SIR,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch No. 32, of the 24th of December, forwarding Petitions to the Queen from the inhabitants of Rushworth, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of Heathote, and the inhabitants of the Road District of Newstead, deprecating the resumption or increase of transportation to Australia.

I request that you will inform the various persons by whom these petitions are signed, that they have been laid before the Queen, and that Her Majesty was pleased to receive them very graciously.

You will, no doubt, on the receipt of my Despatch No. 10, of the 26th ultimo, have made generally known the decision of Her Majesty's Government on the important question of transportation to Western Australia.

ENTRANCE OF BRITISH MERCHANT VESSELS INTO JAPANESE WATERS SUBJECT TO RESTRICTION.

THE Governor has directed the Despatch and the Order of the Queen in Council hereto subjoined to be published for general information.

SIR,—I transmit to you, for your information, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council of the 7th instant, conferring on Her Majesty's Consul-General in Japan the power to issue rules for restricting the entrance or passage of British merchant vessels into or through the straits or waters within the dominions of the Tycoon.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made in the session holden in the sixth and seventh years of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to remove doubts as to the exercise of power and jurisdiction of Her Majesty within divers countries and places out of Her Majesty's dominions, and to render the same more effectual*, it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it is and shall be lawful for Her Majesty to hold, exercise, and enjoy, any power or jurisdiction which Her Majesty now hath, or at any time hereafter may have, within any country or place out of Her Majesty's dominions, in the same and as ample a manner as if Her Majesty had acquired such power or jurisdiction by the cession or conquest of territory:

No. 41.—APRIL 22, 1864.—1.

And whereas Her Majesty hath power and jurisdiction in the dominions of the Tycoon of Japan:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, on the twenty-third day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, by an Order duly made, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to make provision for the exercise of the said power and jurisdiction; and such Order was afterwards amended, and further provision was made for the exercise of the said power and jurisdiction, by another Order duly made by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, on the fourth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one:

And whereas, under and by virtue of the said Orders, Her Majesty's Consuls within the dominions of the Tycoon of Japan are authorised and empowered to make, and to enforce by fine or imprisonment, rules and regulations for the observance of the stipulations of the treaty or treaties between Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, and the Tycoon of Japan, and for the peace, order, and good government of Her Majesty's subjects being within the dominions of the Tycoon of Japan:

And whereas it is expedient that the powers so given to the said Consuls should be extended, as hereinafter is mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the above-recited Act of Parliament, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I.—Whenever, and so often as, it shall appear to Her Majesty's Consul-General, or to any person duly authorised to act in the capacity of Consul-General of Her Majesty, in the dominions of the Tycoon of Japan, that the unrestricted entrance of British ships or vessels into, or the unrestricted passage of British ships or vessels through, any straits or strait, or other waters, within the dominions of the said Tycoon of Japan, may lead to acts of disturbance or acts of violence, or may otherwise endanger the maintenance of peaceful relations and intercourse between Her Majesty's subjects and the subjects of the Tycoon of Japan, it shall be lawful for such Consul-General, or other person so acting as aforesaid, to make and enforce, by fine or imprisonment, any rule or regulation, for the purpose of prohibiting, or of regulating and placing under such restrictions as he may consider expedient, the entrance or passage of any British ship or vessel (other than a ship of war of Her Majesty) into or through any such straits or strait or other waters as aforesaid,

within such limits as shall be defined and specified by such rule or regulation; and from time to time to revoke or alter any such rule or regulation.

II.—All such rules and regulations shall be published and made known, and all proceedings for the enforcement thereof shall be taken and prosecuted in such and the same manner, and subject to such and the same right of appeal, and otherwise, in all respects, as is provided by the said Order in Council of the twenty-third day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, as amended by the said Order in Council of the fourth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, concerning rules and regulations to be made by Her Majesty's Consuls, other than those for the observance of treaties; and the penalty to be attached to any breach of such rules and regulations to be made by virtue of this Order, shall not in any case exceed Five hundred dollars, or three months' imprisonment.

III.—If any persons or person navigating any British ship or vessel shall enter into or pass through, or shall attempt to enter into or to pass through, any such straits or strait, or other waters as aforesaid, in breach of any rule or regulation to be made by virtue of this Order as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for any officer in command of any of Her Majesty's ships of war to use force for the purpose of compelling such persons or person to desist from any such attempt; and also, if it shall be deemed necessary, to seize any such ship or vessel, and to take, or cause her to be taken, to any convenient place or port, either within the dominions of the Tycoon of Japan, or elsewhere, in order that the persons or person navigating the same may be duly proceeded against and brought to trial for such breach, or attempted breach, of such rule or regulation; and any such ship or vessel may lawfully be detained under the authority of any such officer or officers, or of any of Her Majesty's Consuls in the dominions of the Tycoon of Japan, until the conclusion of any proceedings which may be taken for the punishment of any person or persons so offending.

