WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of August, 1861, a road district was proclaimed, under the designation of "The Strathfieldsaye Road District": And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the ninth day of May, 1864, the boundaries of the said road district were adjusted as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by more than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Strathfieldsaye Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE STRATHFIELDSAYE SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-east angle of section VI., parish of Eppalock; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 10, section I. of said parish; thence north to the north-west angle of allotment 11, section I., parish of Eppalock; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 4, section XI. of the same parish; thence by a line north-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 8, section VIII., parish of Axedale; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 4, section XVIII., parish of Strathfieldsaye; thence by a direct line north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the borough of Sandhurst at an angle about sixteen chains south of the main Melvor road; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the said borough to an angle about twelve chains south of the intersection of the main road through Strathfieldsaye with said boundary; thence south-easterly to the north-east angle of the parish of Mandurang; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish of Mandurang to the north-west angle of the parish of Sedgwick; thence east to the north-east angle of allotment 10, section I. of the same parish; thence by a direct line south-easterly to the north-west angle of the reserve for the township of Sedgwick; thence by the western boundary of the said township reserve to its south-west angle;

2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and of officers.
5. Examination of and passing accounts for payment.
6. Orders of the day.
7. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
8. Reading notices of motion for consideration at future meetings.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

5. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration.

6. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every such notice shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be considered, unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

8. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee, shall, for that occasion, be a member of such committee.

9. Every councillor shall stand up while addressing the president.

10. The president's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

11. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder; and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded, if so required by any councillor.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

13. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undispensed of shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the council.

14. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, excepting by way of explanation or reply upon an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed; and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

15. Every councillor when proposing a motion or amendment, or when speaking on any matter, shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided; the councillor in possession of the chair may then resume the subject.

16. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president shall refuse to withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of five pounds for the offence.

17. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

18. Any councillor may record his protest against any resolution of the council, on giving notice of his intention so to do, on the adoption of such resolution, and on such councillor entering such protest, and his reason for protesting, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the council; and on his signing the same before the next meeting of the council: provided always that such protest may be expunged if decided by a majority of the council not to be in accordance with truth, or not to be in its terms respectful to the council.

19. An account shall be kept by the secretary of all rates collected in each parish or portion of parish; and the amount of such rates, together with the proportion of the annual endowment thereof, shall, after deducting the share of expenses *pro rata*, be devoted to the use of such parish respectively.

20. No motion, the effect of which if carried, would involve the expenditure of any sum of money exceeding fifty pounds, shall be entertained by the council unless notice of such motion be given in the usual manner.

21. All contracts shall be made by tender, unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, are to be entered in every case on the minutes of the council. When any tender shall have been accepted by the council the tenderer, or some person for him or on his behalf, shall pay a deposit in the sum of ten pounds per cent. on the amount of the contract to the treasurer of the council, which amount so deposited shall be returned to the contractor when he obtains a final certificate from the surveyor that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

22. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the president and one other councillor, and countersigned by the treasurer, who shall also stamp such cheque; and no such cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is to be given shall have been passed at a meeting of the council.

23. The shire office shall be open on Tuesday in every week, between ten o'clock in the forenoon and three o'clock in the afternoon, during which time the secretary shall be in attendance for the purpose of transacting the ordinary business of the council. The surveyor shall be in attendance during the hours of business, at every meeting of the council.

24. The valuer or valuers appointed by the council shall visit and examine each rateable property within the shire, and shall, after having valued such property, thereupon deliver or cause to be delivered to the owner or occupier thereof a notice, setting forth the amount at which such property is valued, together with other particulars necessary to describe the property, and every such notice shall be signed by the valuer or valuers.

25. The secretary, surveyor, rate collector, and other officers shall furnish or deliver official reports to the council at each ordinary meeting.

26. Any bye-law may be suspended *pro tem* in case of emergency, with the unanimous consent of the councillors present, at any meeting, except bye-law No. 19, which shall require the consent of the whole council.

The above bye-laws were made by Special Order of the council of the shire of Bannockburn, at a meeting held at their office, Leigh road, on Thursday, the eighth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.
