## LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

I HEREBY notify that the subjoined Petition has been addressed and presented to me, on the twenty-second day of December, 1864.

To the Honorable the President of the Legislative Council.

The humble Petition of Alexander Bayne, of Sandhurst, in the colony of Victoria, landowner,

Sheweth—

That on the third day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, a Writ was duly issued by His Excellency Sir Charles Darling, Governor of Victoria, directed to the Returning Officer of the North-Western Province, for the election of a member of the Legislative Council for that Province.

That your Petitioner, and Nicholas Fitzgerald, and Francis Robertson, duly became and were announced by the said Returning Officer to have been duly nominated, and to have become candidates at said election.

That the said Returning Officer duly announced that a poll would be taken for said election on the second day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

That the poll was taken on the said second day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, when there were polled the following numbers of votes—

For Nicholas Fitzgerald	...	696
For your Petitioner	...	630
For Francis Robertson	...	357

And the said Returning Officer declared the said Nicholas Fitzgerald to be duly elected as member for said North-Western Province, and the name of said Nicholas Fitzgerald was endorsed on said Writ by said Returning Officer, and the said Writ was returned by him to the said Governor within the time specified.

That the said Nicholas Fitzgerald was not for one year previous to such election legally or equitably seized of or entitled to an estate of freehold in possession, for his own use and benefit, in lands and tenements, or either of them, in the said colony of Victoria, of the value of Five thousand pounds sterling money, above all charges and incumbrances affecting the same respectively.

That your Petitioner was for one year previous to such election legally seized of an estate of freehold in possession, for his own use and benefit, in lands and tenements, in the colony of Victoria, of the value of Five thousand pounds sterling money over and above all charges and incumbrances affecting the same respectively, and was at the time of such election in every other respect qualified to be elected as a member of said Legislative Council, within and according to the provisions of the Act to establish a Constitution in and for the colony of Victoria.

That notwithstanding the declaration of said Returning Officer, your Petitioner submits that the said Nicholas Fitzgerald was not, but that your Petitioner was, duly elected member at such election for said North-Western Province, on the ground that the said Nicholas Fitzgerald was not qualified at the time of said election to be elected a member for said province.

Your Petitioner thereupon respectfully prays—

- First—That you will as soon as conveniently may lay this petition before the Legislative Council.
- Second—That the Legislative Council may be pleased forthwith to refer such petition to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications.
- Third—That when such reference has been made, such committee will determine and report to the Legislative Council that the said Nicholas Fitzgerald was at the time of said election not qualified to be elected a member for said North-Western Province, and that your Petitioner was duly elected as a member to serve in the Legislative Council for the said North-Western Province, and that said return be amended by striking out therefrom the name of the said Nicholas Fitzgerald and substituting instead thereof the name of your Petitioner, and that your Petitioner may make the declaration required by law as a member of said Council and may take his seat accordingly.
- Fourth—Or, failing this, that a new Writ may be issued for the election of a member to serve in the said Legislative Council for said North-Western Province.
- Fifth—And that your Petitioner may have such further and other relief in the premises as the nature of the case requires.

And your Petitioner will ever pray.

## LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

## SANDRIDGE ELECTION—PETITION.

I HEREBY notify that there was presented to me, on Thursday, the twenty-second day of December instant, a Petition, of which the following is a true copy:—

To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Colony of Victoria.

The Petition of Robert Byrne, of Sandridge, in the colony of Victoria, auctioneer, whose name is hereunto subscribed,

Respectfully sheweth—

That the petitioner was a candidate at the last election of a member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for this present Parliament for the Electoral District of Sandridge, in the colony of Victoria.

That at the said last election of a member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said Electoral District of Sandridge, in the months of October and November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, David Moore, Charles Muirhead Ingles, and the petitioner, were candidates duly nominated for the representation of the said electoral district in the Legislative Assembly of Victoria.

That a poll was taken by Andrew Plummer, Esquire, the Returning Officer of the said electoral district, on the third day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

That the said David Moore was declared by the said Returning Officer to have had a majority of votes at the said election, and to have been duly elected; and was returned as member duly elected to serve in this present Legislative Assembly of the Colony of Victoria for the said Electoral District of Sandridge.

The petitioner complains—

That before, and at, and after, the issuing of the writ for the said election, and before, at, during, and after, the holding of the said election, the said David Moore did, by himself, his friends, agents, managers, partizans, and supporters, and by divers other persons, at the request of the said David Moore, regardless of the law, by divers ways and means, at his and their charge, and on his aid their behalf, directly and indirectly, give, present, and allow to persons, having votes at such election, money, meat, drink, lodging, entertainment, provision, and reward, and did make presents, gifts, rewards, and promises, agreements, obligations, and engagements, to give and allow money, meat, drink, provision, presents, rewards, and entertainments to, and for persons, having votes as aforesaid, for the use, advantage, benefit, profit, and preferment of such persons, in order that they might be induced to vote for the said David Moore, and that the said David Moore might be elected, and for being elected to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said Electoral District of Sandridge at the said election.

