PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by two several Proclamations under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date respectively the eleventh day of January, 1859, and the second day of April, 1860, the boundaries of the Epping road district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add Northcote to the said road district. Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the addition of Northcote to the Epping road district aforesaid, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do also re-define the whole of the said road district added to as a foresaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of section cxxxvvII., parish of Jika-jika, in the county of Bourke; thence east by

commencing at the north-west angle of section CXXXVII., parish of Jika-jika, in the county of Bourke; thence east by the northern boundary of said section to the centre of the Darebin Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the Darebin Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the Darebin Creek to the south-east angle of section CXXII, parish of Jika-jika; thence west by the south boundary of said section to the north-west angle of section 113; thence south by the west boundary of said section to the south-east angle of section 89; thence by the south boundary of said section west to the east-ern boundary of the township of Northcot; thence south to the centre of the Merri-merri Creek; thence southerly, west-erly, and northerly by the centre of the said creek to the south-east angle of the Pentridge village reserve; thence north by the east boundaries of said reserve and section CXLVIII. to the north-east angle of section CXSIII in the parish of Jika-jika; thence west by the northern boundary of said section to the centre of the said creek to the north-west angle of section the north-erri Creek; thence northerly by the centre of the said creek to the north-west angle of section XVI.

in the parish of Wollert; thence east by the northern boundary of sections XVI., XVII., XVIII., XIX., in parish of Wollert, and section XVII. in the parish of Morang, to the north-east angle of the last-named section; thence south by the east boundary of sections XVII., XVI., IX., VIII., and I., in the said parish of Morang, to the south-east angle of said section I.; thence west by the south boundary of said section to the centre of the Darebin Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the Darebin Creek to a point on the south boundary of section XIV., parish of Keelbundora, bearing N. 18° E., and distant about three miles eight chains from the commencing point; thence by a line bearing S. 18° W. to the commencing point.—(64.1049.)

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Charl's Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Donnybrook shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., XII., X., and X.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT FRYER'S CREEK.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 25th day of April, 1861, under the authority conferred by the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32, authorised the holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations within the area of the land reserved for a Reservoir at Spring Gully, Fryer's Creek; on the following conditions with

A T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the 16th day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. Thie conditions marked (a.) in section 116 of the bye-law of the 4th December, 1863, shall be and are hereby repealed and rescinded, and the following enacted instead:—

(a.) Any quartz claim taken up under section 112, not exceeding four hundred (400) feet in length, having been worked for at least three (3) consecutive months, and any quartz claim taken up under section 121, not exceeding six-hundred (600) feet in length, having been worked for at least three (3) consecutive months previous to any registration, no payable gold having, been obtained for at least one month previous.
