## ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACE FOR THE DIGBY DIVISION OF THE NORMANBY DISTRICT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the eleventh day of April, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall within thirty days after the commencement hereof, and afterwards as he shall see fit from time to time, appoint within and for each division of every province and district respectively one place and not more for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the province or district, and every such appointment may revoke; provided that if the returning officer of the province or district and any police magistrate or superintendent of police acting in the locality shall by writing under their hands certify to the Governor that it is necessary so to do it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint as aforesaid in and for such division one or more polling place or places, and the appointment of such place or places or any of them from time to time to revoke; provided also that no appointment of any polling place in

or for any division of a province or district shall be revoked between the issue of any writ for election for the same and the return of such writ: And whereas the returning officer for the Normanby electoral district and the police magistrate acting in the locality hereinafter mentioned have, by writing under their hands, certified to the Governor that it is necessary to appoint Sandford an additional polling place for the Digby division of the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint Sandford to be an additional place in and for the Digby division for taking the poll in such division at contested elections for the electoral district of Normanby.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## COMMON-TOLL ROADS.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Councils of the City of Melbourne, the Town of Geelong, the Boroughs of Emerald Hill and St. Kilda, and the Shire of Creswick, and of the District Board of the Broadmeadows Road District, have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along roads hereinafter mentioned being common to their own respective districts with the districts in which tolls are payable upon such roads, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the roads hereinafter mentioned to be Common-toll roads, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads,

viz. —  
The road extending from the borough of Ballarat to the borough of Clunes shall be a Common-toll road of the shire of Ballarat and the shire of Creswick.

The Essendon and Broadmeadows road from its junction with the Deep Creek road to the north boundary of the Broadmeadows road district shall be a Common-toll road of the Broadmeadows, the Bulla, and the Keilor road districts.

The roads known respectively as the Fortarlington road and the Queenscliff road, extending from Garden street in the town of Geelong and passing through the Indented Heads road district, shall be Common-toll roads of the said town of Geelong and of the Indented Heads road district.

The extension of Moray street, from the Sandridge road to Flinders street, over "the Falls bridge," shall be a Common-toll road of the city of Melbourne and the borough of Emerald Hill.

The road known as "Chapel street," from its intersection with Wellington street to its junction with the Brighton road, shall be a Common-toll road of the borough of Prahran and the borough of St. Kilda.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

**APPORTIONMENT OF THE TOLLS OF COMMON-TOLL ROADS.**

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the 255th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*, has, by an Order in Council made on the 11th day of April, 1864, determined that the tolls payable upon the common-toll roads of the Town of Geelong and the Indented Heads Road District, mentioned in a Proclamation bearing even date with the said Order in Council, shall be distributed in the following proportions, viz.:

- ON GEELONG TO PORTARLINGTON ROAD.  
One twenty-secondth to the Corporation of Geelong.  
Twenty-one twenty-secondths to the District Board of the Indented Heads Road District.
- ON GEELONG TO QUEENSLIFF ROAD.  
One thirteenth to the Corporation of Geelong.  
Twelve thirteenths to the District Board of the Indented Heads Road District.
