## QUARANTINE OF THE "SNAPDRAGON."

SEVERAL cases of Small-pox having occurred on board the vessel called the *Snapdragon* during the passage from Hong-kong: His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has ordered the said vessel, and the crew, and passengers on board thereof, to be detained in quarantine, at the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, until ordered to be released; and all persons are hereby required to take notice accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean are specified in a Proclamation, dated the 23rd day of November, 1852.

UPPER YARRA DIGGINGS GOLD FIELD COMMON.—Three thousand acres, more or less, county of Evelyn: Commencing at the junction of Hoddle's Creek with the Yarra-yarra River; thence southerly by Hoddle's Creek to a point in a straight line one hundred and fifty chains from its junction with said river; thence by a line bearing east two hundred and eighty chains, more or less, to Yarra Rivulet; by that rivulet north-westerly to its junction with the Yarra-yarra River; and by the last-named river westerly to the point of commencement. Exclusive of all sold or otherwise legally appropriated land, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(64.L.947.)

T. Ricketts. The special attention of Mr. Ricketts has been drawn to the importance of extending British trade in that portion of Borneo, and he has been desired to furnish the governors of Her Majesty's possessions in the east and elsewhere, and especially the Government of India, with any information which may be useful to the interests of those possessions. I have accordingly, in announcing the appointment of Mr. Ricketts, to instruct you to afford him such support as it may at any time be in your power to give him in furtherance of that object.

THE Central Board appointed to watch over the interests of the aborigines have caused the blankets and shirts issued this year to be made of a peculiar pattern, as hereunder described; and it is hereby notified that the clothing is issued to the aborigines for their use and comfort, and still remains the property of the Government, and that no aboriginal can lawfully sell it, or exchange it for intoxicating liquors.

Persons illegally found in possession of any of the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The Blankets are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches; weight, 7½ lbs per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 3½ inches in width.

Serge Shirts: Brownish-grey and yellow check.

Cotton Shirts: Narrow red and white stripes.
