GRANT FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

THE committees for the management of Mechanics Institutes or other Public Libraries in country districts, claiming to participate in the grant for the purchase of books, are hereby informed that the distribution of the Vote for 1864 will not take place until after the 31st of Docember next.

The conditions attached to the Vote in the Appropriation Act. No. 211, are as follow:—

1. That grants be made in proportion to sums collected by private subscription or local rates during 1864.

2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.

3. That no grant be made to any institution in Melbourne, or more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of it.
