NOTICE TO INTENDING APPLICANTS, DURING 1865, FOR LEASES OF CROWN LANDS FOR NOVEL INDUSTRIAL ENTERPRISES.

IT is hereby notified that Applications for Leases of Crown Lands under the 47th section of *The Land Act*, 1862 (the number of such leases issuable during 1865 being restricted to one hundred), will be received by the Board of Land and Works on the 1st January, 1865, and until further notice after that date.

Applications must be made on the amended form prescribed by the Governor in Council, to be obtained at the District Survey Offices and Land Offices, and at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

Applications delivered at the Office of the Board of Land and Works prior to the 1st January, 1865, for leases issuable during that year, will not be recognized.

Applicants are informed that the publication of their applications in the *Government Gazette* is required by the Act, for the purpose of affording the public opportunity of reporting objections, should such exist, to the issue of the lease applied for, and such notification does not in any way authorise or justify the commencement of improvements upon the land, or entry thereupon.

The Board of Land and Works also desire it to be understood that, in future, applications for leases of land under the above section of *The Land Act*, for the cultivation of maize, foreign grasses, root crops for stall-feeding cattle, sheepwash tobacco, or other crops of a similar nature, will not be entertained, but must be restricted to the purposes contemplated by the Act, viz., the establishment in Victoria of *bonâ fide* novel industrial enterprises.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE OF APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF LAND UNDER THE 47TH SECTION OF "THE LAND ACT, 1862."

THE sum of £1. must be forwarded with every application, to defray the cost of inserting the requisite notice of the same in the *Government Gazette*. Applications unaccompanied by this amount will not be entertained or recorded.

Land comprised in the ten millions of acres reserved for agricultural areas, is not available for leasing under the 47th section of *The Land Act*, 1862.

In the column appropriated for that purpose, a plan of the land applied for must be furnished by an authorised surveyor,* from actual survey on the ground. Where a long traverse survey has been necessary to connect the site applied for with a fixed point in a Government survey, as required, it may be shown on a separate sheet; and in such cases (to facilitate the preparation of the description for the *Gazette* notice) the distance and bearing in a direct line should be given, as well as the particulars of the traverse lines.

Allotments that are applied for in unsurveyed localities should be of a rectangular form, and must in every instance contain at least two right angles, the boundary lines should conform either to the true meridian, or to the magnetic meridian, and the meridian adopted should be specified on the plan. The boundaries of a site comprised in a surveyed allotment must conform to the lines of a prior survey.

It is in all cases objectionable that application be made for land comprised in two or more detached portions, or including portions of two or more surveyed allotments, or for a site comprising an undue extent of creek or river frontage, or situated on both banks of a creek or river.

All leases under the 47th section of *The Land Act* will contain the condition, that not more than one-half the area of the site leased shall be cultivated during the first five years of the lease, in a proportion of *not less than three acres annually*; and as this section of the Act contemplates, and its operation is restricted to, the introduction of any useful plant or industrial enterprise or process, either previously unknown or not generally known and used in Victoria, applications will not be entertained for leases of sites for vineyards, orchards, mulberry plantations, &c., &c., merely for the purpose of raising the various products with a view to the disposal of them in a raw state, but must be accompanied by an undertaking to submit the products to the manufacturing process or processes contemplated by the purposes for which the lease is desired, and adapted to the nature of the crops. Applications for sites for the culture of *beet-root* will not be entertained unless some guarantee be afforded that the applicant will be provided with apparatus necessary for the manufacture of sugar.

Persons desiring leases of this nature should, therefore, at the time of making application, give specific information as to the purposes to which the land applied for is to be devoted; for instance, if it is to be cultivated as a vineyard, with a view to the production of wine, the kind of vine proposed to be planted, and the description of wine to be manufactured, should be stated. Similar particulars should be given in regard to sites for orchards, the number of acres to be planted annually during the first five years of the lease, with the various descriptions of fruit trees, and the purposes to which it is proposed to apply the produce of the same (whether to be converted into cider, perry, or dried fruit), must be specified; and, with respect to all other purposes for which leases may be sought, like information must be supplied. To insure clearness and fullness of detail, it is suggested that the

required particulars be furnished somewhat in the following manner. Suppose, for example, that a lease of 30 acres of land is required for the cultivation of vines, mulberry trees, and olives, in the column of the Form of Application, headed "PURPOSES," the following particulars should be inserted:—

acres, vines ... } Here specify the varieties of grapes proposed to be grown, and the kind of wine, &c., to be manufactured.

acres, mulberry trees ... } For the feeding of silkworms.

acres, olives ... } For the manufacture of olive oil; or

acres: to be planted annually during the first five years of lease, with the varieties of produce above specified.

Such particulars will be included in the conditions of every lease, and on the due fulfilment of those conditions will depend the continuance of the lease, and the right of the lessee to pre-emption under the 48th section of *The Land Act, 1862*.

