Mr. Higinbotham Mr. Grant Mr. Grant Mr. Grant Mr. Verdon Mr. Verdon Mr. Grant Mr. Sullivan WHEREAS by The Local Government Act. 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereinafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, hereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council be boundaries of the subdivisions shall be est forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the Proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such Proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the twest of the proclamation of the said shire into three subdivisions. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), initialled, An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other. places in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., X., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Wood's Point shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered V., VI., VII., IX., and X. respectively.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case unity require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-chiannels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in tremty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley, shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGE-MENT OF THE WERRIBEE AND DJERRIWARRH FARMERS COMMON.

No porson shall be entitled to the use of the common unless he occupies or holds not less than five acres of land within five miles of the boundary of said common.

2. Number of cattle belonging to any one porson or firm not to exceed forty or twenty horses or two hundred and fifty sheep, and in no case will more than one head of cattle to each acre of cultivation be allowed or one horse to two acres of cultivation, except the common be not sufficiently stocked, in which case special arrangements may be made with the managers, but a less number than this may be insisted on by the managers at any time.

case special arrangements has be insisted on by the managers at any time.

3. Cultivation shall mean and be understood as ploughed land for crop, ploughed land for fallow or self-sown crop intended to be harvested.

4. That all cattle sent to the common shall have the owner or owners brand, in legible and distinct characters or letters, on them, in order that the herdsman may be able to discover any strange cattle that may be at any time upon the common. Parties removing their cattle, except working bullocks and milkers, must intimate the same to the herdsman by notice in writing.

5. All persons applying for a license to depasture their cattle will be required to fill up a form to be obtained from either of the managers or herdsman, setting forth the number of acres he has under cultivation according to the intent and meaning of these regulations, and also to make a declaration before a justice of the peace as to the correctness of the same.

6. Any person found depasturing more cattle than what he has taken out a license for, the managers will have the power to cancel his license and prevent him the use of the common during that year.

during that year.

7. The fees to be charged (payable in advance) for depasturing stock upon the common shall be, for cows, heifers, steers, bulls, and bullocks, the sum of Four shillings per head per annum; and for all horses the sum of Six shillings per head per annum; and for all sheep and pigs, the sum of One shilling per head per annum;

annum.

8. No special license shall be granted under the sum of Eight shillings per head per annum for cattle, nor under the sum of Fifteen shillings per head per annum for horses.

9. All persons holding a license from the Crown and residing on Crown lands must take a special license for their cattle and

horses.

10. In no case will either a bull or entire horse be permitted on the common without a written consent of all the managers.

11. A record of all cattle, describing their brands, shall be kept by the herdsman for the inspection of any commoner to enable him or them to discover strange cattle on the common, who are requested to communicate the same to the herdsman.

12. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers

12. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers to impound any sheep, cattle, or borses found trespassing on the said common, an entry of which he will make in a book kept for that purpose, so that the fees arising from the same may be properly accounted for.

13. That all cattle or sheep suspected to be diseased belonging to the commoners (shall by order of the managers) after ten hours'motice, in writing, given to the owners, remove the same off the said common, and in event of refusal, the owner shall be considered a trespasser and be liable to the penalty inflicted or recoverable under and by virtue of the 199th chause of The Land Act now in force in the colony of Victoria, and the cattle shall not be returned to the said common without the consent of the managers first had and obtained.

14. It will be the duty of the herdsman to see all the cattle under his charge once every twenty-four hours; should any be missing during that time he is to give notice and the cattle be impounded, he will have to pay all fees required for the releasing of the same after the first three days.

15. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's wages and other contingencies connected with the management, an additional charge will be made upon each commoner in fair proportion to the number of cattle by him depastured, and each license granted will be under condition that he can be sued for the same and the amount to be recoverable before any justice of the peace.

16. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or neglectful of his duties, they can remove or discharge him without notice, and he can have no claim on them for compensation whatever.

17. The managers shall set apart a portion of the common for sheep, and any sheep trespassing beyond such boundary shall be considered trespassers and be treated as such. All sheep to be herded by the owners.

18. No liceuse shall be transferable, and all cattle must be the bond fide property of the liceusee; and if the managers require, the liceusee shall make a declaration before a justice of the peace as to the correctness of the same.

19. The managers do not hold themselves responsible for any irregularity of the herdsman, and can alter or amend these rules when they consider it necessary.
