## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts, within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof shall appoint; and that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony from time to time to define and appoint by Proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter, or vary, as the said Lieutenant Governor shall think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that the times at which the Courts of General Sessions of the peace in Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four shall be the times specified under the respective names of the several places hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

### APPLICATIONS FOR REWARDS FOR THE DISCOVERY OF GOLD FIELDS IN VICTORIA.

5. The name of the Government Officer (if any) to whom the discovery was reported, and the time at which such report (if any) was made.

Each applicant should furnish, in addition to the above, any documentary evidence which he may consider important.

Unless the above information is placed in the hands of the board on or before the 22nd January, 1864, the claim will not be considered.

Claims for rewards for discoveries made in 1863 cannot be entertained, a previous board having been appointed for their consideration; neither will discoveries be considered for which any reward has been paid by the colony.

### COMMONS ALTERED.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**BOWMAN'S FOREST GOLD FIELD COMMON.**—The boundaries of Bowman's Forest Gold Field Common, contained in a Proclamation bearing date 18th day of March, 1863, are hereby altered, and the following-described area shall constitute the gold field common of Bowman's Forest, for the use of miners and other persons legally entitled to depasture stock thereon.—One thousand eight hundred acres, more or less: Commencing at a point bearing east fifty-four chains sixty-seven links from the north-east angle of allotment 3, section 6, parish of Murmungee; thence north to the top of a range; by that range south-westerly to a point bearing south about ten chains from the commencing point; thence south one hundred and eighty-two chains, more or less; thence west fifty-four chains sixty-seven links to a point bearing south forty-three chains from the south-east angle of allotment 5, section 9, parish of Murmungee; thence north to the north-east angle of allotment 3, section 6, parish aforesaid; thence east to the point of commencement; deducting from the above-described area all sold or otherwise legally appropriated Crown lands, and likewise deducting the area rendered useless for grazing through mining operation; as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.G.10722.)

The board shall sit and commence business on the first Thursday in each month, so soon after Two o'clock p.m. as there are a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiry of half an hour from the time specified in the circular there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following Thursday.
3. At all meetings of the board when there are not five members present, or when the board is counted out, such circumstance, together with the names of the members there present, shall be recorded in the minute book.
4. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of their proceedings.
5. At all meetings of the board the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, and bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.
6. Every communication addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members or the secretary, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.
7. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.
8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. 9. No notice of motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices of motion not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.
10. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting.

16. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

17. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost another may be moved before the original is put to the vote.

18. Any member proposing a motion or amendment, or if speaking on any matter, must rise and address the chairman. No member, when speaking, shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon, in preference to any other; and the question of order shall be disposed of by the chairman before the subject is resumed or any other matter entered upon.

19. All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting, unless a motion for any particular question is made and carried that it shall be by ballot.

20. No discussion will be allowed on any matter of adjournment of the board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

21. 23. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

24. ## LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

27. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to apply once in writing for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him within fourteen days from the date of such application, legal proceedings will be taken for the recovery.

28. The collector shall pay into the treasurer's hands all moneys collected immediately after such collection.
