THE BYLANDS AND GLENBURNIE ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight
Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall possess property rateable under the said Act within the area next hereinafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof, to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new road district; and the words "proclaimed district" where used in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district: And whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable property in such area, has been signed and presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and due notice of such petition has been published as provided by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof, an Order in Council, bearing even date herewith, has been made, to constitute the said area a new road district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say:—

THE BYLANDS AND GLENBURNIE ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Glenburnie; thence southerly and easterly by the northern boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of portion 107 A in the parish of Broadford; thence by a line to the nearest point of the Sunday Creek; thence by the Sunday Creek southerly and easterly to the south-eastern angle of Linton's pre-emptive right; thence due south to the boundary of the county of Bourke; thence northerly and westerly by the said county boundary to the boundary of the parish of Bylands; thence southerly, westerly, and northerly by the eastern, southern, and western

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boundaries of the said parish to the north-west angle of the village reserve in the parish of Bylands; thence east by the northern boundary of the said reserve to the west boundary of section CXVIII. in the same parish; thence northerly by the western boundaries of sections CXVI. and CXI. to the western boundary of the parish of Bylands; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of the said parish to the south-east angle of the Kilmore special survey; thence northerly by the east boundary of the said survey to its north-east angle; thence west by the northern boundary of the Kilmore special survey to the south-west angle of portion 13, in the parish of Glenburnie; thence northerly by the west boundary of the parish of Glenburnie to the commencing point, excluding the Borough and Town, Common of Kilmore.—(64,629.)
