**THE EPPING ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by two several Proclamations under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date respectively the eleventh day of January, 1859, and the second day of April, 1860, the boundaries of the Epping road district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add Northcote to the said road district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the addition of Northcote to the Epping road district aforesaid, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do also re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say :-

Commencing at the north-west angle of section CXXXVII., parish of Jika-jika, in the county of Bourke; thence east by the northern boundary of said section to the centre of the Darebin Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the Darebin Creek to the south-east angle of section CXXXII., parish of Jika-jika; thence west by the south boundary of said section to the north-west angle of section 118; thence south by the west boundary of said section to the south-east angle of section 89; thence by the south boundary of said section west to the eastern boundary of the township of Northcote; thence south to the centre of the Merri-merri Creek; thence southerly, westerly, and northerly by the centre of the said creek to the north-west angle of section CXXXIX.; thence east to the south-east angle of the Pentridge village reserve; thence north by the east boundaries of said reserve and section CXLVIII. to the north-east angle of said section in the parish of Jika-jika; thence west by the northern boundary of said section to the centre of the Merri-merri Creek; thence northerly by the centre of the said creek to the north-west angle of section XVI.

in the parish of Wollert; thence east by the northern boundary of sections XVI., XVII., XVIII., XIX., in parish of Wollert, and section XVII. in the parish of Morang, to the north-east angle of the last-named section; thence south by the east boundary of sections XVII., XVI., IX., VIII., and I., in the said parish of Morang, to the south-east angle of said section I.; thence west by the south boundary of said section to the centre of the Darebin Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the Darebin Creek to a point on the south boundary of section XIV., parish of Keelbundora, bearing N. 18° E., and distant about three miles eight chains from the commencing point; thence by a line bearing S. 18° W. to the commencing point.-(64.1049.)

**SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED DONNYBROOK.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Donnybrook shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

## MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT FRYER'S CREEK.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 25th day of April, 1864, under the authority conferred by the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32, authorised the holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations within the area of the land reserved for a Reservoir at Spring Gully, Fryer's Creek, on the following conditions, viz:—

1. The operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to injure the embankment or bye-wash; and all clay, gravel, sand, and debris, shall be removed by the miners from the basin of the said reservoir as soon as the said mining operations shall be completed.

2. No person shall be allowed to mine within the basin of the said reservoir after the thirty-first day of October next ensuing.

3. Before any application for any claim shall be entertained, the applicants for the same shall deposit with the warden of the district the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds sterling, and the said deposit shall be retained by the warden until the claim shall have been given up and the basin of the reservoir cleared of all clay, gravel, sand, and debris; and if the claimholders refuse to repair any damage which may have been done to the embankment or the bye-wash, or if they shall refuse to clear the basin of the reservoir as may be directed by the warden, or to leave the claim on the 31st day of October next ensuing, then and in such case the deposit shall be absolutely forfeited, and the same shall be paid into the consolidated revenue; but if all the conditions as herein set forth shall be fulfilled, then and in such case the deposit shall be returned to the miners without any deduction whatsoever.

4. Every person to whom a claim shall be allotted shall enter into an agreement in which the above conditions shall be set forth; and it shall not be lawful for any person to mine on the said reserve who has not made and signed a contract to abide by the said conditions.

## MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW.—[16th April, 1864.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 16th day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. The conditions marked (a.) in section 116 of the bye-law of the 4th December, 1863, shall be and are hereby repealed and rescinded, and the following enacted instead:—

(a.) Any quartz claim taken up under section 112, not exceeding four hundred (400) feet in length, having been worked for at least three (3) consecutive months, and any quartz claim taken up under section 121, not exceeding six hundred (600) feet in length, having been worked for at least three (3) consecutive months previous to any registration, no payable gold having been obtained for at least one month previous. Any prospecting claim held under sections 106 and 108 respectively, having been worked for at least twelve consecutive months previous to any registration, no payable quartz having been obtained for at least one month previous.

2. Section 121 of the bye-law of the 4th December, 1863, shall be and is hereby repealed and rescinded, and the following enacted instead:—

121. *Extent of claim.*—Any miner or party of miners taking up a claim on an abandoned or unoccupied quartz reef shall be entitled to hold seventy-five (75) feet in length along the course of such reef by a width of four hundred (400) feet, two hundred (200) feet on each side from the centre of such reef if it be defined, or the supposed centre thereof (except in the Avoca division of this district, where the width allowed shall be six hundred (600) feet, three hundred (300) feet on each side from the centre of such reef if it be defined, or the supposed centre thereof), for each shareholder therein, and shall be worked every working day except as hereinafter provided. From seventy-five (75) feet and not exceeding six hundred (600) feet shall be worked by two (2) miners; exceeding six hundred (600) feet and not exceeding nine hundred (900) feet by three (3) miners; and by one (1) miner for every additional three hundred (300) feet or portion of three hundred (300) feet comprising the claim; and shall be wrought in all other respects in accordance with section 114, except, after payable gold has been obtained, the time allowed for the full number of miners being employed in such claim shall be twenty-one (21) days.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.