And the Right Honorable Earl Russell, and the Most Noble the Duke of Newcastle, two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICTS OF INGLEWOOD AND MARYBOROUGH ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places or districts within the said colony of Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor thereof shall appoint; and that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter, and vary as the said Lieutenant Governor shall think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourteenth day of September, 1863, the General Sessions District of Maryborough was altered as therein mentioned: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the fifteenth day of February, 1864, the General Sessions District of Inglewood was defined: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said districts: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamations as describes the boundaries of the said districts; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby alter the said districts, and do declare and appoint that the said Courts of General Sessions shall be holden in and for the respective districts hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions of the peace holden at Inglewood shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Inglewood, comprising all that portion of Victoria hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing on the Loddon River, at the north-west angle of the village reserve at Laanecoorie; thence by that river northerly to its junction with an ana-branch of the River Murray; thence by said ana-branch north-westerly to the south-east angle of the town reserve of Castle Donnington; thence west by the south boundary of said township to its south-west angle; thence by a straight line bearing south-easterly to the Avoca River, on the south shore of Lake Baelbael; thence by the Avoca River southerly to a point west of the commencing point; thence by a line bearing east to the point of commencement.

The Court of General Sessions of the peace holden at Maryborough shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Maryborough, comprising all that portion of Victoria hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the Tallaroop Creek due east of the north-east angle of the parish of Amherst; thence west to the road from Carisbrook to Amherst; by said road south-westerly to a point thereon bearing north from the north-east angle of allotment 31, section 3, parish of Amherst; thence by a straight line westerly to the junction of the road from Amherst to Avoca with the electric telegraph line of road

from Maryborough to Avoca; by said telegraph line of road westerly to its intersection with the Bet-bet Creek; by the last-named creek northerly to its point of intersection with the west side of Joyce's pre-emptive right, "Norwood;" thence southerly, easterly, northerly, and westerly, by part of the west boundary, the south, east, and north boundaries of said pre-emptive section, to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a straight line westerly to Natte Yalloak, on the Avoca River; thence northerly by that river to a point bearing west of the north-west angle of the village reserve at Laanecoorie; thence by a straight line east to said north-west angle of the village reserve aforesaid; thence by the Loddon River southerly to its junction with the Tallaroop or Deep Creek; and by that creek southerly to the point of commencement.

THE DATE OF THE NEXT GENERAL SESSIONS FOR INGLEWOOD ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the times at which such courts shall be holden, and such times to alter or vary as the said Governor shall think fit: And whereas it is expedient to alter the time appointed for holding the next Court of General Sessions for the district of Inglewood: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the times appointed for holding the next Court of General Sessions at Inglewood from the twelfth day of May now next ensuing, to Monday, the thirtieth day of May aforesaid.

THE WINCHELSEA ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of December, 1863, the boundaries of the Winchelsea road district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an addition to the said road district by the extension of the southern boundary thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Winchelsea road district by the extension of its southern boundary, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby redefine the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Gherangerang; thence southerly and easterly by the western and southern boundaries of the parish of Jan due to the sea-coast; thence southerly and westerly by the sea-coast to a point due south of the south-west angle of the parish of Murroon; thence due north to the centre of the River Barwon at said south-west angle; thence by the centre line of the said river northerly to a point due east of the south boundary line of allotment N,

section 28, in the parish of Birregurra; thence westward to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence northward to the south boundary of allotment A of section 22 in the said parish; thence south-east along the south boundary of said allotment to its south-east angle; thence due north along the eastern boundaries of allotments A, B, C, D, and E of said section 22 to the north-east angle of said allotment E; thence westward to the south-east side line of a Government road (bounding the said section E on the north-west); thence north-east along the side line of said road and of allotment E of section 19 in the last-named parish to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of said section 19; thence northerly by the said dividing line (crossing the Birregurra Creek into the county of Grenville) and the dividing line of allotments B and C of section 12 in last-named parish to the Colac Road; thence north-east along the said Colac Road to a point due south of the east side line of allotments 50 and 57 of the last-named parish, and onwards to the south side of section 104 in the parish of Gellibrand; thence further north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Gellibrand and Hesse to the north-west angle of section 7 in the parish of Hesse; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of sections 7, 2, 1 of the parish of Hesse to the western boundary of the parish of Murdeduke; thence northerly by the west boundary of said parish to the centre of the Warrambine Creek; thence easterly by the centre line of said creek and by the centre line of the River Barwon to a point due north of the north-east angle of the parish of Carrung Emurnong, in the county of Grant; thence southward along the east boundary lines of the parishes of Carrung Emurnong and Lake-lake Wollard to the northern boundary of the parish of Gherang-gherang; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said parish to its north-east angle; thence south by the eastern boundary of said parish to the commencing point.—(64.1219.)

