At the Government House, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of December, 1864.

Mr. Higinbotham | Mr. Sullivan WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, inituted, An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to give such district some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof, and also again to abolish any such district, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries thereof, and also again to abolish any such district, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries thereof into the Governor in Council, bearing date the fourth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the several districts therein mentioned were erected into mining districts: And whereas it is expedient to alter the mining district of Ballarat: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the said mining district of Ballarat, and doth define the limits and boundaries thereof to be as follow, that is to say:—

be elected within and for every such division, and from time to
time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries
thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be
elected within and for every such division, but so that the total
number of members elected for such district shall in no case
exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by an Order of the
Governor in Council, made on the fourth day of January, 1858,
the several mining districts were split into the divisions and
the number of members for each division was determined as
therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter certain
of the divisions of the mining district of Ballarat; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of
the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter three
of the divisions of the said mining district of Ballarat, and doth
define the limits and boundaries of each of the divisions thereof
to be those referred to or described in the second column of the
schedule hereto annexed opposite to the names of such respectivo divisions, and doth determine that the number of members
of the mining board of such district which shall be elected
within and for every such division shall be that set immediately
