BYE-LAWS FOR THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF BANNOCKBURN.

THE ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at the office of the council, on the second Tucsday of every month at noon; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the name of the councillors present shall be entered in the minute book, and the meeting shall be adjourned.

2. At every ordinary meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of any preceding meetings; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president, or in his absence, by the acting president.

3. The order of business shall be as follows, or a near thereto as practicable:—

1. Reading copies of letters sent.

2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and of

officers.

Examination of and passing accounts for payment.

6. Orders of the day.
7. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
8. Reading notices of motion for consideration at future

8. Reading notices of motion for consideration at inture meetings.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

5. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration.

6. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every such notice shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

26. Any byc-law may be suspended pro tem. in case of emergency, with the unanimous consent of the councilors present, at any meeting, except bye-law No. 19, which shall require the consent of the whole council.
