By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS the Councils of the City of Melbourne and of Certain Boroughs and the District Boards of certain Road Districts have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along roads hereinafter mentioned being common to their own respective districts with the districts in which tolls are payable upon such roads, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of The Local Government Act, 1863: Now, therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the roads and portions of roads hereinafter mentioned to be Common-toll roads, or the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:—

The portion of the road known as "The Point Nepean Road," extending from the northern boundary of the borough of Brighton and Moorabbin road district. The portion of the road known as "The Mount Alexander Road," extending from the castern boundary of the Lauriston and Edgecombe road district to the eastern boundary of the Lauriston and Edgecombe road district to the eastern boundary of the Lauriston and Edgecombe, the Glenlyon, the Fryers, and the Metcalfe road districts.

The portion of the road known as "The Sydney Road," extending northwards one mile from the northern limit of the Willowmavin road district, and the portion of the road known as "The same place to the township of Pyalong, shall be Common-toll roads of the Willowmavin road district, and the Pyalong road district.

The road known as "The Western Port Road," extending from the northern boundary of the Dandenong road district to the south-eastern boundary of the Cranbourne road district shall be a Common-toll road of the Dandenong road district and the Cranbourne road district.

The portion of the road known as "The Point Nepean Road," extending from the south side of Flinders street, in the city of Melbourne, by Prince's Bridge, to the northern boundary of the borough of Brighton, and the portion of the road known as "The Dandenong Road," extending from its intersection with the Brighton road to the eastern boundary, of the Caulfield road district, shall be Common-toll roads of the city of Melbourne, the boroughs of St. Kilda and Prahran, and the Caulfield road district.

RULES OF THE EAST COLLINGWOOD RIFLE CORPS. Passed at a Meeting of the Corps, held at the Orderly Room, Vere street, East Collingwood, Friday, 15th January, 1864.

MEETINGS OF THE CORPS.

At any meeting of the corps the senior officer present shall

1. At any meeting of the corps the senior officer present shall take the chair.

2. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members. No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps, and it shall have been called by advertisement inserted in one of the daily papers, or circulars issued to the member four (4) days previous to the day of meeting.

3. The committee shall consist of twelve (12) members including the secretary; the election of committee to take place annually, in the month of January.

FINES.

Any member appearing on parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accourtements dirty or unserviceable from neglect, may be fined by the officer in command the sum of One shilling (1s.).

5. Any member changing his permanent address, must give notice of the same to the officer commanding, in writing, within fourteen (14) days; and if he fail to do so, shall be lined the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

6. That no member's name be received as present on parade if twenty, (20) minutes after the appointed time of meeting; and all excuses for absence from parade muster must be in writing, and must be at the orderly room, or other place appointed, before the end of the month in which the absence occurred.

7. A list of all fines imposed in any month shall be signed by the officer commanding, or by his authority, and be posted in the orderly room, or other place appointed, on or before the tenth (10th) of the following month.

8. All fines must be paid to the sergeants in charge of squads, within the month on the tenth (10th) of which they are posted.

9. An account of all fines as incurred and received shall be kept in a book, which shall be open to inspection in the orderly room.

LIABILITIES INCUERED BY THE CORPS FOR MEMBERS.

LIABILITIES INCURRED BY THE CORPS FOR MEMBERS.

10. An account shall be kept by the secretary between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective.

11. If on the first of January in any year a member's debit exceed his credit by. One pound (£1) or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the officer commanding may at his discretion remit one-half or the whole of the fine: the amount paid under this rule shall be placed in the book to the credit of the member paying it.

12. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount of more than Ten shillings (10s.) whereby his debit exceeds his credit; provided that no such fine shall exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the whole may at the discretion of the commanding officer be remitted.

RULES OF THE WILLIAMSTOWN COMPANY, R.V.V.A. 1. The senior officer present shall at any meeting take the

chair.

2. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve members. No meeting to be convened unless notice of such shall have been given at a parade of the corps held at

of such shall have been given at a parade of the corps held at least four days previous.

3. Any member appearing at parade or company drill with uniform arms, or accoutrements dirty or unserviceable, or who may be guilty of talking in the ranks, or other inattention, will be liable to a fine of One shilling.

4. Any member failing to attend fewer than two parades in each month, must send to the commanding officer, in writing, before the termination of the month in which such absence occurred, a reason or excuse for such absence.

5. An account of all fines incurred and paid will be kept in a book which shall be open to inspection. Fines to be paid to the sergeants of squads or sections within four weeks after the month in which they were incurred.

6. The officer commanding shall detail the duties for the month, and any officer or non-commissioned officer failing to attend his turn of duty, shall be fined Two shillings and sixpence.

7. After 1864 no member shall be allowed to compete for com-

7. After 1864 no member shall be allowed to compete for company prizes, whether rifle shooting, bayonet exercise, or gun drill, unless he is qualified as an effective, and has duly liquidated whatever claims may be recorded against him.

