## THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF BET-BET.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of September, 1864.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Mr. McCulloch	Mr. Hervey

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, hereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the Proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such Proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the twelfth day of September, in the present year, the shire of Bet-bet was constituted; And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by one hundred and eight persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the shire of Bet-bet into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE REALIBA RIDING.**—Commencing at the south-east angle of the pre-emptive right of Natta Yallock at the centre of the River Avoca; thence northerly by the centre of the River Avoca to its intersection with the northern boundary of the Dunolly mining division at the north-west angle of said mining division; thence by the northern boundary of the Dunolly mining division to the west boundary of the parish of Tarnagulla; thence south by the west boundary of the said parish to its south-west angle; thence east to the north-west angle of the parish of Waanyarra; thence south to the south-west angle of the last-named parish; thence by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Dunolly and Barp to the north-west angle of the parish of Barp; thence southerly by the western boundaries of the parishes of Barp and Wareek to a point on the southern boundary of the Dunolly mining division, being six miles and a half, more or less, from the south-east angle of Natta Yallock pre-emptive right; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the Dunolly mining division to the commencing point, excepting that portion of the municipality of Dunolly contained within the above boundaries.

**THE DUNOLLY RIDING.**—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Barp; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Barp and Dunolly to the north-east angle of the parish of Dunolly; thence south by the eastern boundary of said parish of Dunolly to the Bet-bet Creek; thence south-westerly by the centre of the said Creek to a point due east of the northern boundary of the town reserve in the parish of Wareek; thence due west to and along the said boundary to the north-west angle of the said town reserve; thence in a direct line south-westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence northerly by the western boundaries of the parishes of Wareek and Barp to the commencing point, excepting that portion of the municipality of Dunolly contained within the above boundaries.

**THE TARNAGULLA RIDING.**—Commencing at the intersection of the western boundary of the parish of Tarnagulla with the northern boundary of the Dunolly mining division; thence by the northern boundary of said mining division northerly and easterly to the Loddon River; thence southerly by the River Loddon to the south-west angle of the parish of Eddington; thence northerly by the western boundary of said parish of Eddington and a direct line to the north-east angle of the parish of Dunolly; thence west by the northern boundary of the parish of Dunolly to the south-west angle of the parish of Waanyarra; thence northerly by the western boundary of said parish to its north-west angle; thence west by the southern boundary of the parish of Tarnagulla to the south-west angle of said parish; thence northerly by the western boundary of the parish of Tarnagulla to the commencing point, excepting the municipality of Tarnagulla.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF WOOD'S POINT.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intitled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Wood's Point shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. respectively.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## ROKEWOOD CEMETERY.

**R**ULES, Regulations, &c., for the Management of the Rokewood Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees before the hour of Five p.m. the previous day.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made at the office of the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.
8. The trustees, if required, will cause all common graves to be dug at an extra expense of One pound (£1); but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person, must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, must be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
11. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
12. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
13. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

## CITY OF MELBOURNE.

At a meeting of the Council of the city of Melbourne, held in the Council Chamber in the Town Hall, Swanston street, in the said city, on the 29th day of August, 1864, at which were present:—The Right Worshipful the Mayor, Alderman John Thomas Smith, presiding; Aldermen, Richard Eades, Richard Evans Hill, John Harbison, and Michael Keeley; Councillors, William Bayles, John Donovan Brown, Edward Cohen, Joshua Cowell, John Edwards, John George Goldsmith, George Hughes, Charles Edwin Jones, Thomas Kenny, Joseph Story, Samuel Thorp, James Weedow, George Wragge, and William Williams, being more than one-third of the members of the said council, it was resolved and ordered, that whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria No. 20, intituled, *An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne*, it is amongst other things enacted that where any street, court, or alley on private property, in the city of Melbourne, shall not be or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the said city, it shall be lawful for the said council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the mayor or town clerk of the said city for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall, in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively.

And whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 173, intituled, *An Act to further alter and amend the Laws relating to the City of Melbourne and of the Town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the words "tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley," where used in the first hereinbefore-recited Act, shall be held and taken to mean all tenements or premises actually abutting upon, and access-able from, and communicating with such street, court, or alley, whether the owners or occupiers thereof have or have not a right to use or do commonly use the same. And that the word "owner," used in the said Act shall apply to and be held to include agent of an owner, but only in so far as to enable such agent to apply to the defrayal of expenses incurred in the formation, drainage, and repair of such street, court, or alley, under the authority hereof, moneys of his principal, of which he shall be in the receipt or possession, accruing from tenements lawfully chargeable for such expenses:

And that the said Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the city of Melbourne, shall extend and apply to the entire limits of the said city:

And that the apportionment of the expenses incurred by the council of the city of Melbourne, in the formation, drainage and repair of every such street, court, or alley, on private property, shall be made proportionate to the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners which shall be so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley:

