RETENTION OF THE TITLE OF "HONORABLE" BY MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

THE subjoined Despatch is published for general information.

SIR,—I have received your Despatch No. 51, of the 23rd of May last, in which, with reference to the Duke of Newcastle's Circular Despatch of the 28th of December last, you point out that the rule under which in South Australia members of the Executive Council are permitted to retain the title of Honorable is not applicable to the circumstances of Victoria. Since in that colony persons once becoming Executive Councillors retain their offices indefinitely, I concur with you in thinking that they must also retain the title attached to that office. If, however, the different course pursued in other colonies should be hereafter adopted in Victoria, it will follow that gentlemen relinquishing their places in the council will only be permitted to retain the prefix of "Honorable" under the conditions prescribed in the case of South Australia.

You are of course aware that the title is only to be given in the colony in which it is acquired.

COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and increase the commons respectively hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

COLERAINE TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common for Coleraine, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of February, 1861, and the twenty-seventh day of January, 1862, is hereby abolished; and the area hereafter described shall be and constitute the Town Common for Coleraine, viz.:—Six hundred and forty acres, more or less: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 10, section 1, suburban allotments; bounded on the west by a line bearing south eighty chains; on the south by a line bearing east eighty chains; on the east by a line bearing north eighty chains; and on the north by the town reserve of Coleraine, bearing west eighty chains to the point of commencement.—(64.L.8858.)

ROKEWOOD GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The Common described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, and the twenty-fifth day of April, 1864, under the designation of Rokewood Gold Field Common, is hereby increased by adding thereto the area hereafter described, viz.:—Five hundred acres, more or less, county of Grenville: Commencing at the south-east angle of that portion of the common which was added on 25th April, 1864; thence by the present common south and east, to the Little Woody Yallock Creek; by that creek southerly to its junction with the Illibarook Creek; by that creek north-westerly to a point bearing west from the commencing point; thence east to the point of commencement; deducting from above-described area all sold or legally appropriated Crown land, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(64.2546.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.
