## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF GRENVILLE.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the Shire of Grenville shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

## COMMONS ALTERED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase and alter the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**BENALLA TOWN COMMON** (the boundaries whereof were described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861) is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries of the township of Benalla, and the following portions of land, viz.:—Allotments 23, 29, 30, 31, 33, 21, 22, 23, 20, 19, 15, 16, 17, 3, 4, 7, and 8, of section S; allotments 1, 3, 4, 7, 8, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, of section B, parish of Benalla; allotments 54, 55, 56, and 61, parish of Kelleera; allotments 4 A and 4 B, last-named parish; and allotments 25, 26, and 27, same parish; containing an approximate area for increase of common, 5000 acres, more or less; as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne; deducting from above all sold or legally appropriated Crown lands.—(64.L.1427.)

**BYLANDS FARMERS' COMMON** (the boundaries whereof were described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861) is hereby altered and increased, and in lieu of the area described in the said Proclamation the area hereinafter described shall henceforth constitute the said common, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of portion 61, parish of Bylands; thence east to the Dry Creek; by that creek south-easterly to its most eastern source; thence by a line south to the summit of the Great Dividing Range; by that range westerly to the east boundary of portion 106; thence north to the north-east angle of portion 107; thence west to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence north to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne; deducting from above-described area all sold or otherwise legally appropriated land.—(64.L.266.)

**SANDHURST GOLD FIELD COMMON** (the boundaries whereof were described in four several Proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-eighth day of January and the twenty-fifth day of November, 1861, and the thirty-first day of August and the fourteenth day of December, 1833) is hereby increased by adding thereto the land hereafter described, viz.:—One hundred and seventeen acres three roods and seventeen perches, more or less, being allotment 4 of section 15, and that portion of allotment 4 of section 16 situate (south of the existing common boundary) parish of Lockwood: Commencing at a point on the west side of allotment 4, section 16, where it is intersected by the boundary of the existing common; thence south to the south-west angle of allotment 4, section 15; thence easterly by the south boundary of last-named allotment to the south-east angle thereof; thence north to the present boundary of the

common; thence west by the south boundary of said common to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne; deducting therefrom all sold or legally appropriated Crown lands.—(64.1.1878.)

### MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT OMEO.

- Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.
- The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the fees mentioned in the schedule.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule.
- When a meeting of the trustees is required, the same to be called by the secretary; three to form a quorum.
- The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