And whereas the streets, courts, or alleys, enumerated in the schedule to the order annexed marked A have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the council of this the said city, that the streets, courts, or alleys, enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall within ten days from the date of this order's coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed and marked B. And it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, or alleys, enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete and repair the street, court, or alley on which their respective tenements adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, or alleys, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order; and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate part of the costs, charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on said street, court, or alley, proportionate to, the extent of the area of the land of each of the several owners so situated as to have or be capable of obtaining access to such street, court, or alley, at the time of or in consequence of the formation or repair of such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition in which the pavement, flagging, macadamising, levelling, draining, and sewerage of such streets, courts, or alleys respectively or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

Made and passed by the council of the city of Melbourne, at the meeting of the said council held on the twenty-ninth day of August, 1864.

## SCHEDULE B,

Referred to in this Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys, enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley, shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 2½ inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with corporation iron roller.

Whenever private entrances lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining street shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection, and subject to the approval, of the city surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.

# **RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WERRIBEE AND DJERRIWARREH FARMERS' COMMON.**

**N**O person shall be entitled to the use of the common unless he occupies or holds not less than five acres of land within five miles of the boundary of said common.

2. Number of cattle belonging to any one person or firm not to exceed forty or twenty horses or two hundred and fifty sheep, and in no case will more than one head of cattle to each acre of cultivation be allowed or one horse to two acres of cultivation, except the common be not sufficiently stocked, in which case special arrangements may be made with the managers, but a less number than this may be insisted on by the managers at any time.

3. Cultivation shall mean and be understood as ploughed land for crop, ploughed land for fallow or self-sown crop intended to be harvested.

4. That all cattle sent to the common shall have the owner or owners brand, in legible and distinct characters or letters, on them, in order that the herdsman may be able to discover any strange cattle that may be at any time upon the common. Parties removing their cattle, except working bullocks and milkers, must intimate the same to the herdsman by notice in writing.

5. All persons applying for a license to depasture their cattle will be required to fill up a form to be obtained from either of the managers or herdsman, setting forth the number of acres he has under cultivation according to the intent and meaning of these regulations, and also to make a declaration before a justice of the peace as to the correctness of the same.

6. Any person found depasturing more cattle than what he has taken out a license for, the managers will have the power to cancel his license and prevent him the use of the common during that year.

7. The fees to be charged (payable in advance) for depasturing stock upon the common shall be, for cows, heifers, steers, bulls, and bullocks, the sum of Four shillings per head per annum; and for all horses the sum of Six shillings per head per annum; and for all sheep and pigs, the sum of One shilling per head per annum.

8. No special license shall be granted under the sum of Eight shillings per head per annum for cattle, nor under the sum of Fifteen shillings per head per annum for horses.

9. All persons holding a license from the Crown and residing on Crown lands must take a special license for their cattle and horses.

10. In no case will either a bull or entire horse be permitted on the common without a written consent of all the managers.

11. A record of all cattle, describing their brands, shall be kept by the herdsman for the inspection of any commoner to enable him or them to discover strange cattle on the common, who are requested to communicate the same to the herdsman.

12. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers to impound any sheep, cattle, or horses found trespassing on the said common, an entry of which he will make in a book kept for that purpose, so that the fees arising from the same may be properly accounted for.

13. That all cattle or sheep suspected to be diseased belonging to the commoners (shall by order of the managers) after ten hours' notice, in writing, given to the owners, remove the same off the said common, and in event of refusal, the owner shall be considered a trespasser and be liable to the penalty inflicted or recoverable under and by virtue of the 129th clause of *The Land Act* now in force in the colony of Victoria, and the cattle shall not be returned to the said common without the consent of the managers first had and obtained.

14. It will be the duty of the herdsman to see all the cattle under his charge once every twenty-four hours; should any be missing during that time he is to give notice within twenty-four hours; should he fail to give notice and the cattle be impounded, he will have to pay all fees required for the releasing of the same after the first three days.

15. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's wages and other contingencies connected with the management, an additional charge will be made upon each commoner in fair proportion to the number of cattle by him depastured, and each license granted will be under condition that he can be sued for the same and the amount to be recoverable before any justice of the peace.

16. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or neglectful of his duties, they can remove or discharge him without notice, and he can have no claim on them for compensation whatever.

17. The managers shall set apart a portion of the common for sheep, and any sheep trespassing beyond such boundary shall be considered trespassers and be treated as such. All sheep to be herded by the owners.

18. No license shall be transferable, and all cattle must be the *bona fide* property of the licensee; and if the managers require, the licensee shall make a declaration before a justice of the peace as to the correctness of the same.

19. The managers do not hold themselves responsible for any irregularity of the herdsman, and can alter or amend these rules when they consider it necessary.