That before and during the said election, as well the said David Moore by himself, his agents, managers, friends, partizans, supporters, and divers other persons, was guilty of gross, extensive, systematic, and notorious bribery, and before and during the said election did by money, gifts, presents, and rewards, and by promises, agreements for presents and rewards, corrupt and procure divers persons, having, or claiming to have, votes at such election, to give their votes in favor of the said David Moore, or forbear to give them in favor of the petitioner; that the said David Moore, by reason of the said corrupt and illegal practices, was and is wholly disabled and incapacitated and ineligible to serve in this present Legislative Assembly for the Electoral District of Sandridge, and the return of the said David Moore was and is wholly void.

The petitioner further complains—

That the majority of votes, declared by the Returning Officer in favor of the said David Moore, was only an apparent and colorable majority, inasmuch as the votes of divers persons were accepted and recorded in favor of the said David Moore, who were not legally entitled, and had no legal right to vote at the said election; and that the real majority of good and legal votes polled at the said election was in favor of the petitioner over the said David Moore: that divers persons were admitted to vote, and did vote, at the said election for the said David Moore, who were not entitled by law to vote at the said election for the said electoral district, or to use, for the purpose of voting, electors' rights previously issued to them by the electoral registrar for the said electoral district, by reason of their not having any qualification in respect of property, occupation, residence, rating, or payment of taxes, and whose qualification was, for other and various reasons, insufficient or totally gone, or who were subject to legal incapacities, and whose names had been improperly retained on both or either of the electoral rolls of the said electoral district; and that the votes so admitted ought to be struck off the poll: that at the said election, divers persons voted for the said David Moore who were enrolled as voters by reason of their having a residential qualification for the said electoral district, but who had become disqualified as electors for the said electoral district through not having resided and lived within the limits and boundaries of the said electoral district for the six months next preceding the said election, as required by an Act passed in the said Colony of Victoria in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and known as the Electoral Act of One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three; and that such votes were admitted by the said Returning Officer as good votes for the said David Moore, and ought now to be struck off the poll: that at the said election, divers persons who had been employed for hire, as attorneys, agents, clerks, committee-men, canvassers, and cabman, or in some such other capacity, and had either before, or during, or after such election, accepted, received or taken from the said David Moore, or from some other persons on his behalf, for, or in consideration of, or in respect to such employment, a sum or sums of money, did vote for the said David Moore at such election; and that such votes were admitted and received as good votes for the said David Moore, and ought now to be struck off the poll: that many persons were admitted to vote, and did vote, at the said election in favor of the said David Moore, who had asked, received, or taken money, gifts, employments, rewards, or promises for money, gifts, employments, or rewards, or who were otherwise bribed or corruptly influenced to vote at the said election in favor of the said David Moore, or to forbear to vote for the petitioner; and that all the votes so admitted for the said David Moore ought to be struck off the poll: that many persons were admitted to vote, and did vote, at the said election in favor of the said David Moore, who did before, at, and during the said election, by themselves and other persons employed by them, by gifts, money, and rewards, the giving of meat, drink, and entertainment, or promises of gifts, money, and rewards, or meat, drink, and entertainment, and by divers other illegal practices, procure divers persons, having votes at the said elec-

tion, to give their votes in favor of the said David Moore, and to forbear to give their votes for the petitioner; and the votes so admitted ought to be struck off the poll: that divers persons were admitted to vote, and did vote, at the said election for the said David Moore, who were disqualified, by reason of their having made wagers or bets on the said election; and the votes so admitted ought to be struck off the poll: that at the said election many persons were compelled, by violence, threats, intimidation, and force, practised by friends, agents, partizans, managers, committee-men, and supporters of the said David Moore, or one of them, to vote for the said David Moore, or to forbear to vote for the petitioner; and the votes so admitted ought now to be struck off the poll: that at the said election the votes of divers persons were counted on the said poll who did not, in fact, vote for the said David Moore, but who were personated and fraudulently represented by other persons who had themselves no title to vote, or had already voted in their own proper persons; and that such votes ought now to be struck off the poll: that divers persons, at the said election, who were themselves unable to read or write, or by reason of some bodily infirmity were incapacitated from marking their voting papers, did request the returning officer, at the said election, to mark out for them, and on their behalf, the names of the candidates for whom they did not intend or purpose to vote, as the said returning officer might lawfully do, and that the said returning officer, in divers instances, and for and on behalf of divers persons, legally entitled to vote, and did purpose to vote for the petitioner, did strike out the name of the petitioner and one other candidate, instead of the names of the said David Moore and Charles Muirhead Ingles, notwithstanding that the said persons did there and then distinctly declare to the said returning officer their intention of voting in favor of the petitioner; and that such votes ought now to be struck off the poll for the said David Moore, and be counted for the petitioner: that the votes of divers persons were tendered for the petitioner and refused, which ought to have been received and added to poll for the petitioner; and that such votes ought now to be counted for the petitioner: that by the ways and means aforesaid, the said David Moore obtained an apparent majority over the petitioner, whereas, in fact, and in truth, the petitioner had a majority of good and legal votes over the said David Moore, and was duly elected a member of the Legislative Assembly, to serve in the present Parliament for the said Electoral District of Sandridge, and ought to have been returned as such member.