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

BYE-LAWS OF THE COUNCIL.

THE meetings of the council shall be held at the office of the council, at Camperdown, at Twelve o'clock noon, on the second and fourth Wednesdays in each month.

2. Should a quorum not be present within one hour after the time appointed for holding any meeting, the circumstance shall be entered in the minute-book, together with the name or names of the councillor or councillors present, if any.

3. The first business at all meetings of the council shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; after confirmation, such minutes shall be signed as confirmed by the president of the council, or, in his absence, by the acting president.

4. Special meetings of the council shall, on the requisition of three or more councillors, be convened by the secretary, the object of such meeting being set forth in the requisition.

5. At all ordinary meetings of the council, after confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz.:

1. Reading, considering, and ordering upon correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day.
2. Receiving and reading petitions and memorials, if any.
3. Reading and ordering upon reports, if any.
6. The orders of the day shall include all business before, but not disposed of at, former meetings of the council, all matters of which due notice has been given, and any business the president, with the concurrence of the majority of the council, may see fit to bring under consideration, and shall have precedence in the order in which they appear in the minute-book and notice-book respectively.

7. Any memorial or petition addressed to the council shall be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received, until notice shall have been given, as herein provided.

8. Every councillor shall stand while addressing the president.

2. The president's decision shall be final on all points of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

3. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute improper motives; and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly, and any councillor making use of any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, shall, if required by the president, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

4. The president shall call to order any councillor out of order; and if the councillor deemed out of order shall not obey, he shall be liable to a penalty, for every such offence, not exceeding £5.

9. The president shall stand while addressing the council on any subject.

10. Notices of motion bearing the signature of the mover shall be delivered to the secretary, who shall enter them in a book kept for that purpose, and the councillor giving such notice shall read it aloud, and endorse thereon the day upon which he intends to submit it for consideration.

11. No motion entered on the notice-book shall be entertained in the absence of the councillor who gave notice thereof, unless some other councillor present has authority in writing from the first-mentioned councillor to proceed with the motion, and notices not proceeded with as herein specified shall be struck out.

12. Every motion or amendment shall be committed to writing before it is entertained, and shall then be entered in the minute-book, with the names of the mover and seconder; and on the division thereon, if any, the votes shall be recorded, and the names of the councillors voting pro and con, specified.

13. Any councillor when proposing a motion or amendment shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted except by a call to order, when he shall be silent until the councillor calling to order shall be heard, and the question of order decided, when the councillor in possession of the chair shall proceed with the subject.

14. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

15. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply to any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed; after the reply, the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

16. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but all amendments shall be discussed and put before the original motion, and no councillor shall move more than one amendment on the same question.

17. The president shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as may be necessary to enable him to decide which is the majority.

18. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if on the question being put the motion for adjournment be negatived, the subject then under consideration, if any, or if none, then the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained.

19. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

20. The council shall in all cases vote by show of hands, except when inconsistent with, or repugnant to, any of the provisions of the Local Government Act.

21. The original manuscript of every motion or amendment of the council shall be laid on the council table at the meeting at which it is to be confirmed, and may be destroyed after confirmation thereof.

22. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, by delivering the same in writing to the secretary duly signed, the reason or reasons assigned for protesting being therein stated; and the secretary shall make an entry of the same in the minute-book.

23. No motion the effect of which if carried would involve the expenditure of any sum of money exceeding £50 shall be entertained by the council, unless notice of such motion be given in the usual manner.

24. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down in writing any particular word or words used by a councillor, immediately upon the same being used.

25. It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council, for the consideration of any subject, at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof, and of the date for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration, shall be given by the secretary to each councillor; and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes on for discussion, or at the voting on such question, or any amendment thereon, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once for any sum due on the rate roll, and in the event of any such sum not being paid to him when he calls for it, he shall leave a notice bearing the date upon which he calls, demanding payment of such sum at the office of the council within fourteen days from the date of such notice, wherein shall be stated that in default of such payment legal proceedings for the recovery of such sum shall be taken.

26. Any officer or servant of the council who shall wilfully, by any act of omission, or commission of any matter or thing appertaining to his duties by which the council shall sustain any loss or damage, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

27. In the event of any contractor not completing his contract within the time stipulated in the conditions thereof, the inspector of works shall immediately report thereon to the council.

28. No councillor or officer of the council shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the council.

29. All tenders shall be addressed to the president of the council, and shall not be opened till the day fixed for their consideration, or any postponement thereof, and then by the president or the acting president only.
