WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Fictoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the times at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter or vary as the said Governor shall think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under my hand and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eleventh day of January instant, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding the next Court of General Sessions for the districts of Palmerston and Sale: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the times appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions at Palmerston and Sale, in manner following, viz.:—

#### SANDHURST MINING DISTRICT.

THE 23RD CLAUSE OF THE GENERAL BYE-LAW OF THE SANDHURST MINING BOARD, 25TH JUNE, 1863, REPEALED. [21st January, 1864.]

A Ta meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the 21st day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

The 23rd clause of the General Bye-law, passed by the Sandhurst Mining Board on 5th January, 1863, and gazetted 20th January, 1863, is hereby repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

stituted in lieu thereof.

Claims to be registered.—Every owner or part owner of a quartz claim held by "Miner's Right," shall cause his or their interest in the same to be registered in a book to be kept for that purpose by the mining registrar; and no miner shall be deemed to be legally in possession of any quartz claim, or share in any such claim, until such quartz claim or share, as aforesuid, has been so registered; and no transfer made of any such claim, by transferors, though in legal possession, shall be deemed a legal transfer unless such transfer has been duly registered by the registrar of the division in which the claim sought to be transferred is situated; and when any quartz claim, or share in any such claim, has been transferred, and the transfer duly registered, the registrar shall certify the same by signing his name across the face of the transfer ticket, and affixing the day and date; and for the duties named in this clause the registrar shall receive the following fees:—

All quartz claims to be numbered consecutively as they are registered, and the registrar shall issue to each applicant for

registration a certificate in the form set forth in schedule I, annexed to the aforesaid bye-law, and shall keep a duplicate copy of the same. This clause shall not apply to any alluvial claim whatever, nor to quartz claims situated fifteen miles or more from the nearest registrar's office; provided always that the owners of any quartz claim, or share in any such claim, situated a further distance off, may avail themselves of said clause should they deem it advisable.
