to the north-east angle of the parish of Castlemaine; thence west along the north boundary thereof to a point bearing south of the south-west angle of the town reserve of Harcourt; thence north to the south-west angle of said town reserve; thence west to a point bearing south from the south-west angle of Barker's pre-emptive section; thence north to the south-west angle of said section; thence west three miles sixty chains; thence south to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 14, section 5, parish of Walmer; thence east eighty chains; thence south to a point on the north boundary of the parish of Muckleford, bearing west from the north-west angle of the parish of Castlemaine; thence east to said north-west angle of Castlemaine; thence south by the west boundary of said parish to its south-west angle; thence west by part of the north boundary of the parish of Guildford to the north-west angle of that parish; thence south to the south-east angle of allotment 2, section 5, parish of Strangways; thence easterly to the north-west angle of Strathloddon pre-emptive right; again east by the north boundary thereof to Campbell's Creek; by that creek northerly till it intersects the south boundary of the parish of Castlemaine; thence east by that boundary and the south boundary

of the parish of Chewton to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.H.7012.)

STRATHFIELDSAYE AND SEDGWICK FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common described, amongst others, under the designation of Strathfieldsaye and Sedgwick, in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of March, 1861, and the tenth day of August, 1863, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the land hereafter described, viz.:—Three hundred and eighty-five acres, more or less: Commencing at a point on the west side of allotment 4, section 20, parish of Sedgwick, said point bearing east about one chain from the north-east angle of allotment 5, section 21; thence east about one hundred and eighty-five chains to the east boundary of allotment 4, section 16; thence southerly to the south-east angle of last-named allotment; thence west by a road (being the northern boundary of parish of Sutton Grange) to the south-west angle of allotment 4, section 20, parish of Sedgwick; thence northerly to the point of commencement: also allotment 5, section 21, containing fifty-eight acres one rood four perches, and allotment 3 of section 22, containing one hundred and twenty-one acres two roods twenty-three perches. Total area approximately, five hundred and sixty-four acres three roods twenty-seven perches, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the above-described area, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.3211.)

MUNICIPALITY OF AMHERST.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, THE RESTRAINING OF NOISOME OR OFFENSIVE TRADES, AND THE PREVENTION OF NUISANCES ARISING THEREFROM.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health, the suppression of nuisances, and the restraining of noisome or offensive trades: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Amherst, that if at any time the trade or business of any person or persons, being the owner or occupier of any candle-house, melting-house, melting-place, or soap-house, or any slaughter-house, or any building or place for boiling offal or blood, or for boiling, burning, or crushing bones, or any manufactory, building, or place used for any trade, business, process, or manufacture causing effluvia, shall be carried on so as to be a nuisance, or cause any effluvia injurious to the health of the inhabitants of the neighborhood, such person or persons shall forthwith, after receiving written notice from the local inspector of nuisances, use the best practicable means for abating such nuisance, or preventing or counteracting such effluvia.

Any person guilty of any breach or neglect of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 24, made by the municipal council of Amherst, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 7th day of September, 1863.

MUNICIPALITY OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.
BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS FOR THE MUNICIPAL COMMON OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON.

WHEREAS by the Act of His Excellency and Parliament of Victoria, 25 Victoria No. 145, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Sale and Occupation of Crown Lands*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the municipal council of any municipal district within or in the vicinity of which any town common within the meaning of the Act of Parliament of Victoria No. 117 is situated, or any municipal common, shall elect annually, in such manner as they may by bye-law prescribe, three persons to be managers of such common: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Essendon and Flemington, by and with the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council:—

1. That the election of three persons to be managers of the Essendon and Flemington Municipal Common shall be held annually at the first ordinary meeting of the said council, in the month of September in each year.

2. That at the annual meeting, or any subsequent meeting, for the election of a manager or managers for the said common, any member of the municipal council may nominate, in writing, the names of not more than three persons to be managers thereof, with the consent of the person or persons so nominated; and in case there shall be more persons nominated than vacancies, a ballot shall be taken of the chairman and members present at such meeting of the council; and at the conclusion of the said

ballot, if there shall be an equality of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote, and the person or persons elected shall be declared to be the managers or a manager, as the case may be, of the Essendon and Flemington Municipal Common, under the provisions of the Act aforesaid.

3. That should any manager be removed by order of the municipal council of Essendon and Flemington, a meeting for the election of a successor to the manager so removed shall be held within twenty-one days from the date of such removal; the day for holding such meeting to be appointed at the regular meeting of the council which shall be held next after the date of the removal of a manager aforesaid, such meeting to be held at the same hour and place, and conducted in the same manner as hereinbefore provided.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 8, made by the municipal council of Essendon and Flemington, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 7th day of September, 1863.

