The conditions under which the premiums for wine of the vintage of 1864 will be awarded, are as follow, viz.:—The exhibitor to state—

1. Name.
2. Motto used.
3. Locality.
4. Nature of the soil where grown.
5. Names of grapes.
6. Age of vines.
7. Distance the rows are planted.
8. Trenched by hand or plough.
9. Average yield per acre.
10. Aspect.
11. Distance from seaboard.
12. Altitude of vineyard.

Each sample to consist of six bottles from a bulk of not less than fifty gallons; but the owners of those to whom premiums or honorary certificates shall be awarded, will be required to furnish six additional bottles of the same wines after they have undergone a second fermentation, so that the judges may each year test a bottle, to prove their comparative and progressive merits.

The samples sent in for competition to be the property of the Board, and to be accompanied by a declaration that they have been made from grapes of the *bona fide* growth of the competitors.

## SILK CULTURE.

Competitors for the premium for best sample of silk, in reel or cocoon, produced in the colony by themselves, will be required to furnish information as to quantity produced, when and under what circumstances, and such further particulars as to culture as may be important to the public. The locality, aspect, distance from seaboard, altitude, &c., &c.; the rearing of the worms from which the silk was obtained; and, also, the general mode of treatment pursued; to be furnished by the competitors.

## SILK CULTURE.

Full particulars to be given by competitors for this premium; and, when mulberries have been planted, the same conditions as attached to the other premiums with reference to soil, locality, &c., &c., to be complied with.

## 1ST CASTLEMAINE VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

## MEETINGS OF THE CORPS.

1. At any meeting of the corps the senior officer present shall take the chair.

2. The affairs of the corps shall be conducted by a committee of twelve, to be elected annually, four to form a quorum; the commission officers and the secretary for the time being to be *ex officio* members of all committees; committee for 1864-5 to be appointed at the first general meeting held after passing of these rules, and annually in January at such dates as the officer commanding the corps may fix by public advertisement; the secretary to the corps to be appointed annually at such general meeting.

3. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members. No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps, and a notice duly posted at the orderly-room at least six days previous to the day of meeting.

## FINES.

4. Any member appearing on parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty or unserviceable from neglect, may be fined by the officer in command the sum of 1s.

5. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice of the same to the officer commanding, in writing, within thirty (30) days; and if he fail to do so, shall be fined the sum of half-a-crown (2s. 6d.)

6. All excuses for absence from parade-muster must be in writing, and must be at the orderly-room, or other place appointed, before the end of the month in which the absence occurred.

7. A list of all fines imposed in any month shall be signed by the officer commanding, and be posted in the orderly-room, or other place appointed, on the first of the following month.

8. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer duly appointed by the commanding officer to receive the same, within fourteen days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment will be proceeded against according to law.

9. An account of all fines as incurred and received shall be kept in a book, which shall be open to inspection in the orderly-room.

## LIABILITIES INCURRED BY THE CORPS FOR MEMBERS.

10. An account shall be kept with each member of the corps, in which he shall be debited with all sums charged to the corps on his behalf for uniform and drill instruction, and credited with the amounts earned by him as an effective.

11. If on the 1st of January in any year a member's debit exceed his credit by One pound (£1) or upwards, he shall be fined the amount of such difference: Provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds (£2), and that the officer commanding may, at his discretion, enforce only one-half of the fine. The amount paid under this rule shall be placed in the book to the credit of the member paying it.

12. All members, whether in or out of uniform, attending the orderly-room or at the butts, during the hours of drill or practice, shall be considered on duty, and as such shall be amenable to the orders of the officer or non-commissioned officer in charge for the time being: Provided always that such attendance shall not be credited to any member unless he actually takes part in such drill; and any member either swearing or making use of foul or obscene language, or behaving himself in an improper manner, shall be reported to the commanding officer, and shall be liable to a fine of One shilling for the first offence, and for any subsequent offence to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence, and may render himself liable to be dismissed.

13. No member shall wear the regulation uniform, as adopted by the corps, unless on duty or by permission of the officer commanding the corps.

14. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount if more than Ten shillings (10s.) whereby his debit exceeds his credit: Provided that no such fine shall exceed £2, and that the whole or the half may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.
