CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH REWARDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR THE DISCOVERY OF NEW GOLD FIELDS DURING THE YEAR 1864.

VOTE OF £10,000.—REWARDS TO DISCOVERERS OF GOLD FIELDS IN 1864.

THAT person will be deemed the discoverer who shall first find gold, mark out a claim, and notify the same in writing to the warden or police magistrate of the district. In such notification the discoverer shall state, as nearly as practicable, the exact locality, and the distance from the nearest gold workings or nearest town.

2. No reward will exceed £1000. In fixing the amount to be paid for any discovery, regard will be had to the number of men employed on the new gold field, its distance from the nearest gold workings, the character of the deposits in which the gold occurs, and the depth of sinking.

3. If two or more persons simultaneously discover gold in the same locality, or in places immediately adjacent, and they each severally comply with the conditions above mentioned, the sum proper to be awarded will be divided amongst the several persons who have discovered the gold field, in such manner as shall

A. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than one mile and less than two miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £200.
B. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than two miles and less than three miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £300.
C. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than three

made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding 2500.

C. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than three miles and less than five miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £400.

D. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than five miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, six months after the report of the discovery, not less than 500 men, a sum not exceeding

The words "nearest gold workings," shall mean gold workings on which miners are actually employed in searching for gold.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Str Charles Henry Darling, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Sandridge and the District Board of the Caulfield Road District have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along roads hereinafter mentioned being common to their own respective districts with the districts in which tolls are payable upon such roads, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of The Local Government Act, 1863: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the roads hereinafter mentioned to be Common-toll roads, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.—

The extension of Moray street from the Sandridge road to the south side of Flinders street over the Falls Bridge shall be a Common-toil road of the city of Melbourne and of the boroughs of Emerald Hill and Sandridge.

The portion of the Dandenong road passing through the Oakleigh and Mulgrave, the Gardiner, and the Caulfield road districts, shall be a Common-toll road of the said road districts.

Persons, illegally found in possession of any of the blankets or shirts issued by the Central Board will be prosecuted.

The Blankets are of the following description: Size of a single blanket, 7 feet by 5 feet 4 inches; weight, 7½ lbs per pair; color, brownish-grey and yellow check. The brownish-grey stripes are 4 inches in width, and the yellow stripes 3½ inches in width. Serge Shirts: Brownish-grey and yellow check.

Cotton Shirts: Narrow red, and white stripes.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (30), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street court or alley (where the

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides) is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the full from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rummed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.
