His Honor the Officer administering the Government directs it to be notified for general information that, on and after the 1st March next, a fixed dioptric light of the first order will be exhibited on *Isle aux Fouquets*, a small islet on the edge of the reef  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to the north of the southern entrance of the Port of Mahbourg, in the Island of Mauritius.

A detailed description of, and sailing directions for making, this light, are published below for general information.

## MAURITIUS.

### SAILING DIRECTIONS IN REFERENCE TO THE LIGHTHOUSE ON ISLE AUX FOUQUETS, GRAND PORT.

1. The lighthouse is built upon a small island called *Ile aux Fouquets*, in latitude  $20^{\circ} 21' 20''$  south, and longitude  $57^{\circ} 45' 9''$  east. It marks the southern entrance to Grand Port, and is 880 yards to the E.N.E. of Ile de Passe; there is a small islet between them.

2. Ile de Passe, which bounds Grand Port entrance to the northward, is easily known by the battery and other buildings thereon; there are times when rollers entirely block the pass, although the depth is from 14 to 22 fathoms, but, generally speaking, the reefs on either hand are perfectly visible from the foreyard.

3. The island on which the lighthouse is built is 3 miles to the eastward of the nearest point of the mainland, and on the very edge of the coral reef which skirts this part of the coast of Mauritius; the lighthouse (as well as the adjacent buildings) is *white*; its ground line is 39 feet above the mean sea level, and it forms a most conspicuous object which cannot possibly be mistaken.

4. The lighthouse serves as a guide to vessels passing Grand Port by day or by night.

5. The apparatus is a dioptric of the first order, showing a *fixed white light* from sunset to sunrise, visible in every direction from seaward, but dark on the land side. The light (focal plane) is 108 $\frac{1}{2}$  feet above the mean sea level (the rise of tide being 3 feet),

and in clear weather can be seen at a distance of 16 nautical miles from the deck of a vessel 12 feet above the water.

6. There is a Government pilot in Mahebourg, who will, in a few months, be stationed at the lighthouse, and who will board ships bound to Mahebourg on their making the usual signal.

7. Vessels bound to Mahebourg may approach the light on any bearing from N. by E. to W. by S.; when about 2 miles from it they should heave to with the head off shore until the pilot comes alongside.

8. Should it be desired to get into shelter as soon as possible, approach the light under easy sail till within about  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a mile, in order to avoid a shoal patch of 6 fathoms off Point Laverdie, which is the extreme point of the Coral Reef bounding the south side of the entrance of Grand Port; steer so as to round Ile de Passe at the distance of  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile, as a spit runs out from its south side for about a cable's length; then haul to the northward, and anchor in 18 or 20 fathoms; it is, however, not recommended to attempt the foregoing without a pilot, except in cases of extreme necessity.

9. A vessel coming from the southward and bound to Port Louis round the north end of the Island of Mauritius, the usual track should, after sighting Grand Port Light, steer so as to pass it at a distance of about 4 miles; when, at that distance, the light bears W. by S., a N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. course for 9 miles will, if the weather be clear, bring a vessel in sight of Flat Island revolving light bearing about N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.; the course can then be shaped as required.

10. A vessel coming from the northward having Flat Island Light on a bearing of N.N.W. must be careful after sighting Grand Port Light not to bring it, when at less than eight miles distance, on a more southerly bearing than S.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., or she will be too near the coast reef to the northward of that light.

11. The coast reef to the eastward of and bounding Grand Port has a bank of irregular soundings extending some distance to seaward; the lead, if carefully attended to, will prove a tolerable guide in very thick weather.

12. The bearings in the foregoing instructions are all magnetic, and will carry a ship at least 3 miles from the coast reef.

13. No vessel bound into Grand Port ought to approach at night; she should heave to well to the southward of the light, as the drift being to the northward she might find herself to leeward in the morning and lose much time in working up.