MUNICIPALITY OF MOONAMBEL.

BYE-LAW No. 7.—FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, THE RESTRAINING OF NOISOME OR OFFENSIVE TRADES, AND THE PREVENTION OF NUISANCES ARISING THEREFROM.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health, the suppression of nuisances, and the restraining of noisome or offensive trades: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Moonambel, that if at any time the trade or business of any person or persons, being the owner or occupier of any candle-house, melting-house, melting-place, or soap-house, or any slaughter-house, or any building or place for boiling offal or blood, or for boiling, burning, or crushing bones, or any manufactory, building, or place used for any trade, business, process, or manufacture causing effluvia, shall be carried on so as to be a nuisance, or cause any effluvia injurious to the health of the inhabitants of the neighborhood, such person or persons shall forthwith, after receiving written notice from the local inspector of nuisances, use the best practicable means for abating such nuisance, or preventing or counteracting such effluvia.

Any person guilty of any breach or neglect of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a penalty of not exceeding Fifty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 7, made by the municipal council of Moonambel, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 7th day of September, 1863.

CONDITIONS.

- The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.
- The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.
- The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.
- The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

- When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

RETIREMENT AND ELECTION.

On the 19th January, Councillor Henry Wilson's seat was declared vacant from non-attendance; and on the 2nd April, James Thomas was elected a member of the council in his place.

At the end of this half-year (being the close of the seventh municipal year) the chairman, Thomas de Courcy Meade, and Councillors Brown and Sugden, retired by rotation. The first-named gentleman withdrew, and the two latter were nominated for re-election. The election resulted in the re-election of Councillor John Gilmour Brown, and the election of Geo. Stewart and F. W. C. Beavan in the places of Councillors Meade and Sugden. At the first night of meeting of council after the annual election there was not a quorum present, and, accordingly, no business was transacted.

APPLICATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT.

Application to the Commissioner of Roads and Bridges, for the construction of two culverts in Sydney street, at the intersection of Bourke and Union streets.—Not granted. Also to have the old Kilmore Inn removed off the main road.—Not yet complied with. Application to the Chief Secretary, to sanction bye-law No. 34.—Returned for amendment. Also for the use of a room to be used as a town clerk's office, in the proposed new Court House.—No reply. Application to the Postmaster General, to have the telegraph posts removed off the footpath.—Granted.

The half-yearly report of the Local Board of Health (the municipal council), in reply to the questions of the central board, have been forwarded to Melbourne.

APPOINTMENTS.

On the 23rd March, D. N. Nicolson, M.D., was appointed health officer of the local board of health. On the 8th June, Mounted Constable Comyn (with the permission of Superintendent Chambers), was appointed inspector of nuisances in the room of Mounted Constable O'Donnell, removed from the district.

PUBLIC WORKS.

1. Pitching, metalling, kerbing, and channelling Mitchell street, from Melbourne to Sydney streets.
2. Kerbing, channelling, and forming Mitchell street, from Sydney street to the creek.
3. Stone wall and filling, in Andrew street, near O'Dea's mill.
4. Rough stone channel in Union street, and a portion of the footpath made.
5. Repairs to Union street bridge; additional repairs are now contracted for this bridge, which will be completed in a few weeks.
6. Forming footpath in Albert street north.
7. Kerbing and channelling Foot street, from Powlett street to the creek; also forming the road and making the footpath. Some additional repairs are about being effected on this work.
8. A substantial footbridge has been erected across the creek in Bourke street; the old bridge having been carried away by the recent floods, which did considerable damage to other works abutting on the creek.
9. Several small sums have been expended in repairs and in removing nuisance.
10. The usual contract for cleaning the channels and lighting street lamps.

LIGHTING.

The main street and principal cross streets are now lighted with kerosene. The project has answered admirably, and is a great improvement to the town.

BOTANIC GARDENS.

A neat cottage has been erected, also substantial gates at the main entrance. A portion of the gardens are rented at Ten pounds per annum. No addition has been made to the nursery, but it is contemplated to have the ground permanently laid out.

WATER WORKS.

The laying of the water pipes from the Reservoir to Clarke street (north end of the municipality) is now completed; few have availed themselves of having it laid on their premises, it not being considered, yet, sufficiently pure for general purposes. The embankment at the reservoir has been sufficiently tested, and is now considered perfectly secure. The banks have also been sown with grass seeds. No water rates have yet been fixed.