The petitioner humbly prays, that the Legislative Assembly will take the premises into their consideration, and will declare the said election and return of the said David Moore to be wholly null and void, and that the said David Moore was not duly elected, and ought not have been returned at the said election, and that the petitioner had a majority of legal votes over the said David Moore at the said election, and was duly elected and ought to have been returned, and will cause the return to be amended by erasing the name of the said David Moore therefrom, and substituting the name of the petitioner instead of the name of said David Moore, and that the Legislative Assembly will give the petitioner such further and other relief as the Legislative Assembly shall think meet, and that the case of the petitioner be referred to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications as early as the Legislative Assembly shall see fit.

#### PROCLAIMED (SEPARATE SINGLE) ROAD DISTRICTS.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he shall have received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names shall appear upon some voters' roll for a single district or any one or more subdivisions thereof, setting forth that by reason of the great extent of such district, or remoteness of the part wherein such petitioners reside from other parts thereof, and of the diversity of the industry and interests of such part from those of the remainder thereof (of the truth of which allegations, and the grounds thereof, the Governor in Council alone shall judge), it is expedient to constitute the two parts of such district so differently affected, two separate districts; to constitute accordingly such parts with such boundaries and under such names as shall seem fit, two separate single districts, called proclaimed districts under the said Act; and all subdivisions of the district so separated shall cease to exist: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, 1862, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Swan Hill Road District": And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the eighteenth day of March, 1863, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names appears on the voters' roll for the said district, setting forth the matters and things required by the above-recited Act:

And whereas for the reasons stated in the said petition, it is deemed expedient to sever the said district into two separate single districts: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby sever into two parts the said Swan Hill Road District, and do constitute such parts two separate single districts, called "Proclaimed Districts," under the said Act, with the boundaries and under the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

**THE EAST LODDON ROAD DISTRICT.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of the Loddon River, due west of the north-west angle of the Marong Road District; thence northerly by the centre of the Loddon River to a point opposite the north-west angle of the parish of Jarklan, county unnamed; thence by a direct east line to the centre of Mount Hope Creek; thence southerly by the centre of Mount Hope Creek to a point due north of the north-west angle of the Campaspe Road District; thence by a line south to the said north-west angle of the Campaspe Road District; thence due west to the commencing point.

**THE SWAN HILL ROAD DISTRICT.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of the Loddon River, west of the north-west angle of the parish of Jarklan, county unnamed; thence by a direct line west to the centre of the Avoca River; thence north by the centre of the Avoca River to the L'Albert Creek; thence northerly by the centre of L'Albert Creek to the north-east angle of the Mount Jeffcott Road District; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the Mount Jeffcott Road District to the eastern boundary of the Horsham Road District; thence north by the eastern boundary of the Horsham road district to the north-east angle of said road district; thence westerly by the north boundary of the last-named road district to the western boundary of the colony of Victoria; thence north by the western boundary of said colony to the south bank of the River Murray; thence easterly by the south bank of the River Murray to the junction of the Yaluk Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the Yaluk and Nannilla Creeks to the Kow Swamp; thence by the eastern side of the Kow Swamp to the centre of Mount Hope Creek; thence southerly by the centre of Mount Hope Creek to a point due east of the north-west angle of the parish of Jarklan; thence by a direct line west to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

#### THE SHIRE OF AVOCA.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight  
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of  
Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of December instant, a district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Avoca United Road District": And whereas the area of the said united district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Avoca United Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

#### THE SHIRE OF AVOCA.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## THE BOROUGH OF CRAIGIE.

*At the Government House, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of December, 1864.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Major-General Chute	Mr. Verdon
Mr. McCulloch	Mr. Hervey
Mr. Michie	Mr. Grant
Mr. Higinbotham	Mr. Sullivan

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geelong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition, praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as thereinafter mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough" thereafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act; provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof: And whereas a petition in accordance with the provisions of the said Act has been presented to the Governor, and notice of such petition has been duly given in the *Government Gazette* of the twentieth day of September now last past: And whereas a petition presented to the Governor in the manner allowed and prescribed by the said Act, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition first above mentioned, has been found not to represent the majority of inhabitant-householders: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, constitute the district hereinafter described a borough within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name and the boundaries of the said borough in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BOROUGH OF CRAIGIE.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the boundary of the borough of Carisbrook; thence west forty-seven chains; thence south crossing main road to Amherst, and proceeding along the east side of government road three miles twenty-eight chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of portion fifteen, section two, parish of Craigie; thence east crossing a government road two miles twenty-seven chains, more or less, to a government road; thence north on the west side of same road, proceeding along the east side of the township of Majorca, crossing the main road to Castlemaine, three miles twenty-eight chains, more or less, to a point on the south side of government road; thence west one mile sixty chains, crossing the Mount Greenock Creek, also main road to Carisbrook, and proceeding along the boundary of the borough of Carisbrook to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

5.