#### THE SHIRE OF ALBERTON.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as by the said Act provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas the area of the district hereinafter named, and the amount of the last general rate therein, are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Alberton Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

#### THE BROADMEADOWS ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any

subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, 1863, the boundaries of the Broadmeadows road district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an addition of a portion of the parish of Wollert to the eastern boundary of the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Broadmeadows road district by the extension of its eastern boundary, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of section CL in the parish of Jika-jika; thence south to the northern boundary of section CXLII. in the said parish; thence west to the Moonee Ponds; thence southerly by the Moonee Ponds to the northern boundary of the municipality of Essendon; thence west by the northern boundary of the said municipality to the centre of the Deep Creek road; thence north-westerly by the centre line of the Deep Creek road to the western boundary of section VI. parish of Tullamarine; thence north by the western boundary of said section VI. and a right line to the Moonee Ponds; thence northwards by the Moonee Ponds, being the western boundary of the parish of Will-will-rook to the parish of Bulla-bulla; thence east by the southern boundary of the parish of Bulla-bulla to the parish of Yuroke; thence north by the western boundary of the parish of Yuroke to the parish of Mickleham; thence west by the southern boundary of the parish of Mickleham aforesaid to the Deep Creek; thence by the said creek north-easterly, being the western boundary of the parish of Mickleham aforesaid, to the junction of the Kongaderr Creek; thence north-easterly to the northern boundary of the parish of Bolinda; thence east to the northern boundary of section XXVII. in the parish of Mickleham; thence east by the northern boundaries of sections XXVII., XXVI., XXV., to the eastern boundary of the said parish of Mickleham; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish to the northern boundary of the parish of Yuroke; thence by the northern boundary of the parish of Yuroke and a line east to the centre of the Merri-merri Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the said creek to a point due east of the northern boundary of section CXLIX. in the parish of Jika-jika; thence west to and by the northern boundaries of sections CXLIX. and CL. to the commencing point.—(64.136.)

#### THE WOADY YALOOK ROAD DISTRICT.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the second day of September, 1863, the boundaries of the Woady Yalook road district were altered and defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it seemed fit to the Governor in Council, by Order made on the thirtieth day of November last, to add the parishes of Mannibidar, North and South Narinehill, and Wallinduc, to the said district: And whereas in a Proclamation bearing even date with the said Order, and intended to give effect thereto, the said district was misdescribed: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the description contained in the Proclamation lastly hereinbefore mentioned; and do hereby proclaim the addition of the said parishes to Woady Yalook road district aforesaid, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do also re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre line of the road from Carngnam to Ballarat due south of the centre line of a road which forms the eastern boundary of section VIII. in the parish

of Haddon; thence easterly by the centre of the said road from Carngham to Ballarat to a point due north of the eastern boundaries of sections III. and V. in the parish of Cardigan; thence south to and by the eastern boundaries of said sections to the south-east angle of section V. in the said parish; thence southerly by a line to the north-west angle of J. Winter's pre-emptive right; thence south to its south-west angle; thence west to a point due south of the west boundary of section VIII. of the parish of Cardigan; thence southerly by a line to the south-west angle of the Buninyong road district; thence by a line due west to the centre of the Little Woody Yaloak Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the said creek to its confluence with the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence further south by the said Woody Yaloak Creek to a point due east of the southern boundary of the parish of South Naringhil; thence west to and by the said boundary of the said parish to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence northerly by the said county boundary to the north-east angle of the said county; thence by a line north-easterly to a point about two miles sixty chains due south of the centre line of a road which forms the eastern boundary of sections XI. and XII. in the parish of Haddon; thence to and by the said centre line of the said road to the commencing point; excepting the borough of Smythesdale.—(63,3117.)

#### SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF BELFAST.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency, SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V.; VI.; VII.; VIII.; IX.; and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Shire of Belfast shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V.; VI.; VII.; VIII.; IX.; and X.
