By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places or districts within the said colony of Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor thereof shall appoint; and that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter, and vary as the said Lieutenant Governor shall think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that a Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden at the place and in and for the district hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

A Court of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden at Inglewood and shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Inglewood, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, viz:— Commencing on the Loddon River at the north-west angle of the village reserve at Laanecoorie; thence by the River Loddon to its junction with an anabranch of the Murray River; thence by the Rivers Loddon and Murray to the western boundary of the town reserve of Castle Donnington; thence by a line southerly to the Avoca River on the south shore of Lake Bael Bael; thence by the River Avoca southerly to a point west from the north-west angle of the village reserve of Laanecoorie; and thence by a line east to the point of commencement.

SEVERANCE OF A FARMERS' COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of each shire shall, in the place and stead of the Board of Land and Works, alone have control over all farmers' commons and temporary commons for the use of selectors of lands, such commons respectively being within the shire and proclaimed under the Act numbered cxlv., and over all farmers' commons within the meaning of the Act numbered cxvii., within the shire; and it is also enacted, that in all cases in which part only of any such common as hereinbefore mentioned shall be situated within any shire, the Governor in Council may order that the whole of such common either shall be and be deemed included in, or shall be and be deemed excluded from such shire, or else may order that the several parts of such common so lying within and without such shire respectively shall be separate commons, and such common shall to all intents and purposes be deemed to be either within or without such shire, or such several parts thereof to be separate commons according to the tenor of such order: And whereas the farmers' common described or mentioned in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-fifth day of February, 1861, and the fourteenth day of September, 1863, under the designation of "The Glendaruel, Ascot, Tourello, Beckworth, Addington, Spring Hill, Smeaton, Creswick, Glengower, Eglinton, &c., Farmers' Common" is situate partly within and partly without the shire of Creswick, and it is expedient that such portions situate as aforesaid should be separate commons: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do order and proclaim that the several parts of the farmers' common hereinbefore mentioned shall be separate commons, and be designated and subject to the control hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The part of the said farmers' common situate within the shire of Creswick shall be a separate common under the designation of "The Creswick, Spring Hill, and Smeaton Farmers' Common," and subject to the control of the council of the said shire.

The remaining part of the said farmers' common shall be a separate common under the designation of "The Glendaruel, Ascot, and Tourello Farmers' Common," and subject to the control of the council of the shire of Ballarat.

ST. KILDA VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY CORPS.

RULES.

1. An annual meeting of the corps shall be held in the month of January in each year, of which one week's notice shall be given, at which the civil staff, consisting of the commissioned officers, five members of the corps, and a secretary and treasurer, shall be appointed (of whom three shall form a quorum), who shall audit the accounts, manage and dispose of the funds of the corps, and generally take into consideration any matters connected with the corps which may be referred to them by the officer commanding.

2. The officer commanding the corps may at any time convene a general meeting, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members, at which no rule or bye-law shall be passed

unless three days' notice by advertisement or circular shall have been given. At every meeting the senior officer present shall preside. Twenty to form a quorum.

3. All members changing their permanent address must, within fourteen days, give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding, under the penalty of Five shillings.

4. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of such intention, in writing, to the officer commanding, and deposit his arms, accoutrements, and uniform, in a place to be appointed by the officer commanding, under a penalty of Ten shillings.

5. At every parade, on the roll being called, any member not answering to his name or number shall be deemed absent, unless a sufficient reason shall be forwarded to the officer commanding before the end of the month. Any member coming late, and assigning a reason for so doing which is deemed sufficient by the officer commanding, shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

6. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing, shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence for each offence.

7. Any member guilty of talking or other irregularities on parade, will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence.

8. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

9. Any member not producing his arms for inspection when called upon to do so, will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence.

10. A list of all fines imposed in any month, and which have not been previously paid, shall be signed by the officer commanding, and posted in the orderly room, or other place appointed, on the 1st of the following month.

11. All fines must be paid to the drill instructor, or other person appointed by the officer commanding, within one month of being posted; and the person so receiving such fines shall hand them over to the treasurer, who shall keep an account and submit the same for inspection half-yearly or whenever deemed advisable.

12. An account shall be kept by the officer commanding between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective, and in January of each year a statement shall be exhibited showing the individual value to the corps of each effective.

13. If on the 1st of January in any year a member's debit exceed his credit by One pound (£1) or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the officer commanding may remit the whole or any part of such fine, or defer the payment of it for one year.

14. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount if more than Two shillings (10s.) whereby his debit exceeds his credit; provided that no such fine shall exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the whole or any part of such fine may at the discretion of the officer commanding be remitted.

15. If any member wishes to transfer to another corps, the officer commanding the corps to which transfer is desired must pay to the credit of this corps the value of his uniform at the time of transfer, or in default thereof the member so desiring to be transferred shall, previous to transfer, be made to pay a proportionate amount for the same, according to the length of time such uniform shall have been worn.

16. Every member joining the corps to be supplied with a copy of these rules and regulations.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—STANDING ORDERS TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

1. The business of the council at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

2. The council shall commence business so soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum directed by law, but if at the expiry of an hour from the time specified there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the council at the meeting; and the names of all councillors present shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.

3. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the council, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. The reading and ordering on reports of special committees and of officers, and the reading of memorials, shall follow the correspondence.

5. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and be presented by a member of the council, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition or memorial no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given as hereinafter provided, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

7. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received *pro forma*, and if ordered by the council, printed for distribution among the councillors, to be considered at any subsequent meeting.

8. If, in the report of a committee, there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the council has been taken separately on each.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration; any councillor may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary at least four clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, in writing, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

11. No bye-law shall be made save by a "special order" of the council, as provided for by sections 133 and 174 of Act of Parliament No. 176.

12. No motion in which it is proposed to take action on any petition, or in which it is proposed to adopt any address or standing order, shall be entertained, unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition or standing order; and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon, and the mover of every such proposition shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

13. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

14. Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and obtain signatures of the mover and seconder.

15. It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration, and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten shillings, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council; the fines to be applied by the council to charitable purposes.

16. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary shall enter in the minute book the names of the councillors who voted thereon, and specify whether such councillors voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

17. All reports sent in to the council by any councillor or councillors thereof, or by any officer of the council, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left, so that they can be properly bound together.

18. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment, shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

19. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

20. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as

the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the president shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion of amendment. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

21. The president when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final *pro hac vice* in each case.

22. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up when addressing the council in discussion of any question.

23. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being used.

24. Any councillor may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the question or matter in discussion.

25. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon, but not more.

26. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

27. The president shall, on taking the votes on any motion or amendment, put the first question in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority, and the council shall vote in all cases by show of hands. Provided always that if at any such meeting there shall be an equality of votes in the election of the president, it shall be decided by lot which of the councillors having an equal number of votes shall be the president.

28. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

29. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the councillor or councillors protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered, before the next regular meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the council, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

30. A notice of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency, where the council considers it necessary to do so, there being not more than one councillor absent at such council meeting.

31. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.
