BLACKWOOD GOLD ESCORT.

THE Blackwood Police Gold Escort will be re-established on the following conditions, and will run fortnightly until further notice, commencing on Tuesday, the 24th of May, and reaching Kyneton in time for the mid-day train.

Gold will be received on alternate Mondays, commencing the 23rd proximo, at Blackwood, for escort, but only for delivery to known residents at Kyneton, or to bank agents on route by the mid-day train, whose appearance must be previously guaranteed by the banks, and who must be provided with orders from the managers of their respective banks to receive parcels of treasure from the police at Kyneton.

The police will take delivery of such parcels of treasure, sealed, at Blackwood, and take receipts for the same number with unbroken seals, at Kyneton; but no responsibility whatever will be incurred by the police as to their value or contents.

Should doubt arise as to the person presenting himself to receive the treasure being duly authorised to receive it, or should no person appear at all, the treasure, if any, will be stored at the Police Barracks, Kyneton, until removed by the bank; no responsibility being incurred, no charge will be exacted for its custody.

Managers of Banks or other persons desirous of availing themselves of this escort will therefore be good enough to notify, in
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writing, before the 15th proximo, to the officer of police in charge at Kyneton, whether they will appoint agents to take delivery on the foregoing terms, of parcels of treasure from the police escort officer, on the stoppage of the mid-day train at the Kyneton railway station.

Should no such notification be received from either residents at Kyneton or bankers there or elsewhere, the escort will not start.

AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST MARCH, 1864.—APPROXIMATE RETURNS.

*The whole of the Agricultural Statistics Returns for the year ending 31st March, 1864, have been received, with the exception of those relating to a portion of the Murray District and a part of West Bourke. To prevent delay in the publication of the present tables I have thought it advisable to form estimates for the unsettled districts alluded to, based on the last year's returns, for all crops with the exception of wheat, which in the Murray district has been calculated at an average yield of 64 bushels per acre, and in West Bourke at 4 bushels per acre. This estimated average yield is arrived at from such schedules as have already been received from collectors in those districts. All necessary corrections will of course appear on the eventual publication of full tables for each district, as usual, but it is not anticipated that any difference of moment will be found to exist between future totals and those now given.—W. H. A.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase and proclaim the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD FIELD COMMON OF BUNINYONG, separately described in two several Proclamations bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, and united by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, 1863, is hereby increased by adding thereto the land hereafter described, viz.:—Five hundred and twenty-six acres, more or less: Commencing at the south-west angle of the Buninyong Cemetery; thence west eighty-four chains, more or less, to the Leigh River; thence by that river northerly to the south boundary of the original Buninyong Gold Field Common (as gazetted on 6th February, 1861); thence east by part of the said south boundary of the gold field common one hundred and twenty-five chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of Buninyong borough; thence south forty-one chains fifty links, more or less, to the south side of the road from Sebastopol to Buninyong; by that side of said road north-westerly to the north angle of the cemetery; thence by the north-west and west sides of the cemetery westerly and southerly to the point of commencement; being the unappropriated Crown lands within the above-described area.—(64.J.1047.)
