Third—That when such reference has been made, such committee will determine and report to the Legislative Council that the said Nicholas Fitzgerald was at the time of said election not qualified to be elected a member for said North-Western Province, and that your Petitioner was duly elected as a member to serve in the Legislative Council for the said North-Western Province, and that said return be amended by striking out therefrom the name of the said Nicholas Fitzgerald and substituting instead thereof the name of your Petitioner, and that your Petitioner may make the declaration required by law as a member of said Council and may take his seat accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION...

By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

Where Eas by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he shall have received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names shall appear upon some voters' roll for a single district or any one or more subdivisions thereof, setting forth that by reason of the great extent of such district, or remoteness of the part wherein such petitioners reside from other parts thereof, and of the diversity of the industry and interests of such part from those of the remainder thereof (of the truth of which allegations, and the grounds thereof, the Governor in Council alone shall judge), it is expedient to constitute the two parts of such district so differently affected, two separate single districts, to constitute accordingly such parts with such boundaries and under such names as shall seem fit, two separate single districts, called proclaimed districts under the said Act; and all subdivisions of the district so separated shall cease to exist! And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, 1862, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Swan Hill Road District." And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the eighteenth day of March, 1833, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names appears on the voters' roll for the said district, setting forth the matters and things required by the above-recited Act:

And whereas for the reasons stated in the said petition, it is deemed expedient to sever the said district into two separate single districts: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, vith the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby sever into two parts the said Swan Hill Road District, and do constitute such parts two separate single districts, called "Proclaimed Districts," under the said Act, with the boundaries and under the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE EAST LODDON ROAD DISTRIGT. — Commencing at a point in the centre of the Loddon River, due west of the northwest angle of the Marong Road District; thence northerly by the centre of the Loddon River to a point opposite the northwest angle of the parish of Jarklan, county unnamed; thence by a direct east line to the centre of Mount Hope Creek to a point due north of the north-west angle of the Campaspe Road District; thence by a line south to the said north-west angle of the Campaspe Road District; thence by a line south to the said north-west angle of the Campaspe Road District; thence due west to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by The Municipal Corporations Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geolone, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borouch in manner next thereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition, praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition as thereinafter mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough" thereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act; provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof.
