EXPORTATION OF WARLIKE STORES FROM SOUTH AUSTRALIA RESTRICTED.

THE accompanying Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of South Australia, restricting the Exportation of Warlike Stores from that Province, is published for general information.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA, } Proclamation by SIR DOMINICK DALY,
to wit. } Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Province of
(L.S.) } South Australia and the Dependencies thereof,
D. DALY, } and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the exportation of Warlike Stores from this Province should be prohibited until further notice: Now therefore I, the Governor-in-Chief, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the exportation from any port or place in the province of South Australia, of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, military and naval stores, or any article which may be converted to a military or naval purpose, except in manner and subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned or referred to, that is to say: From and after the date hereof, arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or other warlike stores shall and may be exported only under license in writing first obtained for that purpose under the hand of the Governor-in-Chief, and only at the place, in the manner, and subject to the conditions (if any) specified in such license: Provided always, that nothing in this Proclamation shall be construed to apply to the exportation of supplies for the use of Her Majesty's land and sea forces.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the said Province, at Adelaide, this twenty-seventh day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

CARNGHAM AND BEAUFORT ROAD DISTRICT.

RULES to regulate the proceedings of the Carngham and Beaufort District Road Board (passed by the board 17th June, A.D. 1863, gazetted 18th September, 1863).

1. *Business conducted with open doors.*—The business of the board shall be conducted with open doors, except on special occasions, when any one member may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the board whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

2. *Quorum.*—The board shall commence business so soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiry of half an hour from the time specified there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the board at the meeting.

3. *Three members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the board, and if at any day named for a meeting such number shall not be present at the hour at which the business ought to be commenced such fact, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute-book by the secretary.*

4. *Minutes of former meetings.*—The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

5. *Correspondence, &c., to have precedence.*—At all meetings of the board (except otherwise provided by law), the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

6. *Presentation of petitions.*—On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given as hereinafter provided, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

7. *Reports not to be adopted on presentation.*—No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received *pro forma*, and if ordered by the board, printed for distribution among the members.

8. *Recommendation in report.*—If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the board has been taken separately on each.

9. *Order of the day.*—The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration; any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

10. *Motion not to be proceeded with unless mover present.*—No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on; notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

11. *Bye-laws.*—No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the

inspection of any of the ratepapers in the office of the board, free of charge.

12. *No motion entertained unless draft be submitted.*—No motion in which it is proposed to take action on any petition, or in which it is proposed to adopt any address, bye-law, or standing order, shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, bye-law, or standing order, and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon, and the mover of every such proposition shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

13. *Referring of motion.*—The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

14. *Motions to be written and signed.*—Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and obtain signatures of the mover and the seconder.

15. *Call of board.*—It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each member of the board, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question, or any amendment thereof, shall be dealt with as the board may determine, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the board.

16. *Names of members voting to be entered in minutes.*—On any motion being put from the chair the secretary shall enter in the minute book the names of the members who voted thereon, and specify whether such members voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

17. *Reports how to be written.*—All reports sent in to the board by any member or members thereof, or any officer of the board, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left so that they can be properly bound together.

18. *Motion or amendment.*—Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

19. *Chairman to decide who speaks first.*—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

20. *No member to speak twice.*—No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed, and the chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

21. *The chairman to decide point of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final *pro hac vice* in each case.

22. *Chairman addressing board.*—The chairman shall stand up when addressing the board in discussion of any question.

23. *Particular words to be taken down.*—Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

24. *Production of documents.*—Any member may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

25. *Discussion of amendments.*—One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but not more.

26. *Adoption of amendment.*—Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

27. *Duty of chairman in voting.*—The chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion, from the show of hands, as to which party has the majority.

28. *Voting.*—The board shall vote in all cases by show of hands.

29. *Discussion on motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undispensed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

30. *Member may protest.*—Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case, be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

31. *Rescinding motion.*—No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board shall be entertained during the same year unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose, and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board shall again be entertained after the expiration of six months.

32. *Election of officers.*—No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

33. *Cases of emergency.*—Any of the foregoing bye-laws may be suspended in cases of emergency where the board considers it necessary to do so, there being not more than one member absent at such board meeting.

At a meeting of the Carnham and Beaufort District Road Board, held at the Camp Hotel, Beaufort, within the said district, on the seventeenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the foregoing bye-law was adopted, and was ordered to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for his approval, in accordance with the provisions of Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, section 4.

RETIREMENT AND ELECTION.

On the 19th January, Councillor Henry Wilson's seat was declared vacant from non-attendance; and on the 2nd April, James Thomas was elected a member of the council in his place.

At the end of this half-year (being the close of the seventh municipal year) the chairman, Thomas de Courcy Meade, and Councillors Brown and Sugden, retired by rotation. The first-named gentleman withdrew, and the two latter were nominated for re-election. The election resulted in the re-election of Councillor John Gilmour Brown, and the election of Geo. Stewart and F. W. C. Beavan in the places of Councillors Meade and Sugden. At the first night of meeting of council after the annual election there was not a quorum present, and, accordingly, no business was transacted.

APPLICATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT.

Application to the Commissioner of Roads and Bridges, for the construction of two culverts in Sydney street, at the intersection of Bourke and Union streets.—Not granted. Also to have the old Kilmore Inn removed off the main road.—Not yet complied with. Application to the Chief Secretary, to sanction bye-law No. 34.—Returned for amendment. Also for the use of a room to be used as a town clerk's office, in the proposed new Court House.—No reply. Application to the Postmaster General, to have the telegraph posts removed off the footpath.—Granted.

The half-yearly report of the Local Board of Health (the municipal council), in reply to the questions of the central board, have been forwarded to Melbourne.

APPOINTMENTS.

On the 23rd March, D. N. Nicolson, M.D., was appointed health officer of the local board of health. On the 8th June, Mounted Constable Comyn (with the permission of Superintendent Chambers), was appointed inspector of nuisances in the room of Mounted Constable O'Donnell, removed from the district.

PUBLIC WORKS.

1. Pitching, metalling, kerbing, and channelling Mitchell street, from Melbourne to Sydney streets.
2. Kerbing, channelling, and forming Mitchell street, from Sydney street to the creek.
3. Stone wall and filling, in Andrew street, near O'Dea's mill.
4. Rough stone channel in Union street, and a portion of the footpath made.
5. Repairs to Union street bridge; additional repairs are now contracted for this bridge, which will be completed in a few weeks.
6. Forming footpath in Albert street north.
7. Kerbing and channelling Foot street, from Powlett street to the creek; also forming the road and making the footpath. Some additional repairs are about being effected on this work.
8. A substantial footbridge has been erected across the creek in Bourke street; the old bridge having been carried away by the recent floods, which did considerable damage to other works abutting on the creek.
9. Several small sums have been expended in repairs and in removing nuisance.
10. The usual contract for cleaning the channels and lighting street lamps.

LIGHTING.

The main street and principal cross streets are now lighted with kerosene. The project has answered admirably, and is a great improvement to the town.

BOTANIC GARDENS.

A neat cottage has been erected, also substantial gates at the main entrance. A portion of the gardens are rented at Ten pounds per annum. No addition has been made to the nursery, but it is contemplated to have the ground permanently laid out.

WATER WORKS.

The laying of the water pipes from the Reservoir to Clarke street (north end of the municipality) is now completed; few have availed themselves of having it laid on their premises, it not being considered, yet, sufficiently pure for general purposes. The embankment at the reservoir has been sufficiently tested, and is now considered perfectly secure. The banks have also been sown with grass seeds. No water rates have yet been fixed.
