ADDITIONAL REGULATION UNDER "THE LAND ACT, 1862."

REFERRING to the Regulations relating to the issue of licenses by or under the authority of the Board of Land and Works for occupation of Crown Lands under the 53rd clause of *The Land Act, 1862*, published under date of 1st July, 1862, the Governor in Council has approved of the following additional regulation relating to the occupation of Crown Lands under such licenses, viz.:—

The right to occupy and use Crown Lands under license for any of the purposes specified in the first division of the before-mentioned regulations will cease if the prescribed fees, payable in advance, be not paid within fourteen days after the date when such licenses should be renewed.

Notice to this effect will be given by the Board of Land and Works in the *Government Gazette* to the holders of licenses who fail to make the required payments of fees in due time, and that if the fees in arrear be not paid within fourteen days after the publication of such notice, their right of occupation under license will be liable to be forfeited, and the lands will be re-let by the Board of Land and Works, or otherwise appropriated.

COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase, diminish, and abolish the commons as hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

EURAMBEEN TEMPORARY COMMON.—The Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of September, 1863, constituting a temporary common for selectors of land in the agricultural area of Strath Service, under the above-mentioned designation, is hereby revoked, and the said common is hereby abolished accordingly. (63.H.7953.)

REDBANK GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The common described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the fourteenth day of September, 1863, under the above-mentioned designation, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom fourteen hundred acres, being the portion of the common comprised in the "Ranges Run" contiguous to the homestead of Messrs. Hines and Barnes, the occupiers of that run. (63.H.12011.)

SUNBURY TOWN COMMON.—The town common described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, under the designation of Sunbury, and consisting of five hundred and four acres, more or less, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Sunbury, as shown on a plan deposited in the Lands and Survey Office, Melbourne. (63.H.11290.)

COMMON-TOLL ROADS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Councils of the City of Melbourne and of certain Boroughs have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along roads hereinafter mentioned being common to their own respective districts with the districts in which tolls are payable upon such roads, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the roads hereinafter mentioned to be Common-toll roads, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to common-toll roads, viz.:—

The road known as "The Brighton Road," extending from the south side of Flinders street, in the city of Melbourne, to the southern boundary of the borough of St. Kilda, shall be a Common-toll road of the city of Melbourne and of the boroughs of St. Kilda and Prahran.

The road known as "The Gardiner's Creek Road," extending from the south side of Flinders street, across Prince's bridge, in the city of Melbourne, to the eastern boundary of the borough of Prahran, shall be a Common-toll road of the said city of Melbourne and borough of Prahran.

The road known as "The Sandridge Road," extending from the south side of Flinders street, in the city of Melbourne, across Prince's bridge to the Town Pier at Sandridge, shall be a Common-toll road of the city of Melbourne and of the boroughs of Emerald Hill and Sandridge.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if any borough and any road district shall adjoin each other and form with the boundaries thereof respectively one continuous area, or if any borough shall lie surrounded by any road district, and if the council of such borough and the board of such road district be desirous that such borough and such road district be formed into one united district under the said Act, the same may be done in like manner and with the like effect in all respects as is thereinbefore provided with regard to the union of two or more road districts; and for the purpose of such union such borough shall be deemed to have been a district, and the several wards thereof, if any, to have been subdivisions, under the said Act, and the several provisions of the said Act shall apply to the same accordingly: And whereas the borough of Maldon lies surrounded by the Baringhup road district, and the council of the said borough and the board of the said road district have by a petition under the respective common seals of the said council and board prayed the Governor in Council, in manner provided by the 12th clause of the said Act, that the said borough and road district shall be constituted one united district: And whereas it seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an Order in Council this day, constituting the said borough and road district one district as hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the constitution of the said Borough of Maldon and Baringhup Road District to be one district under the said Act, by the name in and by the said Order in Council assigned to the same, that is to say:—

THE MALDON UNITED ROAD DISTRICT.

MAIN ROADS UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, has, by Orders in Council, severally made on the 28th and 31st days of December, 1863, appointed the parts of roads hereinafter mentioned to be main roads, upon the application of the boards of road districts, made in accordance with the 219th clause of the said Act, viz.:-

The deaths which occurred during the month numbered 1 less than those in October, and 84 less than the average of the month of November during the last four years. It will be observed that the mean temperature was lower by a degree, and the mean atmospheric pressure by the tenth of an inch than they were in the same month in either of the three previous years.

