WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of councillors for any original or proclaimed borough, hereinafter sometimes called in common "single borough," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in such borough, within three months after the receipt of the same divide the borough into three separate wards by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of such wards shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made upon or within thirty days before any day appointed for holding any annual election of councillors in or for such borough: And whereas the Governor has received a petition signed by one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the borough of East Collingwood, praying that the said borough may be divided into three separate wards, to be designated and bounded as set forth in the petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by this present Order divide the said Borough of East Collingwood into Three separate

Wards, by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively and with the several boundaries hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

DARLING WARD—Commencing on the east at the junction of the centre of Gipps street with the centre of Hoddle street, thence proceeding along the centre of Hoddle street to the intersection of Hoddle street by Reilly street; on the north from the intersection of Hoddle street by Reilly street, proceeding along Reilly street to its junction with the centre of Smith street; on the west from the junction of Reilly street with the centre of Smith street, proceeding along the centre of Smith street to its junction with the centre of Peel street; on the south from the junction of Smith street with the centre of Peel street, proceeding along the centre of Peel street to its junction with the centre of Wellington street, thence along the centre of Wellington street to its junction with the centre of Gipps street, and thence along the centre of Gipps street to its commencing point.

THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the Proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such Proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the thirtieth day of November, 1863, the shire of Dundas was constituted; and by another Order of the eighth day of February, 1864, the boundaries of the said shire were adjusted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by more than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the shire of Dundas into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SOUTH RIDING—Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of the county of Dundas due north of the western boundary of G. Cameron's pre-emptive right, in the parish of Yulecart, in the county of Normanby; thence south to the

south-west angle of section IV. of the same parish; thence southerly by a direct line to the north-west angle of J. R. Nowlan's pre-emptive right; thence by the western boundary of said right to its south-west angle; thence by a direct line south-easterly to the north-west angle of the Weeracourt pre-emptive right; thence by the west boundary of the said right to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line south-easterly to the north-west angle of section IV., parish of Macarthur; thence southerly by the western boundary of said section IV. and the south-west boundary of section II. of the said parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Macarthur; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said township reserve to the western boundary of the county of Villiers; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said county to the southern boundary of the county of Dundas; thence by the said southern boundary westerly to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING—Commencing at the junction of the Grange Burn and Wannan River; thence north-easterly by the Wannan River to the centre of the road from Cavendish to Balmoral; thence north-westerly by the centre of said road to the centre of Mather's Creek; thence by Mather's Creek to the River Glenelg; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the county of Dundas, to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING—Commencing at the junction of the Pigeon Ponds with the River Glenelg; thence south-easterly by the Pigeon Ponds, and the most northern branch of the same, to a point in the centre of the road from Harrow to Coleraine, where it crosses the Pigeon Ponds; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to the south boundary of the township of Coleraine; thence southerly by the centre of the road from Coleraine to Heywood to the south boundary of the county of Dundas; thence easterly and northerly by the said boundary and the River Wannan to the centre of the road from Cavendish to Balmoral; thence north-westerly by the centre of said road to the centre of Mather's Creek; thence by Mather's Creek to the River Glenelg; thence westerly by the River Glenelg to the commencing point.

COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:-

ST. ANDREW'S GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The common described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, as situate at St. Andrew's Gold Fields, is hereby increased by adding thereto the land hereafter described, viz.:-Two thousand seven hundred and twenty acres, more or less, county of Evelyn: Commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Queenstown; thence by a line bearing true south one mile; thence by a line bearing true east one mile twenty chains; thence by a line bearing true north three miles forty chains; thence by a line bearing true west sixty chains, more or less, to the Diamond Creek; thence by that creek southerly to the northern boundary of the township of Queenstown; thence true east by part of the northern boundary of said township; and thence true south by the eastern boundary of same to the point of commencement.—(64J.8352.)
