THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT ALTERED.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of December, 1864.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to give such district some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof, and also again to abolish any such district, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the fourth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the several districts therein mentioned were erected into mining districts: And whereas it is expedient to alter the mining district of Ballarat: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the said mining district of Ballarat, and doth define the limits and boundaries thereof to be as follow, that is to say:—

Commencing at the source of the Emu Creek; thence southwards by the Emu Creek to the south-western angle of the Borriyalloak East pre-emptive section; thence southerly by a line to the source of the Saltwater or Durnamarook Creek; thence by that creek to its mouth; thence by the western and northern shores of Lake Gnarpurt and a line easterly to the south-western angle of the township of Foxhow, on the northern shore of Lake Korangamite; thence by the northern and eastern shores of Lake Korangamite to a point forming the junction of the northern and western boundaries of the county of Polwarth; thence by the western boundary of the county of Polwarth to the sea-coast; thence easterly and north-easterly by the sea-coast to the mouth of the River Werribee; thence by the River Werribee to its junction with the Djerriwarrah Creek; thence by the Djerriwarrah Creek to its source near Mount Bullancrook; thence by the Bullancrook Range to the Main Dividing Range; thence by the Main Dividing Range westerly to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by the range dividing the Bullarook and Joyce's Creeks to a point due east of the junction of the Bullarook and Bullarook Creeks; thence by a line bearing west to the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount Greenock Creek to its source; and thence by the Main Dividing Range westerly to the commencing point aforesaid.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE DIVISIONS OF THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of December, 1864.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the fourth day of January, 1858, the several mining districts were split into the divisions and the number of members for each division was determined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter certain of the divisions of the mining district of Ballarat: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter three of the divisions of the said mining district of Ballarat, and doth define the limits and boundaries of each of the divisions thereof to be those referred to or described in the second column of the schedule hereto annexed opposite to the names of such respective divisions, and doth determine that the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division shall be that set immediately under the name of each such division, that is to say:—

BALLARAT ... Three members	As described in the Order of the Governor in Council of the fourth day of January, A.D. 1858.
BUNINYONG ... Two members	Commencing at a point about three and a half miles north of the south-west angle of the Buninyong Racecourse, county of Grenville; thence easterly about two and a half miles to a point on the main line of road between the township of Buninyong and

BUNINYONG — <i>continued.</i>	Sebastopol; thence north-easterly about two miles to a point on the main line of road between the township of Buninyong and Ballarat, about two and a half miles north-westerly from the northern boundary of the township of Buninyong; thence by a line bearing east about seven and a half miles to the Lal-lal Rivulet; thence southerly by the Lal-lal Rivulet and a line bearing south about three and a half miles to Williamson's Creek; thence southerly by Williamson's Creek and the River Yarrowee to the River Barwon; thence by the River Barwon and the Salt Creek to the sea-coast; thence south-westerly and westerly by the sea-coast to the western boundary of the county of Polwarth; thence by the western boundary of the county of Polwarth to a point forming the junction of the northern and western boundaries of the county of Polwarth, on the eastern shore of Lake Korangamite; thence by the eastern shore of Lake Korangamite to the mouth of the Woody Yaloak Creek; and thence by the Woody Yaloak Creek and a line northerly to the commencing point aforesaid.
CRESWICK ... <i>One member</i>	As described in the Order of the Governor in Council of the fourth day of January, A.D. 1858.
SMYTHE'S CREEK <i>Two members</i>	Commencing at a point about three and a half miles north of the south-west angle of the Buninyong Racecourse, county of Grenville; thence southerly to the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence by the Woody Yaloak Creek to its mouth; thence by the eastern and northern shores of Lake Korangamite to the south-western angle of the township of Foxhow; thence by a line westerly to Lake Gnarpurt; thence by the northern and western shores of Lake Gnarpurt to the Saltwater or Durnamarook Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence by a line northerly to the south-western angle of the Borriyalloak East pre-emptive section, on the Emu Creek; thence by the Emu Creek to its junction with the Springhill Creek; thence by a line easterly to Lake Burrumbeet, near the source of Baillie's Creek; thence by the shores of that lake to the mouth of the Burrumbeet Creek; and thence by a line south-easterly to the commencing point aforesaid.
BLACKWOOD ... <i>One member</i>	As described in the Order of the Governor in Council of the fourth day of January, A.D. 1858.

STRIGLITZ ... <i>One member</i>	Commencing at the western source of the Lal-lal Rivulet; thence southerly by the Lal-lal Rivulet about eleven and a half miles; thence by a line bearing south about three and a half miles to Williamson's Creek; thence by Williamson's Creek and the River Yarrowee to the River Barwon; thence by the River Barwon and the Salt Creek to the sea-coast; thence north-easterly by the sea-coast to the mouth of the River Werribee; thence by the River Werribee to Ballan; thence by a line west to the range separating the waters of the Rivers Werribee and Moorabool; thence by that range and the Main Dividing Range to the commencing point aforesaid.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