Males and females died during the month in the respective proportions of 56 and 44 per cent. Deaths of persons over five were still in excess of those of children under that age, the numbers being respectively 106 and 94, and the per centages 53 and 47.

Twelve deaths occurred on the 2nd, which was the day of highest mortality. Only 2 deaths were recorded on the 8th, 14th, 27th, and 30th respectively.

One octogenarian, a male, died during the month of old age. No other death of a person above 75 years of age was recorded during the month.

Seventeen violent deaths were reported during the month, and occurred thus:—A baker aged 33, a boy of 12, another of 7, and one of 5½ years of age, were accidentally drowned, a female aged 53 died of burns received whilst intoxicated, a boy aged 8½ also died of burns, a child of 3 years and another of 10 months old died of scalds, a dairyman aged 25 died in consequence of having

fractured his spine when fighting, a laborer aged 31 died of a broken neck, a printer aged 65 of fracture of the left femur, a farmer aged 65 of laceration of the leg, a mariner aged 29 of rupture of the urethra, a laborer aged 56 was crushed to death in Gertrude street, Collingwood. Two males and a female were judicially hanged.

The deaths in public institutions were 42 in number, or 21 per cent. of the total mortality: 27 occurred in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Immigration Hospital, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 5 in the Central Gaol.

Of the 94 children who died under the age of five, 49, or 52 per cent., were males, and 45, or 48 per cent., were females; 55 were under one year old, 14 were between one and two years, 10 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, 4 were between four and five.

Of the 106 deaths of persons beyond five years of age, 63, or about 59 per cent., were of males, and 43, or nearly 41 per cent., were of females; of those who died, 7 were between five and ten years of age, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 10 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 9 were between forty and forty-five, 5 were between forty-five and fifty, 4 were between fifty and fifty-five, 7 were between fifty-five and sixty, 4 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 1 was between seventy and seventy-five, and 1 was eighty-one years of age.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only; and if all be included in one tender, it will be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenderers may offer for the manure at each station at per cwt.; manure to be removed as may be arranged with the officer in charge, and the value of the manure will be deducted from the account for forage.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be drawn at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats, 20 lbs. for bran, and 54 lbs. for maize, including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

The net weight only after deducting the tare is to be charged.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street; or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran and maize to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1864.

BYE-LAW NO. 64.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE ELECTION OF THREE BOROUGH MANAGERS FOR THE CASTLEMAINE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD FIELDS COMMON.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 25 Victoria No. 145, sec. 69, it is provided that the municipal council of any municipal district shall elect annually, in such manner as they may respectively by bye-law prescribe, three persons to be managers of such town or municipal common, and may at any time remove any one or more of such managers and elect others in their stead: And whereas in section No. 71 in the said Act of Council it is provided that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of the United Town and Gold Fields Common: And whereas His Excellency the Governor did, on the 2nd February, 1863, proclaim the Castlemaine Town and Gold Fields Commons to be a common under the name of the United Town and Gold Fields Common of Castlemaine, for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the Borough of Castlemaine, that the election of the Borough Managers for the United Town and Gold Fields Common of Castlemaine shall take place in the following manner:—That no person shall be nominated or elected as manager without his assent shall be given to the town clerk, in writing, at least three days before the meeting of the council at which the election of manager or managers is to take place. That all meetings of the council for the election of managers shall be specially convened for that purpose. That if the number of candidates proposed at the said meeting shall not exceed the number of managers then to be elected, the candidates so proposed shall be declared to be duly elected; but if the number of candidates shall exceed the number of managers to be elected, then the chairman shall forthwith call for a show of hands separately in favor of each candidate, and the person or persons in whose favor the show of hands shall have been given shall be declared to be the manager or managers of the United Town and Gold Fields Common of Castlemaine. That in all cases of equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote.

That Daniel Wallace, Esq., M.C., Frederick Gingell, Esq., M.C., and John Slattery, Esq., be the managers from this date until November next, and that the annual election of three managers shall take place in the month of November in each following year.