INCORPORATION OF KYNETON HOSPITAL.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of October, 1864.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Major-General Chute Mr. Verdon

Mr. Higinbotham

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the Kyneton Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said institution to be a body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act in manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Kyneton Hospital, situate in the borough of Kyneton, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Kyneton Hospital."

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*, it is amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within the said colony, which shall from time to time be proclaimed by the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments respectively of the place or district where the same are or shall be situated within the said colony, and shall be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected in the said colony, and of the prisoners confined within the same; provided that it shall not be necessary to proclaim any building as a gaol, prison, house of correction, or penal establishment, which has been so proclaimed, notified, or declared before the passing of the said Act; and it is also enacted, that unless where it shall be otherwise declared or appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, every public gaol shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction shall be taken to be a prison: And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventeenth year of the same reign, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders"*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor or any officer specially authorized by him, by writing under his hand; to cause that any male person undergoing imprisonment for any criminal offence or misdemeanor by the sentence of any court of competent jurisdiction, whether sentenced to imprisonment with hard labor or to imprisonment only, may, during the whole or any period of his

sentence, be employed at such labor and in such place as the Lieutenant Governor or such officer as aforesaid shall direct; provided that such labor, in the case of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment only, shall not be severe; provided further that any court of competent jurisdiction, in passing sentence upon any prisoner, shall have authority to exempt such prisoner from the operation of this clause; and it is also enacted, that any male person lawfully imprisoned for any crime, misdemeanor, or offence, by the sentence of any court of competent jurisdiction, or employed at labor as a criminal on the roads or other public works of Victoria, who shall escape or attempt to escape from any gaol, prison, or house of correction, stockade, hulk, or other penal establishment, or from the custody of any constable, gaoler, or other officer, in whose custody he may be, shall be guilty of felony, and being lawfully convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for any period not exceeding three years, or to be kept to hard labor, with or without irons, on the roads or other public works of the colony, for any period not exceeding five years: And whereas divers additions and alterations have been from time to time made in the buildings, erections, houses, and premises heretofore proclaimed and used as public gaols, situate in certain of the localities hereinafter mentioned, and it is expedient to re-proclaim such gaols, and to describe the sites thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the Act first above recited, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify that the buildings, erections, houses, and premises, situate in the several places hereinafter described, which have been erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, and houses of correction, are such public gaols, prisons, and houses of correction, within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

BALLARAT GAOL—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, and premises on the following site, viz.:—Six acres one rood and five perches, county of Grenville, parish of Ballarat: Commencing at the south-east angle of the Wesleyan Church reserve; bounded on the east by a prolongation of Albert street, bearing south ten chains; on the south by the Golden Point road, bearing N. 72° 23' W. eleven chains forty links; on the north-west by Lydiard street, bearing N. 58° 15' E. seven chains six links; on the west by Lydiard street, bearing north two chains eighty-three links; and on the north by the Wesleyan Church reserve, bearing east five chains to the point of commencement.

CASTLEMAINE GAOL—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, and premises on the following site, viz.:—Two acres two roods and thirty-two perches, county unnamed, parish of Castlemaine, being part of block 113, township of Castlemaine: Commencing at the north-west angle, being a point bearing south eight chains from the south-west angle of block 110; bounded on the north by Edward street, bearing east five chains forty links; on the east by a road bearing south five chains; on the south by Charles street, bearing west five chains forty links; and on the west by Bowden street, bearing north five chains to the point of commencement.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE ZOOLOGICAL RESERVE, ROYAL PARK.

THE Board of Land and Works has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Trustees of the Royal Park.

1. The portion of the Zoological Reserve enclosed by the Council of the Acclimatization Society, and containing sixty (60) acres, more or less, of land, shall remain under the exclusive control of that council, subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

(1.) That the ground be not used for any purposes unconnected with acclimatization or zoological purposes.

(2.) That the public (with exception of young children unaccompanied by adult protectors, and of persons followed by dogs) be allowed admission during a period of not less than six (6) hours in every day to those parts of the ground which can be visited without detriment to the breeding of imported animals and the rearing of their progeny.

2. The trustees of the Zoological Reserve may allow the Council of the Acclimatization Society to occupy, for the depasturing of imported animals and their progeny, such portions of the Zoological Reserve as may from time to time be required for such a purpose, outside the ground specified in the preceding regulation.

3. The Council of the Acclimatization Society will be required to maintain in good repair the boundary fence of the Zoological Reserve, and to defray the cost of repairs and renewals of that fence out of the funds placed at their disposal.

4. The grass on the portion of the Zoological Reserve not occupied by imported animals and their progeny may be sold, and the proceeds of such sale expended on the improvement of such portion of the reserve.

5. The portion of the Zoological Reserve not specially enclosed by the Council of the Acclimatization Society, and used for the depasturing of imported animals and their progeny, shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, subject to the condition that the persons admitted to the reserve shall be unaccompanied by dogs, and that if in vehicles or on horseback the roadways be not departed from.