8. An account shall be kept for each member, showing his liabilities for drill instruction and uniform, and crediting him with the amount he has earned as an effective.

9. If on the 1st of January in each year a member's debit exceeds his credit by Ten shillings or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference should such amount not exceed Two pounds; but the officer commanding may at his discretion remit the whole or portion of the fine. Amounts paid under this rule will be placed to the credit of members paying such.

10. If any member should at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the aniount, if more than Ten shillings, whereby the debit exceeds his credit; provided that no fine shall exceed Two pounds, and that the whole, or any portion, may, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be remitted.

11. The business of the corps shall be managed by the commissioned officers and four others, which four shall be annually elected by the company. The secretary to be an ex afficion member.

12. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding, or adding

Rules and Regulations adopted by the Sandridge Company of Naval Volunteers.

1. Each candidate for admission to the corps shall be proposed and seconded in writing by members of the corps, and his name and address shall be read at the next weekly parado of the corps, to give an opportunity to any member to object to his admission. admission.

Any member changing his permanent address must, within thirty days, give notice of the same in writing, through the drill instructor, to the commanding officer of the company, under a penalty of One shilling.

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3. Any member being absent from his usual address for a period of more than fourteen days, must give a satisfactory reason for so absenting himself to the commanding officer of the company, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence.

4. Any member being absent from his district of enrolment more than one month at any one time, unless good and sufficient cause for the same shall be shown, shall be considered to have retired from the corps, and must pay all arrears, and return his accountements, uniform, &c.

5. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniformshall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accountements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any respect unserviceable from neglect, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One shilling.

6. A general meeting of the company shall be held in the first week of June and December respectively, of which one week's notice shall be given in the drill room and local papers.

Year's notice shall be given in the drill room and local papers.

7. The commanding difficer of the company may at any time convene a special general meeting.

8. On a requisition being signed by not less than twenty members, the commanding officer of the company must call a special general meeting.

9. Seven days' notice shall be given of every special general meeting, and no business shall be transacted unless at least one-third of the company be present.

10. At every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman. No person shall be permitted to speak to any question more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover of a resolution, who will be entitled to reply. All motions shall be delivered to the chairman in writing, and shall be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two or more members. No protest shall be received, and no meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved, without a motion for that purpose.

11. At every half-yearly meeting a committee consisting of seven members, of whom one shall be a commissioned officer, five to form a quorm, shall be chosen by ballot, to audit and settle the accounts of the company, and generally to take into consideration any matters connected with the company that may be referred to them by the commanding officer; the secretary and treasurer to be elected by the committee from the members of the same.

memoers of the same.

12. The commanding officer of the company shall at all times have access to the meetings of committee.

13. A book shall be kept called the "Fine Book," in which all fines shall be entered, and signed by the commanding officer. A separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the treasurer. This book shall be accessible to any member when required: to any member when required:

14. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the treasurer within fourteen days of its notification to him.

15. A list of all claims against members of the company shall e made monthly and kept in view in the orderly room.

16. The treasurer is to receive all moneys accruing from fines, on account of the company, and vouchers for all disbursements are to be submitted to the first committee meeting following such disbursements.

17. When seven days' notice is given for a general inspection of arms by a staff officer, members failing to attend, or forward their accourrements for inspection, will be subject to a fine of One shilling.

18. Any member wearing any portion of his uniform, unless for parade purposes, except by permission of the commanding officer, shall be subject to a fine of One shilling for the first offence, to be doubled for every succeeding offence.

offence, to be doubled for every succeeding offence.

19. No person shall be allowed to vote, or take part in the proceedings at any meeting, who is not at the time an "effective" member of the company, or who shall be in arrear in the payment of his subscriptions for the period of more than three mouths, or who shall have any unpaid fine or penalty recorded against him. This rule not to apply to members newly joined, who shall have passed recruit and gun drills.

20. An account shall be kept by the officer commanding between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective.

effective.

21. If, on the 1st January in any year, a member's debit exceed his credit by One pound (£1) or unwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the officer commanding may at his discretion enforce only one-half of the fine. The amount paid under this rule shall be placed to the credit of the member paying it.

22. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount, if more than Ten shillings (105.), whereby his debit exceeds his credit; provided that no such fine shall exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the whole or the half may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.

23. Any member desirous of altering, rescinding, or adding

23. Any member desirous of altering, rescinding, or adding any bye-law, must give fourteen days' notice, in writing, to the commanding officer of the company, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, resolsion, or addition, to be hung up in the orderly room.

24. It shall not be competent to recommend to His Excellency the Governor any alteration, rescision, or addition to the existing rules of the company, unless such shall have been agreed to at a general meeting by an absolute majority of the company.
