### ADMISSION OF ATTORNEYS.

THE following General Rule of the Supreme Court of Victoria has been laid before both Houses of Parliament, and is now published in accordance with the provisions of the Act 15 Victoria No. 10.

## IN THE SUPREME COURT OF VICTORIA.

### REGULA GENERALIS.

Dated the fifteenth day of October, A.D. 1863.

That the 19th Rule of Chapter II. of the present Rules of Court be repealed, and that the words "or for attorneys" and "or as an attorney" and "twenty-one" in Certificate A, the words "or attorneys" and "or as an attorney" and "or attorneys" in Certificate B, and the words "or as an attorney, solicitor, and proctor," and "or attorneys" in Certificate C, in the schedule to such chapter, be struck out of such certificates, and that in lieu of the said 19th rule it be ordered as follows:—

### RULE 19.

#### Examination of Candidates for admission as Attorneys.

That every person applying to be admitted to practise as an attorney, solicitor, and proctor in the said court, not previously admitted as an attorney, solicitor, or writer to the signet, in any one of the Queen's superior courts of record in Great Britain or Ireland, must be a natural-born or naturalized British subject, of the full age of twenty-one years, of good fame and character, and shall have been articled to an attorney or solicitor of any one of the Queen's superior courts of record in Great Britain or Ireland, or to a writer to the signet in Scotland, or to some practising attorney or solicitor in this or any other colony of Great Britain, and shall have served the full term of five years under such articles, or who having been so articled to one, and having served for any period of time, shall complete the residue of the full term of five years either as articled clerk to another attorney or solicitor or writer to the signet, or who having been articled and having served as aforesaid in this or any other colony of Great Britain, shall complete the residue of the full term of five years as articled clerk to any attorney or solicitor of any one of the Queen's superior courts of record in Great Britain or Ireland, or with a writer to the signet in Scotland, or with any other attorney or solicitor in this or any other colony of Great Britain, or who shall have served the full term of five years as associate to any one of the judges.

And every such person who shall not have entered into articles of clerkship before the fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord 1863, or whose articles of clerkship entered into with any attorney, solicitor, or writer to the signet elsewhere, shall

not have been assigned to any attorney, solicitor, or proctor of the said court before the said fifteenth day of October, in the year aforesaid, must, before he enter into such articles, or before such assignment, produce to the board of examiners of the Supreme Court for attorneys a certificate of his having passed at some matriculation examination in the University of Melbourne in six at least of the subjects fixed for the time being by the statutes and regulations of the said university for the matriculation examination, of which subjects Greek or Latin must be one; and must lodge with the said board a copy of such certificate; and must also, after he enter into his articles of clerkship, pass two other examinations, with an interval of one year between each, in the subjects of law and history, fixed for the time being by the said statutes and regulations for the two first years of the course of study for the degree of bachelor of laws.

And every such person must, after the expiration of his articles of clerkship and before he apply for admission to practise in the Supreme Court, also submit to be examined by the said board of examiners of the Supreme Court for attorneys, and must pass in six at least of the following branches of the law:—

- (1.) Real property and conveyancing.
- (2.) Common and statute law.
- (3.) Equity, divorce, and matrimonial and ecclesiastical law.
- (4.) Bankruptcy or insolvency and admiralty.
- (5.) Criminal law.
- (6.) Practice of the Supreme Court in its various branches.
- (7.) Practice of the courts of inferior jurisdiction.
- (8.) Constitutional law and constitutional history.

Provided that if any such person shall produce to the said board of examiners of the Supreme Court for attorneys a certificate of his having passed at any matriculation examination in either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Edinburgh, Dublin, London, or Sydney, or of his having passed the preliminary and any intermediate examination which clerks articulated in Great Britain or Ireland may be required to pass, and lodge with the board a copy thereof, it shall not be necessary for him to submit to such examination a second time.

That the Certificates D, E, and Report F, be added to the schedule to the said Chapter II., and be used by and for persons applying to be admitted to practise as attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, instead of the Certificates A, B, and C therein.

## JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF RUTHERGLEN.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the seventh day of March, 1864.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the twenty-ninth day of February now last past, it was ordered that a county court should be holden at Rutherglen, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the jury district of Rutherglen, and that the several acts required by law be done within the times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Clerk of Petty Sessions at Rutherglen shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury

district of Rutherglen, on or before Tuesday, the fifteenth day of March instant; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the eighth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by that Act, on Sunday, the tenth and seventeenth days respectively of the month of April now next ensuing; the court of petty sessions at Rutherglen aforesaid shall revise such list on Friday, the twenty-second day of April aforesaid; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Monday, the twenty-fifth day of the same month of April; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday, the second day of May, in the present year.

And the Honorable Archibald Michie, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## THE SHIRE OF WYNDHAM.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas the area of the district hereinafter named, and the amount of the last general rates therein, are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Wyndham Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

## THE BERWICK ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of September, 1862, the boundaries of the Berwick road district were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add the parishes of Soresby and Ringwood to the said road district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the addition of the said parishes to the Berwick road district aforesaid, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do also re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington, due east of the south-east angle of the parish of Cranbourne; thence by a direct line west to the south-east angle of the said parish; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of the said parish to the south-east angle of the parish of Eumemmerring; thence north by the eastern boundary of the said parish to the north-east angle of section XXXI. of the said parish; thence west by the northern boundary of the said section to the south-east angle of section XXVII. of

the said parish; thence by the east and north boundary of section XXVII. to the centre of the one-chain road which divides sections XXV. and XXVI. in the said parish; thence north by the centre of the said road to a point opposite the north boundary of allotment 19, section XXV. of the said parish; thence east by part of the north boundary of allotment 19, section XXV. to the south-east angle of allotment 17, section XXV. of the said parish; thence by the east and part of the north boundary of allotment 17, section XXV. to the south-east angle of allotment 15, section XXV. of the said parish; thence north by the east boundary of the said allotment 15, section XXV. to its north-east angle; thence west to the south-east angle of the Dandenong township reserve; thence north by the eastern boundary of said reserve to a point in the centre of the Dandenong Creek opposite the north boundary of the said township reserve; thence northerly by the centre of the Dandenong Creek and the eastern boundaries of the Oakleigh and Mulgrave and the Nunawading road districts northerly to the southern boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence north-easterly and south-easterly by the said county boundary to the north-eastern angle of the county of Mornington; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington to the commencing point.—(63.2803.)

## THE METCALFE ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, 1863, the boundaries of the Metcalfe road district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an addition to the said road district by the extension of the western boundary thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Metcalfe road district by the extension of its western boundary, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

9. The Government Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct.
