CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH REWARDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR THE DISCOVERY OF NEW GOLD FIELDS DURING THE YEAR 1864.

VOTE OF £10,000.—REWARDS TO DISCOVERERS OF GOLD FIELDS IN 1864.

THAT person will be deemed the discoverer who shall first find gold, mark out a claim, and notify the same in writing to the warden or police magistrate of the district. In such notification the discoverer shall state, as nearly as practicable, the exact locality, and the distance from the nearest gold workings or nearest town.

2. No reward will exceed £1000. In fixing the amount to be paid for any discovery, regard will be had to the number of men employed on the new gold field, its distance from the nearest gold workings, the character of the deposits in which the gold occurs, and the depth of sinking.

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3. If two or more persons simultaneously discover gold in the same locality, or in places immediately adjacent, and they each severally comply with the conditions above mentioned, the sum proper to be awarded will be divided amongst the several persons who have discovered the gold field, in such manner as shall be just.

4. Rewards shall be given in accordance with the following scale, namely:—

A. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than one mile and less than two miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £200.

B. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than two miles and less than three miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 300 men, a sum not exceeding £300.

C. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than three miles and less than five miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, three months after the report of the discovery having been made, not less than 200 men, a sum not exceeding £400.

D. For the discovery of a gold field distant more than five miles from the nearest gold workings, and on which there shall be employed, six months after the report of the discovery, not less than 500 men, a sum not exceeding £1000.

The words "nearest gold workings," shall mean gold workings on which miners are actually employed in searching for gold.

NOTICE TO MANAGERS OF COMMONS WHO HAVE BEEN APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

CONSIDERABLE difficulty having been experienced by the officers appointed by the Board of Land and Works to audit accounts presented by the managers of commons, in consequence of the absence or insufficiency of vouchers in support of items of revenue and expenditure, it is hereby notified that the following documents must accompany every abstract of such accounts when submitted:—

1st. The original bills fully receipted for all items of expenditure.

2nd. Receipt books with blocks (the receipts and blocks to be numbered consecutively in printed figures) in support of the items of revenue. (The full particulars of each receipt when issued must be entered in its accompanying block, which will thus become a sufficient voucher).

3rd. A bank pass-book, showing the balance to the credit of the managers at the date of audit, or (should no banking account have been kept) the balance in hand, must be produced in current money for the inspection of the auditor.

It is also notified that the expenses of petitions or deputations, travelling expenses of managers, and salaries of secretaries or clerks, are not legally chargeable upon the funds of commons, and that such items will not be allowed to pass.

ARTESIAN WELLS.

A SUM of Two thousand pounds (£2000) is hereby offered by the Government as a reward (subject to the under-mentioned conditions) to the first successful discoverer of an Artesian stream of water within that portion of the basin of the River Murray lying below the junction of the Owens River with the Murray, and being within the colony of Victoria.

1. That such Artesian stream be at a distance of not less than ten miles from any portion of the River Murray, and at a distance of not less than five miles from any tributary thereof, or from any fresh-water lake, or any other permanent supply of fresh water.

2. That the water of such Artesian stream be fresh and suitable for drinking and other domestic purposes.

3. That it rise so as to flow over, at, or above the surface of the ground, without the aid of any mechanical appliances whatsoever, and that it continue so to flow and so remain fresh at the expiration of six months from the date of its first rising to the surface.

The fulfilment of the above conditions will be referred to the decision of a board to be appointed for the purpose by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

THE following Rules and Regulations were agreed to by a majority of the members of the 1st Geelong Corps present at a meeting held on the 4th May, 1864, specially convened for that purpose, according to clause 3, No. 183 Victoria.

1. Any member appearing on parade with uniform, arms, or accoutrements incomplete, dirty, or unserviceable from neglect, shall be fined One shilling by the officer in command.
2. Any member not attending, or sending in his arms for inspection, at an inspection of arms of which one week's previous notice has been given by advertisement, shall be fined (2s. 6d.) Two shillings and sixpence.
3. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice of the same to the officer commanding, in writing, within (30) thirty days, and if he fail to do so, shall be fined (2s. 6d.) Two shillings and sixpence.
4. All fines must be paid to the drill instructor within the month on the first of which they are posted.

Referred to in this Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court, or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides) is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court, or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 2½-inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with corporation iron roller.

Whenever private entrances lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining street shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone kerbing.
